# THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE REVISION OF AGRICULTURAL RENTS

UNDER the provisions of sections 35 and 36 of Ordinance No. 12 of 1915 as amended by Ordinance No. 37 of 1945, a yearly rental of 20 cents per acre or part of an acre is payable on agricultural land leased under the provisions of Part IV of the Crown Lands Ordinance until the 31st December, 1950, on which date rentals are due for revision.


