VACANCIES IN UGANDA PROTECTORATE

Field Officers, Colonial Insecticide Research

APPLICATIONS are invited from serving European officers and others for vacant posts of Field Officers in the Colonial Insecticide Research.

Appointments will be made either on a monthly basis or possibly on Class "B" agreement terms. The initial salary, in the scale £372 by £18 to £480 by £20 to £600 per annum, will be determined in the light of previous experience, including war service. Cost of living allowance at current rates will be paid, and any officers appointed on agreement would be required to contribute to the provident fund.

HOTEL SITE, KAMPALA

TENDERS are invited on the basis of payment of premium per acre for the lease of a plot on which to erect a first-class hotel of the country type. The site is illustrated and outlined in red on a plan which may be inspected at the Land Office, Entebbe, or at the offices of the Senior Surveyor, Kampala, or the Executive Officer, Township Authority, Kampala. The balance will be payable on the acceptance of the formal offer of a lease following the approval of site and building plans referred to above. This deposit is assessed at approximately 25 per cent of the upset premium survey, registration and other legal charges and will not be returned if, for any reason for which the Land Office is not responsible, the lease is not proceeded with.
