THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE

HOTEL SITE—MACKINNON ROAD TOWNSHIP

APPLICATIONS are invited for the direct grant of the plot in the Mackinnon Road Township described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of erecting an hotel.

A plan of the plot may be seen at the Public Map Office of the Survey Department, Government Road, P.O. Box 89, Nairobi, or may be obtained on application to the Director of Surveys for Sh. 3, post free. Applications should be submitted to the Special Commissioner and Acting Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the District Officer, Mackinnon Road, and must be sent so as to reach the District Officer not later than noon on Thursday, 18th October, 1949.

(A) General Conditions

1. Applications should be accompanied by a statement indicating—

- the present land holding (if any) of the applicant in the Colony and the amount of and nature of development thereon;
- the detailed proposals of the applicant for the development of the area, illustrated by site sketch plans to scale;
- the amount of guaranteed capital available for development purposes.

2. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.

3. The cost of roads and drains in respect of the plot has not yet been ascertained but will be assessed as soon as possible and shall be paid to the Commissioner of Lands within seven days of a demand therefor.

4. The successful applicant shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand the rent due to 31st December, 1949, as shown in the Schedule, together with the survey fees and fees in respect of preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 120) and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant.

5. In default of payment as stipulated in paragraphs 3 and 4 the Commissioner of Lands may order the plot to be forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

6. In the consideration of applications regard will be had to the relative merits of the proposed plans for construction.

(B) Conditions of Grant

1. Grants will be subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 140) and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Cap. 142).

2. The grant will be for a term of 30 years from the 1st day of November, 1949.

3. A permanent or semi-permanent building on proper foundations constructed of approved materials with a minimum of 20 bedrooms must be erected within three years of the written authorization of the Commissioner of Lands to enter into possession.

4. No building shall be erected on the plot until plans drawn to scale with drawings, elevations and specifications thereof have been approved by the Commissioner of Lands and the Township Authority. Plans in triplicate should be submitted in the first instance to the District Officer, Mackinnon Road.

5. User will be restricted to hotel purposes only.

6. All rates, taxes, assessments, impositions and all other outgoings including Government contribution in lieu thereof, must be paid by the grantee on demand.

7. The grantee shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the buildings clearly defined and showing a system of sullage, sewage and drainage of the surface water on the plot which shall satisfy the Township Authority, and before any building may be occupied the grantee shall satisfy the said Authority that such system has been properly constructed.

8. The grantee shall suitably connect his premises with any town drainage system when, in the opinion of the Township Authorities, such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the grantee reasonably so to connect.

9. No subdivision of the plot will be permitted during the continuance of the term.

10. The grantee shall within three years of the commencement of the term completely enclose the plot with a fence or wall of approved design.

11. A car park for a minimum of 20 vehicles shall be provided on the site.

12. All outbuildings, offices, etc., shall be properly screened from view to the satisfaction of the Township Authority and the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint, and shall be kept so screened during the term of the lease.

13. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the premises and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the

grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to interfere with any existing alignments of mains or pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

14. Except as varied hereby the ordinary conditions applicable to township grants will apply to this grant.

NYANZA DISTRICT COUNCIL

NOTICE RE RESIDENT LABOURERS ORDINANCE

THE ATTENTION of the public concerned is drawn hereby to clause 6 of the Nyanza District Council (Resident Labourers) Order, 1942; reference Government Notice No. 219 of 1943.

The intention of the Council when making this Order was to include the whole of L.R. No. 1574 in the "Area" referred to in clause 6, but the wording has caused some misunderstanding in this direction.
