# A BILL TO AMEND THE CONTROL OF HOTELS ORDINANCE, 1948

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Control of Hotels (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read and construed as one with the Control of Hotels Ordinance, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance).

Amendment of section 5 of the principal Ordinance.

No. 27 of 1948.

- 2. Section 5 of the principal Ordinance is hereby 5 amended by deleting paragraph (b) of sub-section (4) thereof and substituting the following therefor:—
  - "(b) a licence to manage any hotel named in such licence, remain in force for a period of one year from the date of the issue thereof and, in the discretion of the 10 Authority, be renewable annually thereafter;".

New section giving power to award costs.

3. The principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting therein immediately after section 11 thereof the following new section:—

"Power of Authority to order costs in frivolous proceedings. 11A. Where, after the determination of any applica-15 tion, complaint or objection made to an Authority under the provisions of this Ordinance, the Authority considers that such application, complaint or objection is frivolous, the Authority may order the applicant or the person making such complaint or objection to pay to any 20 other party to the proceedings such sum by way of costs as the Authority may consider to have been attributable to the application, complaint or objection."

Amendment of section 16 (2) of the principal Ordinance.

4. Sub-section (2) of section 16 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting the words "and that he 25 exercised all due diligence" for the words "or that he exercised all due diligence" occurring therein.

# MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The provisions of the Control of Hotels Ordinance, 1948, whereby the licence issued to a person to manage an hotel remains in force indefinitely unless cancelled or suspended by the Authority, throws on the Authority the burden of proving that a licensee is no longer a proper person to continue to hold a licence. The Authority find this burden unduly onerous and clause 2 of this Bill, therefore, amends section 5 of the principal Ordinance by substituting a new paragraph (b) to subsection (4) providing for the issue of a licence for a period of one year with provision for renewal. This will have the effect of throwing on the applicant each year the burden of showing that he is a proper person to receive a licence.

Experience has also shown that some of the applications, complaints and objections made to the Authority are frivolous and ought never to have been made. As the law now stands the Authority are powerless to do anything to discourage such applications, complaints and objections. Clause 3 of the Bill, therefore, inserts a new section giving the Authority power to order an applicant, or a person making a complaint or objection, in any case which the Authority consider to be a frivolous one, to pay to any other party such sum by way of costs as the Authority may consider attributable to the making of the application, complaint or objection.

Opportunity has also been taken to amend a typographical error in sub-section (2) of section 16 of the principal Ordinance. Clause 4 gives effect to this by substituting the words "and that he exercised all due diligence" for the words "or that he exercised all due diligence" occurring in that sub-section.

It is not expected that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

#### A BILL TO AMEND THE INCOME TAX ORDINANCE, 1940

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

This Ordinance may be cited as the Income Tax Short title. (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read and construed as one with the Income Tax Ordinance, 1940 (hereinafter No. 11 of 1940. referred to as the principal Ordinance) and all amendments 5 thereto.

- 2. The provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to assessments in respect of the year of assessment commencing on the first day of January, 1948, and each subsequent year of assessment.
- 3. Sub-section (1) of section 27 of the principal Ordinance Amendment of (as inserted therein by the Income Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948), is hereby amended by substituting a full stop for Ordinance the colon which appears before the proviso thereto, and by No. 69 of 1948. deleting the proviso therefrom.

4. The Third Schedule to the principal Ordinance (inSchedule III to serted therein by the Income Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, the principal 1948), is hereby amended in the following respects-

- (a) by deleting the figure "17,294" where it occurs in the sixth column and by substituting therefor the figure "17,284";
- (b) by deleting the figure "23,874" where it occurs in the fourth column and by substituting therefor the figure "23,877".

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

When the Income Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, was enacted the rates of tax in the other East African territories were higher than those in Kenya and it was, therefore, necessary to insert a proviso to sub-section (1) of section 27 of the principal Ordinance in order to ensure that any income of a Kenya resident which was derived from any of the other territories should be charged at the higher rates then in force in any such territory. The rates of tax in the other territories are no longer higher than those pertaining to Kenya and the necessity for the proviso has therefore ceased.

Clause 2 of the Bill, therefore, deletes the proviso to sub-section (1) of section 27 of the principal Ordinance.

The opportunity has also been taken to correct by clause 3 of the Bill, two typographical errors in the Schedule to the principal Ordinance.

It is not anticipated that there will be any additional expenditure of public moneys if the provisions of this Bill become law.

# A BILL TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF CERTAIN VOLUNTARILY UNEMPLOYED PERSONS

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title, commencement and duration.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Voluntarily Unemployed Persons (Provision of Employment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall come into force by notification in the Gazette and shall expire at the expiration of a period of two years from that date:

Provided that, if at any time while this Ordinance is in force a resolution of the Legislative Council is passed praying that this Ordinance should be continued in force for a further period of one year from the time at which it would otherwise expire, the Governor in Council may by order direct that this 10 Ordinance shall continue in force for that further period.

Interpretation.

2. (1) In this Ordinance, unless inconsistent with the context—

"adult male" means a male person who has attained the age of eighteen years and has not attained the age of forty- 15 five years, other than a person who is of unsound mind, blind, crippled or infirm or who is certified by a Government Medical Officer to be so unfit as to be incapable of engaging in labour;

"certificate of exemption" means an exemption certifi- 20 cate in the prescribed form issued by the Member or by a committee or by any other person authorized in writing in that behalf by the Member or a committee, exempting any person from the provisions of this Ordinance;

"committee" means a Labour Exchange Committee 25 appointed under the provisions of section 4 of this Ordinance;

"court" means any court mentioned in section 3 of the Courts Ordinance, 1931, and includes a Native Tribunal;

"declared area" means any area in the Colony to which the provisions of this Ordinance are applied;

"labour exchange" means a labour exchange established under the provisions of the Employment Ordinance, 1938;

"labour reception centre" means any place established by the Member, by notice in the Gazette, to be a labour reception centre for the purposes of this Ordinance;

No. 2 of 1938.

"Member" means the Member of the Executive Council of the Colony for the time being responsible for labour matters:

"national employment" means any employment, which <sup>5</sup> a committee considers to be of national importance, in any civilian capacity with His Majesty's Forces, in the service of the Government of the Colony, of the East Africa High Commission, or of any Local Government:

"unemployed person" means any adult male who is not 10 in regular employment and has no lawful and regular means of livelihood;

"voluntarily unemployed person" means an unemployed person who is not genuinely seeking employment.

- (2) Any committee, officer in charge of a labour ex-15 change or any other body or person concerned with the administration or enforcement of this Ordinance may determine the age of any male person by his physical appearance and by such other evidence (if any) as may be available, and the age so determined shall, in the absence of satisfactory 20 evidence to the contrary, be deemed to be the age of that person for the purposes of this Ordinance.
- 3. The Governor may, by notice in the Gazette, apply Application. the provisions of this Ordinance to any area in which a labour exchange has been established, from such date as may be 25 specified in such notice.

4. (1) The Member may, by notice in the Gazette, Labour appoint Labour Exchange Committees and, in such notice, Committee. shall specify the areas over which such committees shall have jurisdiction.

- (2) The chairman and other members of each committee shall hold office during the pleasure of the Member.
  - (3) Each committee shall act by majority and the chairman of each committee shall have a casting vote.
- (4) One-third of the members of a committee shall 35 constitute a quorum.
  - (5) In any case of urgency the chairman may exercise all or any of the powers of the committee, reporting to the committee at its next meeting any action taken by him.
- 5. The Member may, by notice in the Gazette, establish Labour 40 labour reception centres in any declared area.

reception

- 6. (1) All unemployed persons within any declared area, Unemployed shall within seven days of arriving in such area, or within report. seven days of becoming unemployed in such area, or within seven days after such area has become a declared 45 area, whichever shall be the later, report to the officer in charge of a labour exchange within such area, unless the unemployed person is in possession of a certificate of exemption from the operation of this Ordinance or is exempted under the provisions of section 19 thereof.
- (2) Failure to report as provided by sub-section (1) of this section shall be an offence against this Ordinance.
- 7. The officer in charge of a labour exchange shall Registration register, in such manner as may be prescribed, any unemployed person who reports to him, and shall either offer such unemployed person suitable employment or shall issue to him a certificate, in the prescribed form, setting out the date upon which he reported and the date upon which he shall again report to such officer or present himself to the committee:

Provided that should any such unemployed person refuse to accept an offer of employment made to him by the officer in charge of a labour exchange and should such officer be of the opinion that he is a voluntarily unemployed person, such officer shall order such unemployed person to report to the committee for the declared area in which such labour exchange is situated, and endorse such order upon such certificate.

Arrest for disobedience of order.

8. Any unemployed person who, without reasonable cause, fails to report as required by a certificate issued under 10 the provisions of section 7 of this Ordinance, or disobeys any order issued under the provisions of that section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and may be arrested, without a warrant, by any of the persons mentioned in section 9 of this Ordinance, and shall then be taken before a committee. 15

Administrative officer may arrest adult male if he has reason to believe he has failed to comply with section 6.

9. Any administrative officer, or person authorized in writing so to do by an administrative officer, may arrest without a warrant, any adult male whom he has reason to believe is an unemployed person who has committed an offence under section 6 of this Ordinance and take him before a committee. 20

Court may order convicted adult male to be taken before committee. 10. A court, upon convicting any adult male of any offence against this Ordinance may, in addition to any punishment which may be imposed for such offence, order that the adult male so convicted shall, either forthwith, or on the expiry of any such punishment, be taken before a committee. 25

Powers of committee.

11. Where any adult male appears, or is brought, before a committee, the committee may require him to show cause why he should not be declared by such committee to be a voluntarily unemployed person.

Certificate of exemption.

12. If an adult male shows cause, as required by section 30 11 of this Ordinance, to the satisfaction of the committee, he shall be furnished, by the committee, with a certificate of exemption, which shall be subject to such conditions as it may endorse thereon.

Adult male may be declared an unemployed person. 13. If an adult male fails to show cause, as provided 35 by section 11 of this Ordinance, to the satisfaction of the committee, the committee may declare him to be a voluntarily unemployed person.

Powers of committee when adult male declared a voluntarily unemployed person.

- 14. When any adult male has been declared to be a voluntarily unemployed person, a committee may—
  - (a) permit him to engage in any employment approved by the committee for such period as the committee may approve;
  - (b) direct him to enter into a written contract of service, for any period not exceeding six months, in any 45 national employment;
  - (c) direct him to go to, and remain in, for such time as may be directed, a rehabilitation or training centre; or
  - (d) if such adult male is not domiciled within the declared 50 area in respect of which the committee has jurisdiction and he has a regular place of residence outside such area, and if he has refused or failed to engage in employment approved by the committee under paragraph (a) of this section, or has failed to comply 55 with any direction given under paragraph (b) or (c) of this section, then the committee may direct him to be repatriated to such place of residence and order him, in writing, to remain outside such declared area and any other declared area, for such 60 period as may be specified in such order.

Any adult male who fails to comply with any direction or order given to him under the provisions of paragraph (b), (c) or (d) of this section, or who, without reasonable cause, leaves any employment in which he has been permitted to 5 engage under the provisions of paragraph (a) of this section within the period approved by the committee or any national employment to which he has been directed under paragraph (b) of this section or any rehabilitation or training centre to which he has been directed under paragraph (c) of this section, 10 shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

15. (1) A committee may direct that any adult male Adult males appearing, or brought, before it shall reside in a labour recep- in labour tion centre for any period not exceeding seven days, while reception centre. such inquiries as the committee may consider necessary are 15 being conducted or while such adult male is awaiting transport to the place of employment to which he has been directed, or to his regular place of residence.

- (2) Failure to comply with a direction made under subsection (1) of this section shall be an offence against this 20 Ordinance.
- 16. (1) Any adult male who is aggrieved by a declaration Appeal. made under section 13, or by a direction of a committee, made under paragraph (b) of section 14 of this Ordinance, may appeal against such declaration or direction to a first 25 class magistrate.
  - (2) On any such appeal, the magistrate may, with or without recording evidence-
    - (a) quash or vary the declaration or direction; or
- (b) remit it to the committee to be reconsidered or for further facts to be found; or 30
  - (c) make such other order as the justice of the case may require.
- In any proceeding under this Ordinance, either in Evidence court or before a committee, in which it is in issue whether burden of 35 any adult male had, or had not, been in a declared area for over seven days from the date of his arrival, or from the date of his becoming unemployed, therein, as the case may be, the burden of proving that he had been in the declared area for less than seven days shall rest upon such adult male.

40 18. The Member may make rules—

Rules.

- (a) providing for the procedure to be followed by committees;
- (b) for the proper feeding of adult males residing in labour reception centres;
- (c) for the management of labour reception centres and the 45 attendance, control and discipline of adult males residing therein;
  - (d) prescribing anything which, under the provisions of this Ordinance, may be prescribed;
- (e) generally for the better carrying out of the provisions 50 of this Ordinance;
  - (f) prescribing a penalty not exceeding a fine of one hundred shillings or one month's imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for breach of any provision of such rules.
  - 19. The Member or any person authorized by him in Exemptions that behalf by notification in the Gazette may, in his discretion, exempt any person, or class of persons, from the operation of this Ordinance.

Penalty.

20. Any person who is guilty of an offence against this Ordinance, shall be liable, for a first offence, to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a period which may extend to three months, or to a fine not exceeding Sh. 500 or to both such fine and imprisonment, and for a second or subsequent offence, shall be liable to imprisonment for a term which may extend to twelve months and to a fine not exceeding Sh. 2,000, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

## MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to make it obligatory upon adult male "unemployed persons", as defined in the Bill, to report to a Labour Exchange where they will be registered and either offered suitable employment or directed to go before a Labour Exchange Committee. A Labour Exchange Committee may require a person who appears before it to show cause why he should not be declared to be a "voluntarily unemployed person", as defined in the Bill, that is to say an unemployed person who is not genuinely seeking employment. If he shows that he is genuinely seeking employment, he may be granted a certificate of exemption from the provisions of the Ordinance. If he fails to show cause to the satisfaction of the Committee, he may be declared to be a voluntarily unemployed person, and may be directed into employment.

The Ordinance is to come into force on such date as may be appointed by the Governor by notification in the Gazette and is to expire at the end of two years from that date unless extended by resolution of the Legislative Council. (Clause 1.)

Clause 2 of the Bill contains important definitions—

"adult male" means a male person who has attained the age of eighteen years and has not attained the age of forty-five years, other than a person who is of unsound mind, blind, crippled, or infirm, or who is certified by a Government Medical Officer to be so unfit as to be incapable of engaging in labour;

"committee" means a Labour Exchange Committee, appointed under the provisions of the Ordinance;

"declared area" means an area in the Colony to which the provisions of the Ordinance are applied;

"Labour Reception Centre" is defined as any place established by the Member, by notice in the Gazette, to be a Labour Reception Centre for the purposes of the Ordinance;

"Member" means the member of the Executive Council responsible for labour matters;

"national employment" means any employment, which the committee considers to be of national importance, in any civilian capacity of His Majesty's Forces, in the service of the Government of the Colony, of the East Africa High Commission or of any Local Government;

"unemployed person" is defined to mean any adult male who is not in regular employment or has no lawful and regular means of livelihood, and "voluntarily unemployed person" means an unemployed person who is not genuinely seeking employment.

It is to be noted the requirements regarding registration and offers of employment apply to fit males between the ages of eighteen and forty-five who are not in regular employment and have no lawful and regular means of livelihood, and the provisions regarding direction of labour apply only to such males if they are not genuinely seeking employment.

The Ordinance will only apply to those areas in which a Labour Exchange has been established and to which the Ordinance is applied by the Governor, by notice in the Gazette. (Clause 3.)

Labour Exchange Committees are to be appointed by the Member. (Clause 4.)

The Member may establish Labour Reception Centres in any declared area. (Clause 5.)

Clause 6 provides that all unemployed persons within any declared area shall, within seven days of arriving in such area, or within seven days of becoming unemployed in such area, or within seven days of such area becoming a declared area, whichever shall be the later, report to the officer in charge of a Labour Exchange within such area, unless the unemployed person is in possession of a certificate of exemption, or is exempted from the operation of the Ordinance under section 19.

Under clause 7, the officer in charge of a Labour Exchange is to register any unemployed person who reports to him, and is either to offer such unemployed person suitable employment, or to issue to him a certificate setting out the date upon which he reported and the date upon which he has again to report to such officer or to present himself to a Labour Exchange Committee. If an unemployed person refuses to accept an offer of employment made to him by the officer in charge of a Labour Exchange, and if that officer is of opinion that the unemployed person is a voluntarily unemployed person, the officer is to order him to report to the Labour Exchange Committee in the declared area, and to endorse such order upon his certificate.

An unemployed person who, without reasonable cause, fails to report, or disobeys an order issued under section 7, may be arrested and taken before a committee. (Clause 8.)

Administrative officers may arrest without warrant and take before a committee, any adult male who, there is reason to believe, is an unemployed person who has failed to report to a Labour Exchange in compliance with section 6. (Clause 9.)

By clause 10, a court convicting any adult male for an offence against the Ordinance, may in addition to inflicting a punishment, order him to be taken before a committee.

Under clause 11, when an adult male is brought before a committee, the committee may require him to show cause why he should not be declared to be a voluntarily unemployed person. If he does show cause, he is entitled to a certificate of exemption from the provisions of the Ordinance. (Clause 12.) If he fails to show cause to the satisfaction of the committee, he may be declared to be a voluntarily unemployed person.

Clause 14 sets out the powers of the committee with regard to persons declared to be voluntarily unemployed persons. The committee may, with regard to any such person—

- (a) permit him to engage in any employment approved by the committee for such period as the committee may approve;
- (b) direct him to enter into a written contract of service, for any period not exceeding six months, in any national employment;
- (c) direct him to go to, and remain in for such time as may be directed, a rehabilitation or training centre; or
- (d) if he is not domiciled within the declared area, and has a regular place of residence outside such area, and if he has refused or failed to engage in employment approved by the committee, or has failed to comply with a direction to enter into a contract for national employment, or to go to and remain in a rehabilitation or training centre, then the committee may direct him to be repatriated to his place of residence and order him to remain outside the declared area and any other declared area for such period as may be specified in the order.

Failure to comply with the directions of the committee will be an offence against the Ordinance, punishable with a fine not exceeding Sh. 500, or three months' imprisonment for a first offence, and twelve months' imprisonment and a fine not exceeding Sh. 2,000 for a second or subsequent offence. (Clauses 14 and 20.)

A committee may direct an adult male to reside in a Labour Reception Centre for any period not exceeding seven days while inquiries are being conducted or while the adult male is awaiting transfer to the place of employment or to his regular place of residence and failure to obey such a direction will be an offence. (Clause 15.)

Under clause 16 there is an appeal to a first class magistrate against a declaration by a committee that a person is a voluntarily unemployed person, or against the direction of a committee directing an unemployed person to enter into a contract of service in any national employment.

Clause 17 throws the burden of proving that an adult male has been less than seven days in any declared area since he arrived, or since he ceased to be employed therein, upon the adult male. This provision is not thought to be unreasonable, because the facts will be within the adult male's own knowledge.

Clause 18 is a rule-making clause, and clause 19 permits the Member or any person authorized by him by notification in the Gazette, to exempt any person, or class of persons, from the operation of the Ordinance. It will be possible, under this clause, to exempt visitors, and other persons, who obviously should be exempted, from the operation of the Ordinance.

Clause 20 provides the penalties already mentioned for offences against the Ordinance.

It is not possible to say what expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

# A BILL TO AMEND THE RADIO-ACTIVE MINERALS ORDINANCE, 1948

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Radio-active Minerals (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read and No. 16 of 1948. construed as one with the Radio-active Minerals Ordinance, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance).

Amendment of section 3 of the principal Ordinance.

No. 29 of 1940.

- 2. Section 3 of the principal Ordinance is amended 5 in the following respects:—
  - (a) by re-numbering the present section as sub-section (1);
  - (b) by substituting for the words "except under and in accordance with the terms and conditions of a licence granted to him by the Governor" occurring in sub- 10 section (1) (as re-numbered by this section) the words "unless he is the holder of a valid prospecting right issued under section 13 of the Mining Ordinance, 1940, upon which there has been endorsed by the Commissioner or an officer duly authorized by him in 15 that behalf authority to prospect for radio-active minerals."; and

(c) by adding a new sub-section (2) as follows:—

"(2) Any person aggrieved by the refusal of the Commissioner or any duly authorized officer to endorse on a prospecting right issued to him authority to prospect for radio-active minerals may appeal to the Governor and the decision of the Governor shall be final.".

Repeal of section 4 of the principal Ordinance.

Section 4 of the principal Ordinance is repealed. 25

Amendment of section 6 of the principal Ordinance.

Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is amended by the deletion of the words "a licence or" where those words occur in the section.

Amendment of section 7 of the principal Ordinance.

5. Section 7 of the principal Ordinance is amended by deleting the words "licence and" where such words occur 30 therein.

Amendment of section 10 (1) of the principal Ordinance.

- **6.** Sub-section (1) of section 10 of the principal Ordinance is amended in the following respects:—
  - (a) by substituting for the words "Where the grant of a licence or a permit has been refused by the Governor 35 under the provisions of section 6 of this Ordinance" the words "Where endorsement of a prospecting right under section 3 of this Ordinance or the grant of a permit under section 6 of this Ordinance has been refused by the Governor"; and
  - (b) by the substitution of the word "endorsement" for the word "licence" where it occurs between the words "the unsuccessful applicant for such" and the words "permit or consent",

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The principal Ordinance prohibits prospecting for any radioactive mineral except under licence from the Governor. By reason of the increasing importance of such minerals and the necessity of securing a sufficient supply from sources within the Commonwealth, it is desired to do everything possible to encourage persons to prospect for radio-active minerals. The fact that prospecting for such minerals by the holder of a prospecting right is not permitted unless the holder also obtains a licence may act as a deterrent to prospectors.

This Bill, therefore, amends the principal Ordinance by deleting from section 3 the necessity for obtaining a licence from the Governor to prospect for radio-active minerals and substituting a provision that a person need only secure a special endorsement by the Commissioner to his prospecting right authorizing him to prospect for such minerals. Provision is made for appeal to the Governor against a refusal by the Commissioner to endorse the prospecting right. (Clause 2.)

Section 4 of the principal Ordinance required a monthly report to be made by anyone prospecting for radio-active minerals. This provision might also tend to act as a deterrent to would be prospectors. Clause 3 of the Bill, therefore, repeals it.

Clauses 4, 5 and 6 of the Bill make consequential amendments to sections 6, 7 and 10 of the principal Ordinance.

It is not expected that there will be any additional expenditure of public moneys if the provisions of this Bill become law.

# A BILL TO AMEND THE MIRAA CONTROL ORDINANCE, 1946

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

No. 53 of 1946.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Miraa Control (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read and construed as one with the Miraa Control Ordinance, 1946 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance).

Repeal and replacement of section 3 of the principal Ordinance.

2. Section 3 of the principal Ordinance is repealed s and the following section substituted therefor:—

"Sale, cultivation, consumption and possession of miraa prohibited.

- 3. (1) Any person, other than a native of the Meru or Embu Districts who has been granted a written permit under the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section, who—
  - (a) cultivates or plants miraa, or being the occupier of any land allows miraa to grow or to be on such land;
  - (b) purchases, sells or otherwise deals in miraa;
- (c) consumes, or is in possession of, any miraa, shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction therefor by a subordinate court of the first or second class be liable to a fine not exceeding two thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding twelve months or to both such fine and imprisonment, and the court may order that any miraa which is found in the possession of such person shall be destroyed; and if any miraa trees or plants are growing upon any land in the occupation of such person the court may order that they be destroyed.
- (2) Subject to any general or special directions of the 25 Provincial Commissioner of the Central Province, any native authority within the Meru District may grant to any native of the Meru District residing within such district, and any native authority within the Embu District may grant to any native of the Embu District residing within 30 such district, a permit in writing—
  - (a) to cultivate or plant miraa within the Meru District or within the Embu District, as the case may be, or, being the occupier of any land within the Meru District or the Embu District, as the 33 case may be, to allow miraa trees or plants to grow or be upon such land;
  - (b) to sell miraa to natives or otherwise deal in miraa with natives, within the Meru District or within the Embu District, as the case may be;
  - (c) to purchase, consume or be in possession of miraa, within the Meru District or within the Embu District, as the case may be:

Provided that no permit granted under the provisions of this sub-section shall authorize any person to sell or 45 supply miraa to any native of the Meru or Embu Districts

who is below any age grade which the Provincial Commissioner of the Central Province, by notice published in the Gazette, may specify.

- (3) In granting any permit under the provisions of sub-section (2) of this section a native authority, may, subject to any general or special directions of the Provincial Commissioner, impose such conditions as it may think fit.
- (4) In this section the expression 'native authority' means any native authority appointed by the Provincial Commissioner of the Central Province for the purposes of this section.".
- The principal Ordinance is amended by the insertion, Addition of new section 3A next after section 3, of the following section as section 3A:-

to the principal

- "3A. (1) When any miraa is found on any premises Onus of proof. 15 or on any vehicle the following persons shall be deemed to be in possession of such miraa:-
  - (a) in relation to any premises, the owner and every person occupying any room, or having access to any part of the premises;
  - (b) in relation to any vehicle, the driver and every person travelling in or on such vehicle,

unless, in either case, any such person proves to the satisfaction of the court that such miraa was on such premises or vehicle without his knowledge.".

Section 4 of the principal Ordinance is amended in the Amendment of following respects:-

the principal Ordinance.

- (a) by substituting the words and figure "sub-section (2)" for the words and figures "sub-sections (2) or (4)" where the latter words occur in the section;
- (b) by substituting a semi-colon for the full stop at the end of the section; and
- (c) by adding after paragraph (c) the following new paragraph:-
  - "(d) the cancellation of any permit issued to such person under section 3 of this Ordinance.".

# MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will amend the Miraa Control Ordinance, 1946, so as to prohibit dealings in miraa except by natives of the Meru and Embu Districts who have been granted a permit under the Ordinance. To accomplish this object, the Bill-

- (a) by clause 2, repeals and re-enacts with modifications section 3 of the principal Ordinance. The new section 3 omits any provisions similar to sub-section (4) of the existing section 3 for the grant of a permit to deal in, or be in possession of miraa to a person other than a native of the Meru or Embu Districts, and by sub-section (1) specifically provides that no person other than a native of the Meru or Embu Districts who has been granted a permit for the purpose, shall cultivate, purchase, sell, consume or be in possession of miraa;
- (b) by clause 3, inserts a new section providing that where miraa is found on any premises or in any vehicle the owner and every occupier, or the driver and every passenger, as the case may be, shall be deemed to be in possession of it unless he proves that the miraa was on the premises or vehicle without his knowledge;
- (c) by clause 4, deletes from section 4 of the principal Ordinance any reference to a permit under sub-section (4) of section 3 and inserts a new provision as paragraph (d) whereby the permit granted to any person may be cancelled upon conviction of an offence against the provisions of the Ordinance.

It is not expected that there will be any adidtional expenditure of public moneys if the provisions of this Bill become law,

# A BILL TO AMEND THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

Cap. 140.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Crown Lands (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read and construed as one with the Crown Lands Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance).

Amendment of sections 35, 36 and 37 of the principal Ordinance. No. 37 of 1945.

2. Sections 35, 36 and 37 of the principal Ordinance 5 are hereby respectively amended by the deletion (wherever such figures occur therein) of the figures "1950" (inserted therein by the Crown Lands (Amendment) Ordinance, 1945) and by the substitution therefor of the figures "1960".

Any lessee who alleges that by reason of this Ordinance the rent payable by him is excessive may object.

3. Any lessee who objects that by reason of this Ordin-10 ance the rent payable under his lease for the period 1st day of January, 1951, to 31st day of December, 1960, is excessive, shall notify the Commissioner of Lands, in writing, to that effect on or before the 31st day of March, 1951, and upon receipt by him of such notification, the Commissioner of Lands 15 shall, notwithstanding the provisions of the principal Ordinance, determine the rent which shall be payable under such lease for such period.

The lessee, who has objected under section 3 to be given notice of the amount payable under his lease.

- 4. (1) When the Commissioner of Lands has determined, under the provisions of section 3 of this Ordinance, the rent 20 which shall be payable under any lease, he shall, before the 30th day of June, 1951, cause a notice to be served upon the lessee setting forth the rent payable in respect of the land, the subject of the lease, for the period 1st day of January, 1951, to the 31st day of December, 1960.
- (2) If, within one month of the date of the service of the notice mentioned in sub-section (1) of this section, the lessee does not notify the Commissioner of Lands, in writing, that he objects to the amount of rent which the Commissioner of Lands has determined shall be payable in respect of the land, 30 the subject of the lease, rent shall be payable as so determined.
- (3) If within one month of the date of the service of the notice mentioned in sub-section (1) of this section the lessee notifies the Commissioner of Lands, in writing, that he objects to the amount of rent which the Commissioner of Lands has 35 determined shall be payable in respect of the land, the subject of the lease, the question of the amount of rent which shall be payable in respect of such land shall be referred to and determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions of section 150 of the principal Ordinance.

Service of notices.

5. (1) The notice given under the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 4 of this Ordinance may be served on the lessee either personally or by being sent by registered post to his last known place of business or private address.

Where the notice is served by registered post, it shall be deemed to be served not later than the seventh day succeeding the day on which the notice would have been received in the ordinary course of post, and in proving the service of such 5 notice it shall be sufficient to prove that the envelope containing the notice was properly addressed and posted.

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will amend the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 140 of the Revised Edition) by deferring from 31st December, 1950, to 31st December, 1960, the date fixed for the revision of the rent of land leased for agricultural purposes under Part IV of the Ordinance.

The Bill also makes provision whereby any lessee who considers himself aggrieved by the deferment of the revision of rent may require the Commissioner of Lands to revise his rent and determine what amount he shall pay between 1951 and 1960. If such lessee is dissatisfied with the amount of rent fixed by the Commissioner of Lands, there is provision whereby he may have the matter referred to arbitration in the manner provided by section 150 of the Crown Lands Ordinance.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law, but there will be a loss in revenue of an amount which it is not possible at present to estimate.






