HOTEL SITE, KAMPALA

TENDERS are invited on the basis of payment of premium per acre for the lease of a plot on which to erect a first-class hotel of the country type. The site is illustrated and outlined in red on a plan which may be inspected at the Land Office, Entebbe, or at the offices of the Senior Surveyor, Kampala, or the Executive Officer, Township Authority, Kampala. Copies of the plan (No. C. 869) may be obtained post free on payment of Sh. 3 per copy from the Land Office, Entebbe.

The acreage to be allocated will not necessarily be the whole of the area of seven acres shown in red on the plan, but will depend on the layout. The successful tenderer will be required to submit a site plan for the approval of the Land Officer and detailed construction plans for the approval of the Governor before authority to build will be given.

The conditions of tendering are: -

- (a) Tenders are to be made on the basis of premium payments per acre. The upset premium is £500 per acre and tenders below this amount may invalidate the tender.
- (b) Tenderers may be called upon to satisfy the Governor as to the guaranteed capital available for development purposes.
- (c) Sealed tenders marked "Tender for Hotel Site, Kampala", must be submitted to the Land Officer, P.O. Box No. 1, Entebbe, so as to reach him on or before 31st July, 1948.
- (d) The highest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted. The successful tenderer will be offered a lease on the following terms and conditions—
 - (i) Premium: In accordance with his tender per acre.
 - (ii) Rent: Sh. 1,000 per acre per annum. Revisable at end of 33rd and 66th years of the lease.
 - (iii) Area: Such acreage as shall be approved after the submission and approval of both site plans and detailed construction plans.
 - (iv) Term: The lease will be for an initial period of three years and one day from 1st September, 1948, with an extension to the full term of 99 years from that date on completion of the Building Covenant and on the production of an unqualified and full occupation permit.

- (v) Building Covenant: Hotel buildings, exclusive of furniture and other movable fittings, to the value of at least £150,000 shall be erected.
- (vi) Building operations shall not commence until authority to do so has been issued by the Land Officer. This authority will not be issued until after the approval of the site plan and the detailed construction plans.
- (vii) The lease will be drawn up in accordance with provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1903, and the rules thereunder.
- (viii) No transfer will be permitted until the Building Covenant has been fulfilled.
 - (ix) The plot may not be sub-divided.
 - (x) The lessee will not be permitted to sub-let the premises without the consent in writing of the Governor.
- (xi) The user will be restricted to that of an hotel and ancillary purposes therewith such as ornamental gardens, swimming pool, tennis courts, etc., and no other trade, manufacture business or profession shall be carried on without the consent in writing of the Governor.
- (xii) No machinery or engine shall be erected on the premises without the consent in writing of the Governor.
- (xiii) Ample provision for car parking must be made within the site.

The successful tenderer will be required, within seven days of the notification that his tender has been accepted, to pay a deposit of £750. The balance will be payable on the acceptance of the formal offer of a lease following the approval of site and building plans referred to above. This deposit is assessed at approximately 25 per cent of the upset premium survey, registration and other legal charges and will not be returned if, for any reason for which the Land Office is not responsible, the lease is not proceeded with.

The submission of a tender will signify that the tenderer if successful is prepared to accept and abide by the terms and conditions aforementioned.
