A BILL TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS TARIFF ORDINANCE, 1947

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

Short title.

This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read and construed as one with the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1947 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance) and all amendments thereto.

Amendment of Schedule to principal Ordinance.

2. Item 23 of the Schedule to the principal Ordinance is hereby deleted and the following item substituted therefor:

> "23. Sugar, refined or unrefined including jaggery, ... per 100 lb. .. Sh. 2".

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

By reason of the present shortage of sugar in the Colony it has become necessary for Government to import sugar into the Colony and in order to enable such sugar to be sold at a reasonable price it has been decided to reduce the import duty on sugar

This Bill accordingly amends Item 23 of the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1947, which prescribes the rate of duty on sugar by reducing the rate from Sh. 18 per hundred pounds to Sh. 2 per hundred pounds, and this makes the rate of import duty the same as the rate of excise duty.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

Field Officers, Tsetse Control Department

No special qualifications are required but candidates must have a reasonable standard of education and like an open-air life. Candidates should preferably be unmarried as it may not always be practicable for wives to accompany their husbands.
