ASIATIC WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' PENSION FUND, 1946  
REPORT

The accounts of the Asiatic Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund for the year 1946 have been examined.

BALANCE SHEET

2. The figure for Investments £156,672 6 8 is understated by £583 4 owing to the market value of Ceylon 3 per cent Stock 1959/64 nominal value £600 being shown in the statement of investments as £64 16, instead of £648. This error was adjusted in 1947. The figure for "Reserve for Depreciation of Securities" is correspondingly understated.

3. Pension increases payable in accordance with the Pension Increase Ordinance No. 7 of 1945 amounting to £3,347 10 17 were paid from the fund and subsequently reimbursed by the Government. The figure of £6,894 19 24 shown in respect of Pensions in the Income and Expenditure Statement does not include the above pension increases. As these are initially payable from the fund it is considered they should appear in the statement of income and expenditure.

4. The liability "Pensions Payable" includes an amount in respect of pension increases remaining unpaid. This amount which is not readily ascertainable, is not a liability as these pension increases are reimbursed by Government.

5. Subject to the above comments I am of the opinion that the balance sheet and statement of income and expenditure are true and correct.

6. With reference to paragraph 1 of the 1945 report, the interest referred to has now been transferred to the Asian Officers' Family Pension Fund.

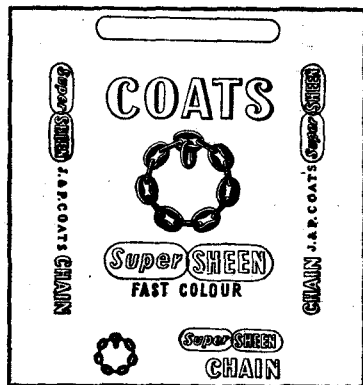

2. As regard pension increases the comment made in paragraph 3 of the 1946 report applies also to 1947. The figure for pensions increases paid in respect of 1947, but not included in the Income and Expenditure account is £2,661 5 82.

3. The comment made in paragraph 4 of the 1946 report on the inclusion of the liability for pensions increases remaining unpaid at the end of the year also applied to 1947.

## STATEMENT 3 PENSION STATEMENT

4. (a) Pension Increase paid in respect of Mrs. S. K. Frank (No. 35) during 1947, should read Sh. 75 not Sh. 50. A reimbursement of Sh. 25 is accordingly due from the General Revenue of the Colony.

(b) Pension payable in respect of Mrs. L. B. M. de Souza (No. 137) should read Sh. 835.20 not Sh. 885.20 and pension unpaid should read Sh. 442.74 not Sh. 492.74.

5. The effect of the above errors is that the item "Pensions" in the statement of Income and Expenditure is overstated by £3 15, the figure "Pension payable" in the Balance Sheet is overstated by £2 10 and an asset should appear "Amount short reimbursed by Government" £1 5. The balance representing the surplus of income over expenditure is understated by £3 15 and the final balance of the Fund is correspondingly understated.
