VACANCIES IN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS

Clerk, Grade II (Male), Veterinary Department

APPLICATIONS are invited for a vacancy for a Grade II (Male) European Clerk in the Veterinary Department.

The scale of salary attached to this post is £295 by £22-10 to £407-10 (efficiency bar) by £22-10 to £565. Initial salary according to age, qualifications and experience. The post will be on probation for two years before admission to the pensionable establishment.

Free passages to the United Kingdom are provided for the officer and his wife and children dependent and under the age of 21, subject to a maximum of three adult passages.

Female (European) Stenographer, Police Department

APPLICATIONS are invited for the post of Female (European) Stenographer in the Police Department, Nairobi. The appointment will be permanent after a period of probation. The scale of the post is £295 by £15 to £370 (E.B.) by £15 to £460, with initial salary according to age, qualifications and experience, or £385 by £15 to £460 per annum if the selected candidate is appointed on a temporary basis and has passed recognized examinations as follows:—

Typing: 50 words a minute for 10 minutes.

Shorthand: 110 words a minute for 5 minutes.

At present a temporary allowance of £5 per month is payable to stenographers serving on probation to the permanent establishment who possess the typing and shorthand qualifications as stated above.

Married applicants will not be eligible for permanent appointment and their terms of service include free medical attention by the Government medical service; vacation leave at the rate of 2½ days for each completed month of residential service after completing at least one year's residential service. Local leave at the rate of 18 days a year.

Applicants must be British by birth.
