RETAIL PRICE INDEX FOR DECEMBER, 1947

THE general level of retail prices of consumer goods in Nairobi, as at 31st December, 1947, as measured by returns received from representative dealers, was 74.1 per cent above the pre-war level, while the corresponding figure for October, 1947, was 71 per cent.

Excluding imported tobacco and cigarettes, the prices of which have been increased for special reasons, the percentage above the pre-war level was 71.5 per cent.

Increases in price were recorded for bread, flour, atta, biscuits, potatoes, fruits, beef, firewood, lubricating oil and some items of cotton clothing.

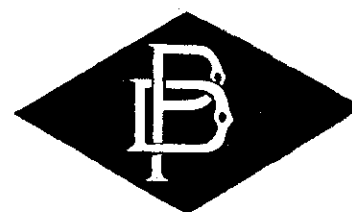

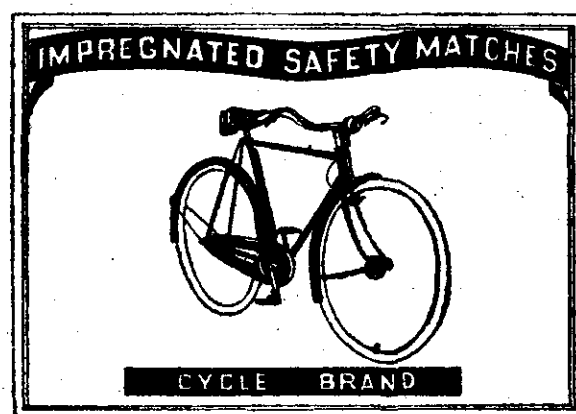

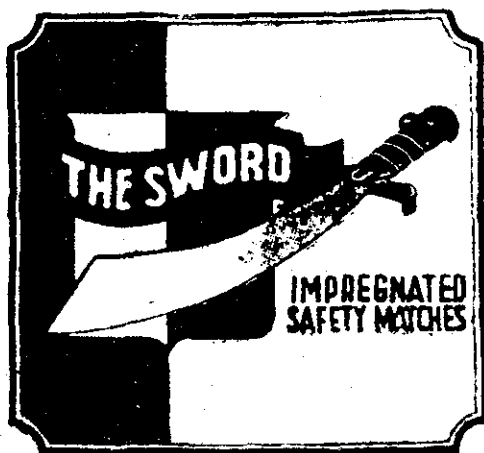
