ORDINANCE FOR THE SETTLEMENT OF SECURITIES FOR THE BRITISH AND AMERICAN ZONES OF GERMANY

THE following is published for general information —

- 1 The Foreign Office (German Section) has announced that German Economic Council Ordinance No 155, an ordinance for the settlement of Securities, becomes effective on 1st October 1949
- 2 This ordinance has been issued to deal with the state of affairs which has arisen out of hostilities and post war conditions in Germany and which causes prejudice to the rights of holders of German securities of all kinds expressed in German currency

A very large proportion of these securities was destroyed looted or lost in other ways, particularly during the fighting in Berlin, others are still in blocked Depot in the Soviet Zone or Sector As a result of this, rightful owners in Germany and abroad cannot exercise their rights. Moreover, the marketability of securities still in the possession of those rightful owners is prejudiced by the existence of a large number of securities which are offered for sale by wrongful possessors

- 4 The present Ordinance applies only to securities expressed in German currency which were issued up to 8th May, 1945 by an enterprise whose scat was within the British and American Zones on 1st October 1949
 - 5 The objects of the Ordinance are—
 - (a) to confirm the validity of securities now deposited in the three Western Zones whose nightful owners can readily be established Holders of such securities who are resident outside Germany should in their own interests apply under Article 2 (2) of the Ordinance for Certificates of Negotiability through the German bank in which the securities are deposited. The time limit for applications under Article 2 (2) is 31st January, 1950
 - (b) to investigate the validity of securities which are deposited outside Germany and, where this is established, to approve the ssue of a certificate of negotiability
 - (c) to investigate the validity of claims in all other cases e.g., where the security is lost or not available, with the ultimate object of issuing a new document of title in place of the old

ADMISSION TO UNIVERSITIES COLLEGES OR OTHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS N THE UNITED KINGDOM, 1950–1951

ALTHOUGH it is anticipated that the pressure upon the universities and colleges in the United Krigdom will be omewhat less in 1950/51 than it has been in recent years, it is not expected that there will necessarily be any increase in the numbers of places available for colonial tudents. Most universities have a fixed limit for the number of overseas students (which includes colonial students) whom they are prepared to admit each year. Moreover and especially in the case of the older universities, there is a desire to cut down the over-all number of the student body in the iniversity. Post was expansion which was necessary to make good the time lost during the war, brought many difficulties with it and the authorities are arxious to return to more normal conditions as soon as they can

Every effort will be made to secure as many vacancies as possible for colonial students but, if the best use is to be made of the places offered, it is essential that the Director of Colonial Scholars should be furnished at the earliest possible moment with full particulars of ad students, whether private or Govern ment scholars who are to cone forward for higher education in the United Kingdom for the session 1950/51. It is, therefore, necessary that ail applications for admission in October, 1950, should be made on the appropriate forms to the Hon Director of Eucation, PO Box 340, Nariobi, so as to teach him not later than 30th November 1949. The forms are obtainable from the Director of Education, and from the Senior Education Officers it Mombasa Nyeri Nakuru and Kisumu Students should not write direct to the Director of Colonial Scholars. In no case can the latter consider late applications. Students who were unaccessful in obtaining admission in 1949 or carlier years, should resubant then applications to the Duector of I ducation if they wish to be considered for any possible vacancies in 1950
