VACANCIES IN TANGANYIKA TERRITORY

Inspector of Weights and Measures, Police Department

A VACANCY will shortly occur for an Inspector of Weights and Measures in the Police Department in Tanganyika Territory. The post is pensionable and carries a salary scale of £570 by £20 to £690 by £25 to £840. Appointment would be on probation for two years in the first instance. Normal overseas conditions of service with 10 per cent deduction for rent where quarters are provided. Candidates, between the ages of 25 to 35 years preferred.

Applicant should be in possession of a Board of Trade Certificate of Qualification as Inspector of Weights and Measures. The person appointed will be required to perform duties under the provisions of the Weights and Measures Ordinance. The duties entail frequent travelling throughout the territory.

Applications should be forwarded to the Secretary, Senior Service Advisory Board, the Secretariat, Dar es Salaam, to arrive not later than 18th August, 1949. Serving Government officials should apply through their heads of departments, and forward a Personal Record Form (P/2). Applicants who are not in Government service should submit their applications in writing together with a completed application form which can be obtained on request from the Secretariat of the territory in which they are residing. Land Assistant, Department of Lands and Mines

APPLICATIONS are invited for a vacancy which exists in the Department of Lands and Mines, Tanganyika Territory, for a Land Assistant.

The post, which is permanent and pensionable, subject to the successful completion of the normal probationary period, carries a salary scale of £550 by £20 to £690 by £25 to £840 on normal overseas terms.

Applicants who have any previous experience in a lawyer's office are preferred, but such qualification is not regarded as essential, and any applicant of a good general education, with a legal bent and inclination, would be considered.

The duties of the post, which is subordinate to the post of Assistant Land Officer held by qualified solicitors, consist principally of conveyancing work, including preparation of preliminary agreements and conditions of sale, leases and grants relating to public land. Also examination of claims to land and legal suits thereto.

NOTICE TO EXPORTERS—No. 2/1949
THE DEFENCE (FINANCE) REGULATIONS, 1940
PAYMENT FOR EXPORTS

EXPORTERS are aware that under regulation 7A of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1940, governing exports to countries outside the sterling area, they are required to show to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Customs before export that payment for the goods has been or will be made in an approved manner within a period of six months, or such longer period as may be allowed, and that the payment represents full value of the goods.

Up to the present it has been the custom in Kenya to require a declaration to this effect to be made on the Export Licence Form (EXP/8 and EXP/9). It has, however, now been decided to use a separate form (No. C.D.3) for this declaration in accordance with the practice in force in the United Kingdom. The present is an opportune time to introduce this change, in view of the modifications which are to be made in regard to the export licensing procedure and the expansion of the system of open general export licences. The new procedure will be instituted on 2nd August, 1949.

The sterling area comprises the following territories:—

The British Empire (except Canada and Newfoundland),
British Mandated Territories,
British Protectorates and Protected States,
Republic of Eire.
Burma,
Iraq,
Iceland.

Exporters in any doubt as to whether a destination is outside the sterling area or as to the appropriate method of payment should consult their bankers.

Exporters are warned in their own interests that shipment of the goods may not be allowed unless the proper form, satisfactorily completed, is produced to the Customs at the port or place of shipment with the entry.

NORMAL PROCEDURE

1. *Form C.D.3.*—Exporters must complete a form C.D.3 which is obtainable from any bank or Collector of Customs or from the Export Licensing Division, Shell House, Nairobi. *The notes on pages 2 and 4 of this form are important and should be read before the form is completed.* A separate form must be used for each shipment. Exporters experiencing difficulties in completing Form C.D.3 should refer to their bankers for assistance.

2. *Goods Exported as Cargo or Air Freight.*—

(a) Form C.D.3 duly completed must be produced to the Customs with the Customs entry. Pages 1 and 2 will be retained by the Customs and pages 3 and 4 will be returned to the exporter or his agent.

(b) When payment for the goods is made direct to the exporter in Kenya, the exporter must, immediately on receiving payment for the goods, get his bank to complete the certificate of payment on page 3 and to forward pages 3 and 4 of the form direct to the Commissioner of Customs, Mombasa.

(c) When payment for the goods is to be made to an agent, person or company in the United Kingdom, pages 3 and 4 of the form must be forwarded, together with the other shipping documents to such agent, person or company for production to the bank through which payment for the goods will be received. After certifying payment on page 3, the bank will forward pages 3 and 4 of the form to the Bank of England, which will return them in due course to the Commissioner of Customs, Mombasa.

Correspondence will be avoided by prompt compliance with this requirement. The procedure to be followed according to the method of payment is described in detail in the notes on page 4 of the form.

3. *Exports by Post.*—Where goods are exported by post, pages 1 and 2 of the form must be placed in an envelope marked "Form C.D.3" which must be attached firmly to the package in such a manner as to be readily detachable. The outer cover of the package must be clearly marked "Form C.D.3. No." followed by the serial number of the form used. Where a single form covers a batch of parcels the envelope containing the form must be marked "..... parcels, Nos." and each parcel must be marked "one of a batch of parcels covered by Form C.D.3 No.". Failure to observe these requirements may lead to delay in dispatch. Pages 3 and 4 of the form must be retained by the sender for subsequent action as in the notes on page 4 of the form. Form C.D. 3 need not, however, be completed for goods exported by post up to a value of £5 (five pounds) but exporters must obtain payment in the prescribed manner unless permission to do otherwise has been given, or the goods are being exported as a genuine gift by a private individual. In this connexion see also paragraph 8 below.

4. *Export Licences.*—It must be clearly understood that nothing in the law or procedure relating to Exchange Control relieves an exporter from the necessity of obtaining an export licence, where appropriate,

5. *Transshipments.*—In the case of goods arriving from any part of the sterling area for transshipment to any destination outside those territories, documentary evidence should be produced to the Customs indicating that an Exchange Control Export Form has been completed in the country of export. Otherwise Form C.D.3 must be completed. Exporters are referred to Notice to Exporters No. 1/1949. Form C.D.3 is not required for goods which arrive from any place outside the sterling area and which are dealt with under the transshipment procedure.

6. *Disbursements.*—The gross price of the goods may be reduced by disbursements in respect of the particular shipment concerned. Any other deductions, e.g. arising from previous shipments, must receive the approval of the Exchange Control obtained through the exporter's bank (see paragraph 7 below).

PROCEDURE TO BE FOLLOWED IN SPECIAL CASES

7. *General.*—Persons desiring to export goods without receiving payment, or in other circumstances not conforming to normal requirements, except as provided below, should apply to the Exchange Control, P.O. Box 621, Nairobi, through their own bank, forwarding Form C.D.3 completed as far as possible. It should be noted that the grant of any special permission must be endorsed on the form before lodgment with the Customs.

8. *Trade Samples and Printed Advertising Matter.*—Forms C.D.3 in respect of bona fide trade samples and printed advertising matter supplied without charge need not be submitted to the Exchange Control for endorsement. Instead, they may bear a statement that the goods are bona fide trade samples, or advertising matter, supplied without charge; a copy of the packing list or advice note should be attached to the Form C.D.3 in the case of trade samples. If the circumstances are unusual in any way, however, the exporter is advised, in order to avoid possible delay at the port, to forward the Form C.D.3 to the Exchange Control through his own bank for approval prior to exportation.

9. *Extended Credits.*—Exporters who wish to give credit beyond six months from the date of export should forward to the Exchange Control through their own bank, a letter of explanation stating the extension required. Before any contract providing for extended credit terms is entered into the Exchange Control's approval should be obtained. Any extension authorized must be endorsed by the Exchange Control on the relative Form C.D.3 before lodgment with the Customs at the time of shipment of the goods.

WARNING

10.—*Penalties.*—The attention of exporters and others concerned with the export of goods is drawn to the fact that heavy penalties attach to contraventions.

EUROPEAN RESIDENTIAL SETTLEMENT
MOLO TOWNSHIP

SUBJECT to sufficient applications being received, Government is now prepared to consider the development of some 500 acres of Crown land adjoining Molo Township as a residential settlement.

Plots would vary from 15 to 25 acres and the development and allocation of plots would be under the control of a Development Committee appointed by Government and representative of local interests.

Plots would be served by a piped water supply to the plot boundaries and by all-weather roads connecting each plot with the main road.
