### A BILL TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS TARIFF ORDINANCE, 1947

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read and construed as one with the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1947 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance) and all amendments thereto.

2. Item 23 of the Schedule to the principal Ordinance is hereby deleted and the following item substituted therefor:—

"23. Sugar, refined or unrefined  
including jaggery, . . . . . per 100 lb. . . Sh. 2".

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

By reason of the present shortage of sugar in the Colony it has become necessary for Government to import sugar into the Colony and in order to enable such sugar to be sold at a reasonable price it has been decided to reduce the import duty on sugar.

This Bill accordingly amends Item 23 of the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1947, which prescribes the rate of duty on sugar by reducing the rate from Sh. 18 per hundred pounds to Sh. 2 per hundred pounds, and this makes the rate of import duty the same as the rate of excise duty.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

## VACANCIES IN UGANDA PROTECTORATE

*Field Officers, Tsetse Control Department*

APPLICATIONS are invited for three vacant posts of Field Officers (Temporary) in the Tsetse Control Department. The terms of service are as follows:—

- (a) Salary: £600 per annum, consolidated.
- (b) The appointment will be on a Class "B" Agreement for a period of 36 months. Contributions to the provident fund will be compulsory.
- (c) Vacation and local leave, as for established officers. If re-engaged for a further tour of service overseas passages will be provided.
- (d) Accommodation: Field officers are usually posted to places remote from district headquarters and in such cases temporary houses, with a certain amount of furniture and camp equipment, are provided. Rent is payable at a rate not lower than 2 per cent and not exceeding 10 per cent of salary, depending on whether an officer is accommodated in temporary quarters outside a station, or has been allotted quarters in a station either for his sole use or shared by others.
- (e) Medical and dental treatment, as for established officers.

*General.*—The duties of the posts include the control of tsetse by clearing, grass burning, etc., the supervision of tsetse surveys and, in some cases, the control of game eviction measures. No special qualifications are required but candidates must have a reasonable standard of education and like an open-air life. Candidates should preferably be unmarried as it may not always be practicable for wives to accompany their husbands.
