A BILL TO AMEND THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE CODE

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title:

No. 35 of 1939.

Repeal and replacement of section 25 of the principal Ordinance.

“Power of police officer to detain and search aircraft, vessel, etc., and persons in certain circumstances.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Criminal Procedure Code (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Consolidated Edition of the Criminal Procedure Code prepared under the provisions of section 43 of the Criminal Procedure Code (Amendment) Ordinance, 1939, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

2. Section 25 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—

25. (1) Any police officer, or other person authorized in writing in that behalf by the Commissioner of Police, may stop, search and detain—

(a) any aircraft, vessel or vehicle in or upon which there shall be reason to suspect that anything stolen or unlawfully obtained may be found; or

(b) any aircraft, vessel or vehicle which there shall be reason to suspect has been used or employed in the commission or to facilitate the commission of any offence under the provisions of Chapters XXVI, XXVIII and XXIX of the Penal Code; or

(c) any person who may be reasonably suspected of having in his possession or conveying in any manner anything stolen or unlawfully obtained.

(2) No person shall be entitled to any damages or compensation for any loss or damage suffered by him in respect of the detention under the provisions of this section of any aircraft, vessel or vehicle.”

3. Sub-section (1) of section 387 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the word “the”, which appears in the second line of paragraph (c) thereof, and substituting therefor the word “any”.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill is a corollary to the Bill to amend the Penal Code. It seeks to amplify the existing section 25 which empowers a police officer to stop, search and detain any vessel, boat or vehicle by including therein aircraft, vessels or vehicles which there are reasonable grounds to believe have been used or employed in the commission, or to facilitate the commission, of an offence under the provisions of Chapters XXVI, XXVIII and XXIX of the Penal Code: that is to say, the offences of theft, robbery, burglary, house-breaking, etc.

2. Sub-section (2) of the proposed new section seeks to debar any person from claiming damages or compensation for any loss or damage which he may suffer in respect of the detention, under the provisions of the section, of any aircraft, vessel or vehicle.

3. While at the present moment there is no reason to believe that aircraft are being used for those unlawful purposes, it is considered desirable that they should be included inasmuch as the time may come when they may be used in the commission of crimes.

4. The opportunity has been taken to correct an error in section 387 of the Code.

5. No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A BILL TO AMEND THE PENAL CODE

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Penal Code (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Consolidated Edition of the Penal Code prepared under the provisions of section 25 of the Penal Code (Amendment) Ordinance, 1939, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

Short title.

No. 34 of 1939.

2. The principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein, immediately after section 304 thereof, the following new sections:—

Amendment of the principal Ordinance.

10 “304A. (1) Where any person is convicted of an offence, or of an attempt to commit an offence or of counselling or procuring the commission of an offence, under the provisions of this Chapter or of Chapters XXVI or XXVIII of this Code and the court by which such person is convicted, finds that any aircraft, vessel or vehicle was used or employed by such person in the commission or to facilitate the commission of the offence of which he is convicted, such aircraft, vessel or vehicle shall be forfeited to His Majesty.

Forfeiture of aircraft, vessel or vehicle.

20 (2) Where any aircraft, vessel or vehicle is detained by any police officer under the provisions of section 25 of the Criminal Procedure Code and no person is, within seven days, charged with any offence specified in sub-section (1) of this section, a magistrate shall, upon the written application of a police officer of or above the rank of inspector, inquire into the circumstances in which such aircraft, vessel or vehicle was detained and shall determine whether or not it was used for or employed in the commission or attempted commission of any such offence; and, if the magistrate finds that it was so used or employed, such aircraft, vessel or vehicle shall be forfeited to His Majesty:

35 Provided that no forfeiture of any such aircraft, vessel or vehicle shall take place if, on the trial of any person mentioned in sub-section (1) of this section or in any inquiry held under the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section, the court finds that neither such owner nor any of his agents or servants consented to the use or employment of such aircraft, vessel or vehicle or was aware that it was so being used or employed.

40 (3) The owner of any such aircraft, vessel or vehicle shall have all of the rights of an accused person under the provisions of Part VIII of the Criminal Procedure Code and, so far as the same are applicable, the provisions of that Part shall apply to an inquiry held under the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section.

304B. Any person who damages or unlawfully removes any aircraft, vessel or vehicle while it is detained under the provisions of section 25 of the Criminal Procedure Code, is guilty of a misdemeanour.

Damaging or unlawfully removing detained aircraft, vessel or vehicle.

Interpretation.

304c. For the purposes of section 304A and 304B of this Code, and of section 25 of the Criminal Procedure Code, the expression 'aircraft', 'vessel' and 'vehicle' includes everything contained in, being on, or attached thereto which, in the opinion of the court, forms part of the equipment of such aircraft, vessel or vehicle."

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to amend the Penal Code by inserting three new sections.

The proposed new section 304A seeks to provide that where any aircraft, vessel or vehicle is used in the commission, or attempted commission, of an offence or any of the offences such as theft, robbery, burglary, house-breaking and similar offences, the aircraft, vessel or vehicle shall, on conviction of the offender, be automatically forfeited to His Majesty. Under section 25 of the Criminal Procedure Code a police officer has powers, *inter alia*, to stop and detain any vehicle in which he has reason to suspect that anything stolen or unlawfully obtained may be found. The proposed new section seeks to provide that, where any aircraft, vessel or vehicle has been detained by a police officer under the provisions of that section and no person is, within seven days, charged with any of the offences referred to above, a police officer may apply to a magistrate to hold an inquiry into the circumstances in which the aircraft, vessel or vehicle was detained and to determine whether or not it was used or employed in the commission, or attempted commission, of such offence. If the magistrate is satisfied that it was so used or employed, it is automatically forfeited to His Majesty. The owner of the aircraft, vessel or vehicle will, however, have the rights of an accused person as in a Preliminary Inquiry and the magistrate's inquiry will be conducted in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code. If the owner satisfies the magistrate that neither he nor any of his agents or servants were aware of nor consented to the use or employment of the aircraft, vessel or vehicle, no forfeiture will take place.

The proposed new section 304B seeks to provide that any person who damages or unlawfully removes any aircraft, vessel or vehicle while it is detained under the provisions of section 25 of the Criminal Procedure Code shall be guilty of an offence.

The proposed new section 304c includes in the definition of "aircraft", "vessel" or "vehicle" anything contained in, being on, or attached thereto which, in the opinion of the court, forms part of the equipment thereof.

It is considered that if the provisions of this Bill become law it will be a deterrent to the present practice of gangs of persons using vehicles and other means of transport for the purpose of committing burglary, thefts, etc. While at the present moment there is no reason to believe that aircraft are being used for these unlawful purposes, it is considered desirable that they should be included inasmuch as the time may come when they may be used in the commission of crimes.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

**A BILL TO AMEND THE ESTATE DUTY
(CONSOLIDATION) ORDINANCE, 1926**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Estate Duty (Consolidation) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Estate Duty (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1926, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

Short title.

No. 13 of 1926.

5 2. Paragraph (2) of section 14 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

Repeal and replacement of paragraph (2) of section 14 of the principal Ordinance.

“(2) Payment of duty shall be made to the Assistant Commissioner.”

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Under the provisions of the principal Ordinance (the Estate Duty (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1926—No. 13 of 1926), estate duty is required to be paid to the Local Treasury for the district in which the person making payment resides and a receipt for such duty is required to be produced to the Assistant Commissioner, for inspection.

It has been represented to the Government that the present procedure is unnecessarily cumbersome, and with that contention the Government agrees.

This Bill, therefore, seeks to amend the principal Ordinance by requiring payment to be made to the Assistant Commissioner, who will be the person responsible for issuing the receipt.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A BILL TO AMEND THE KING'S AFRICAN RIFLES ORDINANCE, 1932

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

No. 48 of 1932.

Repeal of sub-section (5) of section 53 of the principal Ordinance.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the King's African Rifles (Amendment, No. 2) Ordinance, 1948, and shall be read as one with the King's African Rifles Ordinance, 1932, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

2. Sub-section (5) of section 53 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The King's African Rifles (Amendment, No. 3) Ordinance, 1946, repealed the provisions contained in the principal Ordinance (No. 48 of 1932) which enabled sentences of corporal punishment to be imposed on soldiers in the King's African Rifles, but the power to award corporal punishment for offences committed in military prisons and in military detention barracks was inadvertently retained. In consequence, while a Court Martial is deprived of the power to award corporal punishment for the most serious offences, an officer in charge of a military prison or a detention barracks may award such punishment. It is considered that there is no justification for the retention of this anomaly and this Bill, therefore, seeks to repeal the sub-section of the principal Ordinance which confers those powers.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A BILL TO AMEND THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT (RATING) ORDINANCE, 1928

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Government (Rating) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Local Government (Rating) Ordinance, 1928, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

Short title.

No. 20 of 1928.

2. Section 15 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding thereto, at the end thereof, the following new sub-section—

Amendment of section 15 of the principal Ordinance.

“(7) Where a new valuation roll has been prepared and not less than ninety days have elapsed since the date of a notice published under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 9 of this Ordinance, then, notwithstanding that such roll has not been signed and certified in accordance with the provisions of section 11 of this Ordinance, such roll shall for the purposes of this section be deemed to be the valuation roll for the financial year in which such notice is published.”

3. Section 20 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

Amendment of section 20 of the principal Ordinance.

(a) by inserting the brackets and the figure “(1) immediately before the word “When” which appears in the first line thereof; and

(b) by adding thereto the following new sub-section:—

“(2) The provisions of sub-section (1) of this section shall apply *mutatis mutandis* to the case of any rate levied by a local authority on any value appearing in a valuation roll referred to in sub-section (7) of section 15 of this Ordinance and in respect of which an objection to a Valuation Court is pending but which has not yet been determined.”

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

A Municipal Authority is required, by the Local Government Rating Ordinance, 1928 (No. 20 of 1928) to prepare a Valuation Roll of rateable property every five years. After the Valuation Roll has been prepared it is then deposited for public inspection and a Valuation Court is appointed to adjudicate on objections to the Roll. In the larger municipalities it has been found that a Valuation Court may require as long as twelve months to consider the objections and, consequently, the local authority is unable, as the law stands at present, to impose a rate on the basis of the new Valuation Roll. In the United Kingdom a local authority is permitted to impose a rate on a new valuation list before it has been finally approved and certified, i.e. before objections have been disposed of.

This Bill therefore seeks to bring the legislation of the Colony into line with the United Kingdom practice.

Rates due on rateable property, the valuation of which is subject to an objection which is pending before the Valuation Court, will become due and payable on the date fixed but will be subject to subsequent adjustment.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

A BILL TO AMEND THE ROADS PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1924

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

No. 16 of 1924.

Amendment of
section 4 of
the principal
Ordinance.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Roads Protection (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Roads Protection Ordinance, 1924, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

2. Section 4 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein, between the word "Works" and the word "may", which appear in the first line thereof, the words "or any person authorized by him, in writing, in that behalf".

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Under section 4 of the principal Ordinance (the Roads Protection Ordinance, 1924—No. 16 of 1924) the Director of Public Works has power—

- (a) to suspend all traffic on any road for a period not exceeding one month;
- (b) to authorize the placing of notices and barriers to convey to the public adequate intimation of such suspension; and
- (c) to fix the times during which any particular kind of traffic may use any such road.

Speed is essential in closing roads during the wet weather; but the fact that the Director of Public Works has to make the order and has no power to delegate his functions under this section to District Councils and other persons and thus enable immediate action to be taken, sometimes results in serious damage to the roads.

This Bill, therefore, seeks to amend section 4 of the principal Ordinance so as to permit the Director of Public Works to authorize other persons to exercise his powers under that section and thus enable quicker action to be taken.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

GENERAL NOTICE No. 231

TENDER FOR THE EXTRACTION OF MINERAL SALTS FROM LAKE NAKURU

TENDERS are invited for the sole rights to recover and exploit the mineral salts of Lake Nakuru which will include the rights to win, remove and process the deposits of mineral salts on such portions of the shores of the lake as are not included within existing land titles and on the dry portions of the lake bed and also such liquors as may be lying on or below the surface of the lake.

It is proposed that the rights shall be granted for a term of 25 years in the first instance.

Tenders should be by way of a minimum annual rent plus a royalty on production, either on quantities or values.

Tenderers should state as fully as possible what mineral salts they expect to find and by what methods they propose to remove the salts from the lake and subsequently to process them and what finished products they have in view.

A statement is also required indicating specifically the land on or near the lake shores from which operations will be conducted and upon which a factory will be erected and an assurance that the necessary authority of the land owner has been or can be secured.

Tenderers should further indicate the sources from which they expect to obtain the fresh water necessary for the manufacturing process.
