THE MARKETING OF NATIVE PRODUCE ORDINANCE
EXCLUSIVE TRADING LICENCE

WHEREAS the Governor in Council by Order in Government Notice No 574 of the 3rd day of July, 1937, declared certain areas to be areas in which the purchase and sale of tobacco leaf shall be controlled and regulated

And whereas the Legislative Council signified by Resolution on the 9th day of August, 1949, its approval to the Governor in Council granting an exclusive trading licence in respect of the produce of tobacco leaf within the said declared areas, that is to say—

- (a) those portions of the Embu, Fort Hall and South Nyeri Districts forming part of the native reserves within a radius of 25 miles from Sagana,
- (b) that portion of the Kitui District within a radius of 25 miles from Kitui

And whereas the Governor in Council by notice in Government Notice No 879 of the 5th day of September, 1949, notified his intention of granting the said exclusive trading licence in respect of the aforesaid areas

Now be it known that the Governor in Council in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 6 of the Marketing of Native Produce Ordinance, 1935, hereby grants to the British-American Tobacco Company, Ltd (hereinafter known as the licensee) an exclusive trading licence for a period of seven years commencing on the 17th day of December, 1949, in respect of the purchase of tobacco leaf within the said declared areas subject to each and every of the following conditions —

The licensee shall during the period of this licence and any renewal thereof—

- (1) employ such European staff as shall in the opinion of the Director of Agriculture be adequate to carry out efficiently the conditions hereinafter mentioned,
- (2) furnish, free of charge, to native growers of the types of tobacco selected by the licensee, and in the locations selected by the licensee within the areas hereinbefore mentioned, sound seed or seedlings for the growing of the leaf,
- (3) advise, free of charge, all such native growers in the selection and preparation of soil for the purpose of growing tobacco leaf, in the transplanting, cultivation and harvesting of the crop, and generally in assisting such native growers to cultivate the crop to a successful maturity,
- (4) provide to the satisfaction of the Director of Agriculture a sufficient number of flue-curing barns to deal with all the tobacco leaf produced by such native growers. Such barns shall be so situated as to ensure to the satisfaction of the Director of Agriculture that no grower shall be required, in order to sell his tobacco leaf, to transport his tobacco leaf to an unreasonable distance,
- (5) purchase from all native growers all tobacco leaf grown and harvested by such native growers under the direction of the licensee in the areas hereinbefore mentioned

Provided that the licensee may refuse to purchase tobacco leaf from any native grower who has—

- (a) planted and grown any tobacco on his holding from seed or seedlings other than seed or seedlings issued to him by the licensee or by the Agricultural Department of the Government of the Colony,
 - (b) collected seed from any tobacco grown on his holding,
- (6) pay for all tobacco leaf purchased by the licensee from all native producers in the areas hereinbefore mentioned such prices as may from time to time be fixed by the Director of Agriculture after consultation with the licensee

Provided that in the event of the licensee and the Director of Agriculture being unable to agree upon the price to be paid to the native producer, the matter shall be referred to the Governor, whose decision shall be final

Provided further that inferior leaf which, in the opinion of the licensee and the Agricultural Officer in the areas concerned, is unsuitable for the purpose of flue-curing, and flue-cured leaf which is unsuitable for the purpose of manufacture, shall not fall within the terms of the licence,

- (7) develop the said declared areas to the satisfaction of the Director of Agriculture

This licence is issued without payment of any fee

The duties of the posts involve a considerable amount of travelling, and applicants should be energetic with a high standard of physical fitness Essential qualifications are fact, a thorough knowledge of colloquial Swahili, and an ability to obtain the confidence of and instil discipline into subordinate staff Applicants should give details of any special qualifications All other things being equal, priority will be given to applicants possessing a knowledge of hunting dangerous African game and their habits, and a sufficient knowledge of mechanical transport, such as the carrying out of field maintenance and emergency repairs

Terms and conditions of service for the appointment to the pensionable post are as follows —

(a) For applicants not in Government service appointment on probation for two years before admission to the permanent and pensionable establishment

(b) Eighteen days' local leave per annum and vacation leave at the rate of 4½ days for each completed month of residential service after 48 months tour

(c) Free passages to the United Kingdom for the officer (and for his wife if he is married) after the completion of a tour of service and return passages on returning for further service in the case of a married officer with dependent children under 21, passages for himself and his family are provided up to the cost of three adult passages or the actual cost of the passages, whichever is the less
