Box 89, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3, post free.

The right to withdraw any plot from the sale is reserved to the Commissioner of Lands.

- Such open space shall be at the rear of the building and shall extend along the entire width of the building, or for a distance of not less than 30 feet, whichever shall be the less, and the distance across such open space from every part of the building to the rear boundary of the plot shall be not less than ten feet.
4. At no time during the term of the grant shall the plot, or any portion thereof, or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any trade which has been or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette.

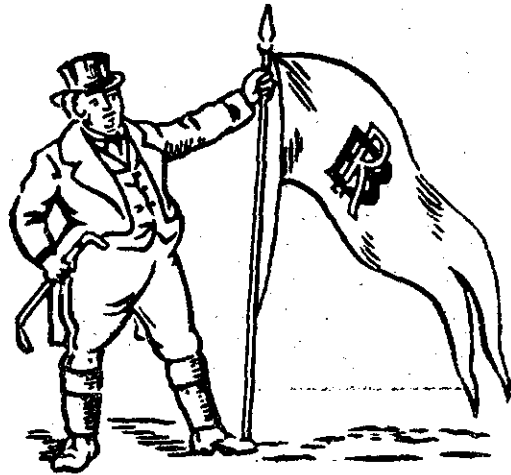

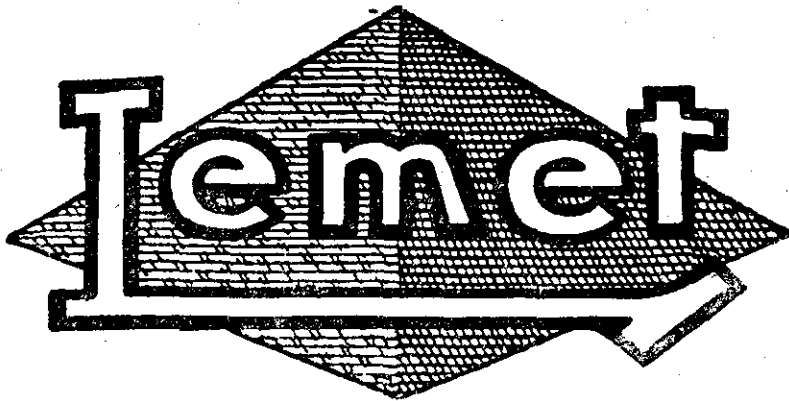

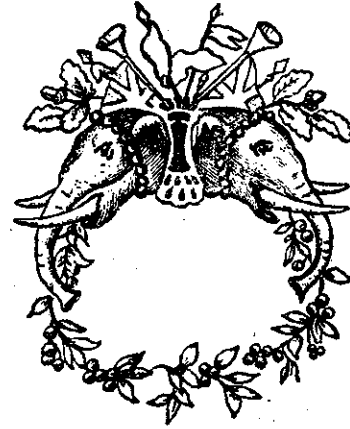
