**A BILL TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS TARIFF
ORDINANCE, 1947**

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Amendment) (No. 2) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read and construed as one with the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1947, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance. Short title.

The free allowances do not apply in the case of any passenger who has in his possession any quantity in excess of such allowances and duty is leviable in such cases on the full quantity in his possession.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill amends the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1947, by varying the duties on many of the articles specified in the Schedule to the Ordinance. In effecting these amendments the Bill implements the recommendations of a Committee appointed to investigate anomalies in the Customs Tariff.

The most important respects in which the Tariff has been amended are effected by the following paragraphs of Clause 2 of the Bill—

- (a) paragraph (11) whereby mining corduroy and wood tops for fibre-squeezing presses have been included under Item 37 as duty free imports;
- (b) paragraph (12) whereby the duty under Item 38 on second-hand clothing and apparel, not elsewhere enumerated in the Tariff, imported for sale, is reduced from 60% to 22%;
- (c) paragraph (15) whereby cotton thread for sewing sacks and bags and cotton twine for making or repairing fishing lines and fishing nets and netting have been included under Item 44 as duty free imports;
- (d) paragraph (19) whereby baby carriages, bath chairs and similar carriages have been included under Item 50 and admitted duty free;
- (e) paragraph (25) whereby Item 62 is amended so as to include among the vehicles admitted duty free all lorries, irrespective of the carrying capacity thereof, and vehicles primarily designed for use in connexion with agriculture, forestry, mining or other local industries;
- (f) paragraph (26) whereby the articles enumerated in Item 66, namely pickaxes, crowbars, shovels, earth-pans, axes and hatchets are admitted duty free instead of upon payment of duty at 10 per cent *ad valorem*;
- (g) paragraph (61) whereby a new Item 173 is added providing for the duty free importation of articles imported by or on behalf of the British Council for its official and public use or for donation to any institution approved by the Governor;
- (h) paragraph (62) whereby a new Item 174 is added which incorporates the duty free articles hitherto included in Item 60 (deleted by paragraph (24) of Clause 2) and in addition includes warning signs and street-lighting equipment. Under Item 60 signs were only admitted duty free if made of metal. Under the new item signs of the type specified will be admitted duty free of whatever they are made.

The provisions of this Bill if enacted will not entail any additional expenditure of public funds but will result in some loss of revenue.

(2) A good knowledge of the Code of Regulations of Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika Governments is necessary as well as a sound knowledge of Railway and Customs Tariffs and general shipping regulations. He must know the shipping procedure at the port.

(3) He will be responsible for the smooth running of the Transport Section and will be required to handle official correspondence including drafting of letters pertaining to his section.

(4) Vehicle log books, stores ledgers are required to be kept, and issue stores and petrol to lorries, and to prepare payment vouchers for stores and petrol purchased for the vehicles of this department.

(5) He will be responsible and will supervise the local purchase of stores for Uganda Government and make payments to the various suppliers.

(6) All rail and road transport as necessary for Government officers and stores for Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika Governments in accordance with regulations of the respective Governments must be dealt with by this officer.

(7) Shipment of Government goods to various parts of the world on behalf of various East African Governments will likewise be supervised and dealt with.

(8) He will also keep statistics of the running mileage of vehicles, passengers booked by rail and road and of stores (inward and outward) handled by this department, maintaining a baggage allowance register of all officials.

(9) Safari transport by road to any part of the Coast Province as and when necessary will come under his control.

(10) He will handle the transport of specie and currency both inward and outward at Mombasa and arrange police supervision of it.

REFUNDS OF INCOME TAX TO KENYA
EX-SERVICEMEN

IT IS hereby notified for public information that the Government of Kenya has undertaken that Kenya personnel whose war service rendered them liable to United Kingdom income tax should have refunded to them the difference between—

- the aggregate actually paid of United Kingdom income tax on service emoluments and the Kenya income tax on other income which accrued in Kenya; and
- the amount of Kenya income tax which would have been paid if the amount of service emoluments had been added to such other income, and had been subject only to Kenya income tax on the total.

2. The period of service to which this notice applies is that of service to the date of release from military service or the date when release could have been obtained under the appropriate age and service group, whichever is the earlier, but in no case later than 5th April, 1947.

3. Certain Kenya personnel who fell within the categories listed in Command Paper No. 6559 had their United Kingdom tax payments abated to Kenya rates while serving in Imperial units and others have since obtained appropriate refunds from the United Kingdom authorities.

4. Kenya personnel, not covered by the preceding paragraph, but to whom this notice applies, who were bona fide residents of Kenya prior to enlistment and who have returned to reside in the Colony, wishing to take advantage of the undertaking quoted in the first paragraph of this notice, should make immediate application in writing to the Commissioner of Income Tax supported by the following information:—

- Amount of taxable income (after deduction of uniform allowance);
- deductions allowed by the United Kingdom authorities in arriving at the chargeable income;
- the amount of tax actually paid;
- such other information as may be required by the Commissioner.

No claims will be considered unless they are received by the Commissioner of Income Tax before 1st July, 1950.

5. The above information, which should be obtained from the appropriate pay authority, will be required in respect of each year applicable for the year ending 5th April in each year, and documentary evidence of residence in Kenya prior to enlistment should be included.

6. Kenya personnel who have already made application to this office but not yet received a refund should now forward the information required in accordance with paragraph 3 of this notice direct to the Commissioner of Income Tax, if this has not already been supplied. All communications previously received in this office from such applicants are being transferred to the office of the Commissioner of Income Tax, to which all further correspondence in this connexion should be addressed.

7. Refunds will be made direct to the applicant by the Accountant General on receipt of a certificate from the Commissioner of Income Tax certifying that the refund is due and payable in accordance with the terms of this notice.

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, UGANDA

IMPORTATION OF PLANTS INTO UGANDA

AN ORDER regulating the importation of plants into Uganda was published as Legal Notice No. 162 of 1949, in the Supplement to the Official Gazette of 30th June. This Order replaces a number of regulations made under the Customs Management Ordinance, and brings Uganda's procedure for plant importation into close similarity with that of neighbouring territories, and Empire countries generally.

Now a permit is required to enable one to introduce into Uganda any living plant or part of a plant, and the following seeds: coffee, cotton, tobacco, tea, cacao, coco-nut, groundnut, lucerne, clover, rubber, maize, cloves, peach barberry, buckthorn and potato and any other seeds in excess of 1 lb. weight in any individual package.

Permits are obtainable on application to the Senior Entomologist, Kawanda Research Station, P.O. Box 265, Kampala. Applicants should state—

- (a) their name and address;
- (b) the name and address of the supplier;
- (c) the route by which the importation will be made;
- (d) full particulars of the plants required;
- (e) the name of the farm, estate, etc., where the plants or seeds will be planted.

The permit will state any conditions which will have to be fulfilled by the importer, or by the supplier on his behalf. For instance, no soil may accompany plants, and in most cases each consignment will require a certificate of inspection and freedom from pests and disease issued by the country of origin. Tobacco seed has to be disinfected before arrival, and clover seed has to be certified free from dodder.

Owing to the danger of introducing tomato spotted wilt disease, permits will not be issued for herbaceous ornamental plants in a vegetative condition other than from Kenya except in the case of certain plants from England and Holland. Where it is possible for the Ministries of Agriculture of England and of Holland to issue special certificates certifying that the plants were inspected during active growth and found free of spotted wilt, importation of carnations, gladiolus and daffodil and related bulbous plants will be allowed. At present, permits will not be given for dahlias, *Nicotiana*, *Begonia*, *Chrysanthemum* and Arum lilies. All herbaceous ornamental and plants from Tanganyika are banned.

Plants may be imported into Uganda only through Kampala, Port Bell, Entebbe and Mombasa, where facilities exist for inspection. All importations other than permitted seeds in packets of 1 lb. or less are liable to inspection and to such treatment as the inspector may order to prevent the spread of any pest or disease.

The purpose of this control of plant importation is to permit the introduction of new plants into Uganda in such a way that the risk of accidental introduction of new pests and diseases at the same time will be reduced to a minimum. The Department of Agriculture will give all the assistance it can to those who wish to import plants. At the same time such restrictions as are considered essential for the protection of our crops will be enforced, and the co-operation of the public is invited in not attempting to evade the regulations from ignorance or selfish disregard of the well-being of others.
