AUSTRIAN RESTITUTION LAWS

THE following is published for general information:

Claims by persons resident outside Austria for the restitution of their rights to property which had been confiscated under National Socialists discriminatory laws should be made before 31st December, 1949. This was announced in the *Board of Trade Journal* on 25th June.

There are three Austrian Restitution Laws. The first provided for the restitution of confiscated property which is at present administered by the Austrian Federal or Provincial Authorities, the second dealt with property which by reason of forfeiture came under the ownership of the Austrian Republic and the third with property which is at present in the possession of physical persons or legal entities.

Claims arising under the first and second Restitution Laws must be formally asserted with the provincial Finance Directorate (Finanz Landesdirecktion) in whose district the property in question is located, and under the third Law with the Restitution Commission of the Landes (Kreis) Gericht in whose district the defendant has his normal residence.

Persons resident outside Austria have previously been advised to submit a notification of their claims under the Restitution Laws to the Federal Ministry for Property Control and Economic Planning. Claimants who have already notified their claims to that Ministry are advised that this does not constitute a formal assertion of a restitution claim, though it may be that the Ministry have passed the notification of claim to the proper Austrian authority. They should, therefore, communicate with the appropriate Austrian authority either direct or through their legal representative in Austria to ensure that their claims have been properly asserted and if they have not, take the necessary action without delay.

VACANCY IN TANGANYIKA TERRITORY

Deputy Custodian of Enemy Property

A VACANCY exists in Tanganyika for the post of Deputy Custodian in the Department of the Custodian of Enemy Property.

The post, which is non-pensionable, carries a salary scale of £1,185 by £45 to £1,320. The appointment would be on overseas "contract" terms, for a tour of 24 to 36 months. On satisfactory completion of the tour, a gratuity of £37-10 would be payable for each completed period of three months, including approved leave. Where Government quarters are provided, salary would be subject to a deduction of 10 per cent.

The qualifications required for this post are: a good experience of general office administration, including especially a knowledge of business accountancy, as well as the ability to adjudicate on claims against, and to deal with the liquidation of, enemy estates.

The duties of the post would include, principally, the administration and supervision of work connected with the claims and liquidations referred to above, and also acting for the Custodian, while absent or on leave.

Applications should be addressed to the Chief Secretary, the Secretariat, Dar es Salaam, and should reach him not later than 31st October, 1949. Candidates already in the service should apply through their head of department, and should enclose an up-to-date copy of a Personal Record Form (P/2). All other applicants should submit full details and copies of testimonials, together with a completed application form in duplicate which can be obtained on request from the Secretariat of the territory in which they are residing.





LAND REFORM IN HUNGARY

THE following extract from the *Board of Trade Journal* is published for general information. The time limit of 30th September, 1949, for applications for copies of claim forms applies only in the United Kingdom. Anyone wishing to apply for a claim form may notify the Custodian of Enemy Property, near Vermont Hall, P.O. Box 1892, Nairobi, by Saturday, 15th October, 1949. Claim forms will then be obtained from the Foreign Office on behalf of claimants.

Land Reform in Hungary

The Hungarian Government have now indicated that claims may be registered by British subjects whose property has been affected under the Hungarian Land Reform Act of 1945, and the subsequent modification thereof. Such claimants may claim compensation under the relevant provisions of Hungarian Decree 3520/1948 by registering their land reform claims (separately from any Peace Treaty claims which they may be making) with the Hungarian Reparations Office, Jozsef Nador Ter 3, V. Budapest, either personally or through their attorney. All those claimants who have already registered claims in respect of Land Reform, whether they have done so directly to the Hungarian authorities or whether they included them in claims made under Article 26 of the Hungarian Peace Treaty registered with any British or Hungarian authority, are required to make a fresh registration of their Land Reform claims which can be effected by means of the procedure set out below.

Citizens of the United Kingdom and legal entities constituted under the laws of the United Kingdom who possessed this status on 18th March, 1945, whose property has been subjected to measures of Land Reform and who have not already registered the property with the Administration of Enemy Property Department, or who have not already received a communication from that Department and who wish to register their claims through His Majesty's Government should apply to the Foreign Office (Claims Department), 3 Cleveland Row, London, S.W.I, who will forward them a claim form with explanatory instructions. Such applications must be made to the Foreign Office (Claims Department) not later than 30th September, 1949.

This announcement and the claim form to be completed relate solely to property affected by Hungarian Land Reform legislation and do not apply to property affected by nationalization or other measures.

- 5. In default of payment as stipulated in paragraphs 3 and 4 the Commissioner of Lands may order the plot to be forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.
- 6. In the consideration of applications regard will be had to the relative merits of the proposed plans for construction.

(B) Conditions of Grant

- 1. Grants will be subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 140) and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Cap. 142).
- 2. The grant will be for a term of 30 years from the 1st day of November, 1949.
- 3. A permanent or semi-permanent building on proper foundations constructed of approved materials with a minimum of 20 bedrooms must be erected within three years of the written authorization of the Commissioner of Lands to enter into possession.

- 4. No building shall be erected on the plot until plans drawn to scale with drawings, elevations and specifications thereof have been approved by the Commissioner of Lands and the Township Authority. Plans in triplicate should be submitted in the first instance to the District Officer, Mackinnon Road.
- 5. User will be restricted to hotel purposes only.
- 6. All rates, taxes, assessments, impositions and all other outgoings including Government contribution in lieu thereof, must be paid by the grantee on demand.
- 7. The grantee shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the buildings clearly defined and showing a system of sullage, sewage and drainage of the surface water on the plot which shall satisfy the Township Authority, and before any building may be occupied the grantee shall satisfy the said Authority that such system has been properly constructed.
- 8. The grantee shall suitably connect his premises with any town drainage system when, in the opinion of the Township Authorities, such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the grantee reasonably so to connect.
- 9. No subdivision of the plot will be permitted during the continuance of the term.
- 10. The grantee shall within three years of the commencement of the term completely enclose the plot with a fence or wall of approved design.
- 11. A car park for a minimum of 20 vehicles shall be provided on the site.
- 12. All outbuildings, offices, etc., shall be properly screened from view to the satisfaction of the Township Authority and the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint, and shall be kept so screened during the term of the lease.
- 13. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the premises and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the

grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to interfere with any existing alignments of mains or pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

14. Except as varied hereby the ordinary conditions applicable to township grants will apply to this grant.
