Clerk, Grade II (Male) (European), Veterinary Department

LICENCE TO CUT FENCE POSTS AND SHINGLES

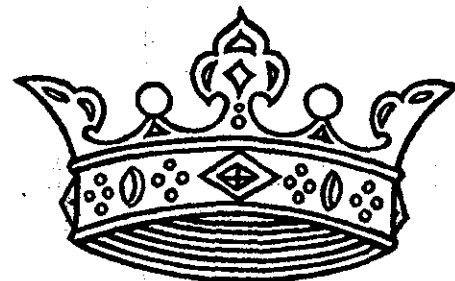
