A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1930

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows—

Short title

No 63 of 1930

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Townships (Amendment) Ordinance, 1949, and shall be read and construed as one with the Townships Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Amendment of section 33 of the principal Ordinance

2. Section 33 of the principal Ordinance is amended by inserting next after paragraph (25) the following new paragraph --

(25A) For prohibiting or regulating the keeping of stock generally of any particular class of stock in any township or in any specified area of a township and for 10 empowering a court to order, in addition to any other penalty which may be prescribed under section 34 of this Ordinance, the confiscation and sale of any stock in respect of which an offence against any rules duly made under this paragraph has been committed, and, in the discretion 15 of the court to order that the proceeds of sale or any portion thereof be paid to the person appearing to the court to be the owner of such stock

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

For some time past it has been realized that the keeping of stock in townships has contributed to the spread of disease among cattle

This Bill will amend the Townships Ordinance so as to enable rules to be made thereunder prohibiting of regulating the keeping of stock or of any particular class of stock in a township, and for enabling a court to order any stock in respect of which an offence has been committed under such rules to be confiscated and sold, and for the proceeds of sale or part of them to be paid, at the discretion of the court, to the owner of the stock

It is not expected that there will be any additional expenditure of public moneys incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill amends the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1947, by varying the duties on many of the articles specified in the Schedule to the Ordinance In effecting these amendments the Bill implements the recommendations of a Committee appointed to investigate anomalies in the Customs Tariff

The most important respects in which the Tariff has been amended are effected by the following paragraphs of Clause 2 of the Bill—

(a) paragraph (11) whereby mining corduroy and wool tops for fibre-squeezing presses have been included under Item 37 as duty free imports,

- (b) paragraph (12) whereby the duty under Item 38 on second-hand clothing and apparel, not elsewhere enumerated in the Tariff, imported for sale, is reduced from 60% to 22%,
- (c) paragraph (15) whereby cotton thread for sewing sacks and bags and cotton twine for making or repairing fishing lines and fishing nets and netting have been included under Item 44 as duty free imports,
- (d) paragraph (19) whereby baby carriages, bath chairs and similar carriages have been included under Item 50 and admitted duty free,
- (e) paragraph (25) whereby Item 62 is amended so as to include among the vehicles admitted duty free all lorries, irrespective of the carrying capacity thereof, and vehicles primarily designed for use in connexion with agriculture, forestry, mining or other local industries,
- (f) paragraph (26) whereby the articles enumerated in Item 66, namely pickaxes, crowbars, shovels, earth-pans, axes and hatchets are admitted duty free instead of upon payment of duty at 10 per cent ad valorem,
- (g) paragraph (61) whereby—
 - (1) a new Item 173 is added providing for the duty free importation of articles imported by or on behalf of the British Council for its official and public use or for donation to any institution approved by the Governor,
 - (11) a new Item 174 is added which incorporates the duty free articles hitherto included in Item 60 (deleted by paragraph (24) of Clause 2) and in addition includes warning signs and street-lighting equipment. Under Item 60 signs were only admitted duty free if made of metal. Under the new item signs of the type specified will be admitted duty free of whatever they are made.

The provisions of this Bill if enacted will not entail any additional expenditure of public funds but will result in some loss of revenue




