A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A COMMISSION TO PURCHASE CATTLE AND SMALLSTOCK AND TO ACQUIRE, ESTABLISH AND OPERATE ABATTOIRS, FACTORIES AND REFRIGERATING WORKS FOR THE PURPOSE OF SLAUGHTERING SMALLSTOCK, **PROCESSING** AND HIDES AND BY-PRODUCTS AND CHILLING. FREEZING, CANNING AND STORING BEEF, MUTTON, POULTRY AND OTHER MEAT FOODS FOR EXPORT OR FOR CONSUMPTION WITHIN THE COLONY AND TO CONFER CERTAIN EXCLUSIVE RIGHTS UPON THE SAID COMMIS-SION, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES INCIDENTAL THERETO AND CONNECTED THEREWITH

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Kenya Meat Commission Ordinance, 1949

Interpretation

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

"the Commission" means the Kenya Meat Commission 5 established under this Ordinance,

"livestock" includes slaughter stock and smallstock",

"Member" means the Member of the Executive Council of the Colony for the time being responsible for Agriculture and Natural Resources,

"native areas" means—

(a) the native lands, the native reserves, the temporary native reserves, the native leasehold areas and the native settlement areas within the meaning of the Native Lands Trust Ordinance, 1938,

No 28 of 1938

- (b) the Northern Frontier District, and
- (c) the Turkana District,

"poultry" means fowls, cnickens, geese, ducks, turkeys, guinea-fowls and game birds,

"slaughter stock" means all cattle and smallstock other 20 than male and female breeding stock and trained or working trek oxen but includes cattle or small stock culled from any of the above-mentioned exempted categories,

"smallstock" means sheep, goats, hates rabbits and poultry,

"trek oxen' means cattle used, or kept for use, for working or hauling purposes

Establishment of Commission

- 3. (1) There shall be established a Commission to be known as the Kenya Meat Commission which shall consist of a Chamman and seven members to be appointed by the Governor 30 in Courcil after consultation with the interests concerned
- (2) The Chairman and members of the Commission other than *ex-officio* members shall hold office for four years but shall be eligible for re-appointment

- (3) Any member of the Commission, other than an exofficio member, may at any time resign his office by notice in writing addressed to the Chairman, who shall forthwith cause it to be forwarded to the Member and from the date of the 5 receipt of such notice by the Chairman such member shall cease to be a member of the Commission
 - (4) The office of a member of the Commission shall be vacated-
- (a) if he dies or becomes bankrupt or if his estate is seques-10 tered or assigned,
 - (b) if he is absent from the Colony without leave for more than three months or is absent without leave from three consecutive meetings of the Commission,
 - (c) if he resigns,
- *15* (d) if he becomes physically or mentally incapable of peiforming his duties as a member,
 - (e) if he is concerned in, or participates in, the profits of any contract with, or work done for, the Commission other wise than as a member of the Commission
- 20 Provided that the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any contract with, or work done for, the Commission which is entered into or done in the ordinary course of the business of the Commission and in which the member receives no preferential 25 treatment over or more advantageous terms than other members of the public
- (5) The Member may appoint any person to act in the place of the Chairman or any other member of the Commission in case of the absence or inability to act of the Chairman or 30 other member
- (6) Members of the Commission other than ex-officio members may be paid out of the funds of the Commission such remaneration for their services as may from time to time be authorized by the Member, and all members of the Commission 35 may be paid out of such funds their reasonable expenses for travelling and subsistence while engaged upon the business of the Commission
 - (7) The appointment of any member of the Commission shall be notified in the Gazette
- *40* 4. (1) The Commission shall be a body corporate having Incorporation perpetual succession and a common seal and shall have all the of Commission powers conferred by this Ordinance

- (2) The seal of the Commission shall be authenticated by the signature of the Chairman, or one member of the Commis-45 sion authorized to act in that behalf and the Secretary to the Commission and such seal shall be officially and judicially noticed
- (3) All documents other than those required by law to be under seal, made by and all decisions of ,the Commission may 50 be signified under the hand of the Chairman, any member of the Commission authorized in that behalf, or the Secretary of the Commission
 - (4) The Commission may sue and be sued in its corporate name and may for all purposes be described by such name
- *55* 5. (1) The Commission shall meet at such times as may Procedure and be necessary or expedient for the transaction of the business meetings of Commission of the Commission, and such meetings shall be held at such place and time and on such days as the Commission may determine

- (2) The Chairman may at any time call a special meeting of the Commission and shall call a special meeting within fourteen days of a requisition for that purpose addressed to him by any member of the Commission
- (3) The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Commission at which he is present, and in case of his temporary absence the members present and constituting a quoium shall elect a Chairman from among their number
 - (4) A quorum of the Commission shall be four
- (5) The decisions of the Commission shall be by a majority 10 of votes and, in addition to an original vote, in any case in which the voting is equal, the Chairman shall have a casting vote
- (6) Minutes in proper form of each meeting of the Commission shall be kept by the Secretary and shall be confirmed ¹⁵ by the Chairman at the next succeeding meeting
- (7) The powers of the Commission shall not be affected by any vacancy in the membership thereof nor by the fact that it is afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment or qualifications of a person purporting to be a 20 member of the Commission
- (8) Subject to the provisions of this section the Commission shall have power to regulate its own proceedings and may delegate to any committee the power and authority to carry out on behalf of the Commission such duties as may be determined 25
- (9) The Chairman of the Commission may at any time and place convene a meeting of any committee to which any duties of the Commission have been delegated under sub-section (8) of this section
- (10) The procedure at meetings of any committee of the 30 Commission shall be as nearly as may be the same as the procedure at meetings of the Commission

Power to appoint General Manager, officers and servants

- 6. (1) The Commission may, with the approval of the Member, appoint a General Manager of the undertakings of the Commission whose remuneration and terms and conditions 35 of employment shall be subject to the approval of the Governor in Council
- (2) The Commission may employ such officers and servants as it may deem requisite and may dismiss any officer or servant so employed
- (3) The Commission may, subject to the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section, pay to any person in its employ such salary, wages or other remuneration as it may think fit, and may pay bonuses and the like to any such person, and may grant to any such person such leave as it may think fit, and may 45 establish and make contributions to a pension or superannuation fund and a medical aid fund for its employees

Commission to have certain exclusive rights subject to conditions

- 7. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance no person, other than the Commission, shall—
 - (a) elect, establish or operate any abattoir, factory or 50 refrigerating work for the purpose of slaughtering cattle and smallstock, processing hides and byproducts, and chilling, freezing, canning or storing beef, mutton, poultry or other meat foods either for export or for consumption within the Colony except 55 under and in accordance with a Leence which may be granted by the Member, after consultation with the Commission, subject to such terms and conditions as the Member may impose,

- (b) export or supply to ships in the port of Mombasa fresh, chilled, frozen or canned beef, mutton, poultry or other meat foods except under and in accordance with a licence granted by the Commission subject to such terms and conditions as the Commission may impose
- (2) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to preclude any person who, immediately prior to the commencement of this Ordinance was carrying on any trade or business mentioned in this section, from continuing to carry on such trade or busi-10 ness

Provided that no such trade or business shall be expanded beyond the capacity of the plant and machinery used in connexion with such trade or business immediately prior to the commencement of this Ordinance except under and in accord-15 ance with a licence granted by the Member after consultation with the Commission and such licence may be subject to such terms and conditions as the Member may think fit to impose

8. (1) In addition to any other powers conferred by this Powers of Ordinance the Commission shall have power—

- *20* (a) to acquire, erect, constituct, establish and maintain abattoirs, factories, ice and referigerating works and to operate the same for the purpose of slaughtering cattle and smallstock processing hides and byproducts and chilling, freezing, canning and storing 25 beef, mutton, poultry and other meat foods and products, whether for export or for consumption within the Colony,
 - (b) to carry on the business, on a wholesale basis, of butchers and dealers in livestock and the carcasses, fresh products, hides and offals thereof and in poultry, ice and any other chilled, frozen or fresh foods, and of hide and skin merchants manufacturers and general dealers, and to enter into any contracts for the purchase, sale and supply of, and to purchase, sell and supply any such things as aforesaid by wholesale,
 - (c) to carry on the business of importers and exporters of live cattle, sheep, goats and poultry, and to import and export carcasses of cattle, sheep, goats and poultry whether in a frozen state or otherwise,
 - (d) to make contracts and give and enter into suretyships or guarantees in connexion with any part or portion of the business or objects of the Commission, and to modify or rescind the same,
- 45 (e) to enter into, renew cancel or abandon any arrangements with any government or authority, local or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the Commission's objects, and to obtain from any such government or authority, any rights, privileges and 50 concessions which the Commission may think it desirable to obtain, and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions,
 - (f) to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any property, movable or immovable, and any rights or privileges which the Commission may think necessary or convenient with reference to any of its objects, or the acquisition of which may seem calculated to facilitate the realization of any securities held by the Commission, or to prevent or diminish any apprehended loss or liability,
 - (g) subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, to invest and deal with any moneys of the Commis-

- sion not immediately required by the Commission in and upon such investments and securities as are allowed by law for the investment of trust funds and in such manner as the Commission may think fit, and from time to time to vary or realize such investments, 5
- (h) with the prior approval of the Member, to raise moneys by way of loan in such amounts, by such methods and for such purposes as the Member may approve, and to redeem the same,
- (1) to draw, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue 10 bills of exchange, promissory notes, bills of lading, warrants and other negotiable or transferable instruments or securities,
- (j) to construct, maintain, alter and improve any building, work, machinery and plant necessary or convenient 15 for the purposes of its business,
- (k) to carry on the business of warehousemen, to acquire or construct bonded or other warehouse or stores, and to control, work manage, let or dispose of the same or any part thereof
- (1) to work or otherwise beneficially use, and with the sanction of the Member to exchange, let, sell or hypothecate any of the property rights, privileges, machinery or plant of the Commission acquired or constructed for use in connexion with the powers 25 hereby conferred,
- (m) to advise the Member as to the prices which should be guaranteed by the Member for any class of slaughter stock,
- (n) to acquire, lease maintain and develop land required 30 by the Commission for holding and ranching cattle and smallstock,
- (o) to do all lawful things incidental or conducive to the exercise or enjoyment of the rights, interests and powers conferred upon it by this Ordinance
- (2) Every decision or action made or taken by the Commission in the exercise of the powers conferred upon it by this Ordinance which relates to either of the following matters shall only be made or taken subject to the approval of the Member—
 - (a) the construction or acquisition of any major buildings, 40 works, machinery or plant,
 - (b) the extension of its business into any new area or any new undertaking
- (3) The prices to be paid by the Commission for slaughter stock, other than slaughter stock purchased by the Commission 45 at public auction, and the wholesale prices to be paid by the Commission, shall be fixed by the Member with the advice of the Commission only after approval of the Governor in Council
- (4) The Commission may from time to time, with the 50 approval of the Member, delegate to its General Manager, either generally or specially, such powers as to it may seem necessary or convenient

Exclusive privileges of the Commission

9. (1) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Commission shall have the sole and exclusive right to purchase 55 slaughter stock and to retain, sell or otherwise deal with any slaughter stock so purchased and with any products derived from any such slaughter stock including the hides, skins and offals in any manner which the Commission thinks fit, and, in the exercise of any such right, the Commission may sell such 60 slaughter stock either alive or dead, and may sell the products thereof either whole or in portions, and may sell certain por-

tions and retain other portions and either as fresh, frozen, chilled or processed products, and may sell or retain or otherwise dispose of the hides and offals either together with or separately from any other products or portions thereof

- (2) Notwithstanding the provisons of sub-section (1) of this section, the Commission may, by a permit in writing, authorize any person to exercise any of the powers conferred on the Commission by sub-section (1) of this section subject to such terms and conditions as may be specified in such 10 permit
 - (3) Except as provided in sub-section (2) of this section, no person, other than the Commission, shall purchase any slaughter stock and no person shall sell slaughter stock to any person other than the Commission
- 15 Provided that nothing in this section shall be deemed to prohibit the sale by a native to a native in the same district within any native area of any slaughter stock
- 10. (1) No person, residing outside a native area, other Restriction on than the Commission, shall purchase the fresh products of purchase of fresh products 20 slaughter stock except from—

purchase of of slaughter stock

- (a) a wholesale or retail butcher who carries on business outside a native area, or
- (b) a person in possession of a permit in writing from the Commission authorizing the sale of such fresh products
- (2) No person other than the Commission shall, except with permission in writing from the Commission, remove the fresh products of any slaughter stock from any district in a native area to any place outside such native area
- *30* In this sub-section "fresh products of slaughter stock" shall not be deemed to include the hides and skins thereof
- (3) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of Penalty this section shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand shillings or to imprisonment 35 not exceeding three months of to both such fine and imprisonment

11. In addition to the power to raise moneys by way of Treasury loan, the Commission may obtain by way of advance from the Treasury, and the Treasury may out of moneys voted by the 40 Legislative Council for the purpose, advance to the Commission moneys sufficient to enable the Commission to carry out any of its powers, duties and functions The moneys so advanced and the interest thereon shall be a liability of the Commission and shall be a first charge on the property, assets, revenues and 45 reserve and stabilization funds of the Commission (but not upon the property and assets of any pension superannuation or medical aid fund created under section 6 of this Ordinance) and shall be repayable according to the terms of such advance

12. (1) The Commission shall open a banking account or Banking 50 banking accounts into which all moneys received by the Com- accounts and mission shall be paid in the first instance and out of which all stabilization payments made by the Commission shall be made

reserve and

- (2) The Commission may, with the approval or at the request of the Member establish a reserve fund or a stabiliza-55 tion fund or both such funds, and shall set aside annually towards such reserve fund and such stabilization fund such sums as the Member may annually approve
 - (3) The reserve fund shall be utilized when required for the renewal of machinery and the replacement of obsolete machinery or plant, for the improvement of the plant owned

by the Commission or with the sanction of the Member for emergency, but shall not be utilized for ordinary maintenance or operating expenses

- (4) The stabilization fund shall be utilized by the Commission for either or both of the following purposes—
 - (a) to meet any losses due to decreased operations or temporary stoppage of work,
 - (b) to stabilize the price of meat and other products dealt with by the Commission

Surplus profits

13. If in any year, the operations of the Commission 10 result in a surplus after all expenses and charges have been met and provision for payment to the reserve and stabilization funds (if any), has been made the Commission may, with the approval of the Member, pay such part of the surplus as it thinks fit to the suppliers of slaughter stock in the form of a supplementary payment on the slaughter stock supplied by them to the Commission, or may, with the approval of the Member, apply a portion of such surplus to the general betterment of any section of the livestock industry. Any surplus not disposed of pursuant to the provisions of this section and not otherwise 20 appropriated shall be carried forward in the revenue and expenditure account for appropriation in succeeding years

Accounts

14. The Commission shall cause to be kept proper books of account and other books in relation thereto and to all its undertakings, works and property, and shall prepare yearly 25 balance sheets made up to the thirty-first day of December in each year, showing in detail the assets and liabilities, revenue and expenditure of the Commission

Audit

- 15. (1) The member shall appoint one or more persons who publicly practise the profession of accountants (hereinafter 30 referred to as the auditors) to examine the accounts of the Commission. The Commission shall produce and lay before the auditors all books and accounts of the Commission, with all vouchers in support thereof, and all books, papers and writings in its possession or control relating thereto, and the 35 auditors shall be entitled to require from all members and employees of the Commission such information and explanation as may be necessary for the performance of their duties as auditors. The expenses of and incidental to the audit shall be borne and paid by the Commission
- (2) It shall be the duty of the auditors in addition to the ordinary duties of auditors, to certify not less than once in every year whether or not—
 - (a) the accounts of the Commission are in order,
 - (b) the accounts issued present a true and correct view of 45 the financial position of the Commission and of their transactions and of the result of trading,
 - (c) the moneys borrowed are reasonable in amount and are fully covered by the assets of the Commission,
 - (d) the value of the assets of the Commission has been 50 correctly stated,
 - (e) the sums credited to any reserve and stabilization funds are reasonable and sufficient, and
 - (f) all their requirements and recommendations as auditors have been complied with and carried out
- (3) A copy of every certificate given by the auditors pursuant to this section and of any report made by the auditors shall be sent by the auditors to the Director of Audit The auditors shall furnish to the Director of Audit such further reports and such further information as he may request

16. The Director of Audit may at any time examine the Powers of accounts of the Commission The Commission shall produce Audit and lay before the Director of Audit, all books and accounts thereof and all books, papers and writings in its possession or 5 control relating thereto, and the Director of Audit shall be entitled to require from all members and employees of the Commission such information and explanation as he may consider necessary

- 17. (1) The Commission shall on or before the thirty-first 10 day of March in each year, furnish to the Member a report upon its work during the year ended the thirty-first day of December last preceding, and such report shall include a balance sheet and a complete statement of revenue and expenditure duly audited, and the certificate given by the auditors 15 under sub-section (2) of section 15 of this Ordinance, and the report of the auditors
- (2) Every report furnished under sub-section (1) of this section shall be laid by the Member upon the table of the Legislative Council as soon as possible after it has been fur-20 nished to him
- 18. The Commission may make rules for the good Rules government and conduct of the business of the Commission, the appointment, pay, superannuation and conditions of service of its employees, and any other matters necessary or convenient 25 to be provided for carrying on its business

19. The Member may, with the advice of the Commis- Regulations sion, make regulations generally for better carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance and for prescribing anything required to be prescribed by this Ordinance

20. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to apply Saving of pig to the pig industry or to authorize or enable the Commission to trade or otherwise deal in pigs or pig products

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to establish a statutory corporation to be called the Kenya Meat Commission which will take over the functions of the present Meat Marketing Board and will exercise certain additional powers

The Commission is to consist of eight members, including a Chairman, and will be appointed by the Governor in Council This clause has of design been widely drawn in the Bill The Bill creates what is in effect an important statutory monopoly for disposing of very large numbers of African-owned and European-owned cattle It is, therefore, considered advisable that at least four members of the Commission should be stock owners or representatives of stock owners It is essential however that the body charged with the exercise of the wide powers conferred by the Bill and the responsibility for administering important sums of money should be composed not only of persons with an intimate knowledge of the stock industry, but also of persons with sound commercial and business training Such a composition of the Commission will command the confidence of the general public as possessing both the technical and the business experience necessary to ensure the commercial success of the undertaking Government will therefore welcome an expression by the Legislature during the passage of the Bill in the Council as to the precise composition at which the proposed Commission should aim

Clauses 3 and 4 deal with the establishment, incorporation and membership of the proposed Commission

Clause 5 deals with the procedure to be followed at its meetings Clause 6 empowers the Commission to employ and pay a General Manager and such officers and servants as it may deem requisite

Clause 7 is important as it prohibits any person other than the Commission from erecting, establishing or operating any abattoir, factory or refrigerating works for the purpose of slaughtering cattle and smallstock, processing hides and by-products and chilling, freezing or canning or storing meat except under licence to be granted by the Member after consultation with the Commission There is a similar prohibition against the export of meat by any person other than the Commission except in accordance with a licence. There is a saving of the rights of persons who, immediately prior to the commencement of the Ordinance were carrying on any trade or business mentioned in the clause provided they may not expand the capacity of such trade or business without a licence granted by the Member after consultation with the Commission

Clause 8 is also of importance In this clause the powers of the Commission are set out These include power—

- (a) to acquire, erect, construct, establish and maintain abattoirs, factories, ice and refrigerating works and to operate the same for the purpose of slaughtering cattle and smallstock, processing hides and by-products and chilling, freezing, canning and storing beef, mutton, poultry and other meat foods and products, whether for export or for consumption within the Colony,
- (b) to carry on the business, on a wholesale basis, of butchers and dealers in livestock and the carcasses and fresh products and the hides and offals thereof, and in poultry, ice and any other chilled, frozen or fresh foods

The Commission is also empowered to carry on business as importers and exporters of live cattle, sheep, goats and poultry, and has powers to purchase lease, hire or otherwise acquire property, movable or immovable, and to invest and deal with the moneys of the Commission Lending powers, exercisable with the prior consent of the Member are also conferred by this clause, and powers, with the consent of the Member to exchange, let, sell or hypothecate any of the property of the Commission. The Commission will have power to acquire, lease, maintain and develop land required by the Commission for holding and ranching cattle and smallstock. The prior consent of the Member is required for the construction or acquisition of major buildings, works or plant or for the extension of its business into any new area or any new undertaking.

The pieces to be paid by the Commission for slaughter stock, other than slaughter stock purchased by the Commission at public auction, a d the wholesale pieces to be charged by the Commission, are to be fixed by the Member, with the advice of the Commission, and approved by the Governor in Council

The Commission is empowered to delegate, with the approval of the Member, certain powers to its General Manager

Clause 9 will confer on the Commission the necessary exclusive rights to purchase, sell and dispose of slaughter stock and the fresh products thereof including the hides, skins and offals

Clause 10 prohibits any person, other than the Commission, who does not reside in the native areas from purchasing fresh products or slaughter stock except from—

- (a) a wholesale or retail butcher who carries on business outside the native area, or
- (b) a person in possession of a permit in writing from the Commission authorizing the sale of such fresh products

This provision reproduces the provisions of the existing law in relation to the Meat Marketing Board A penalty is provided for contravention of this section

Clause 11 empowers the Commission to obtain Treasury advances and clauses 12 and 13 deal respectively with the banking account to be kept by the Commission and with the disposal of any surplus profits With the approval of the Member, part of such surplus profits may be paid to the suppliers of slaughter stock in the form of a special payment on the slaughter stock supplied or may, with the approval of the Member, be applied to the general betterment of any section of the livestock industry

Clauses 14 and 15 deal respectively with the accounts of the Commission and the auditing of such accounts

Clause 16 empowers the Director of Audit, at any time to examine the accounts of the Commission, and

Clause 17 imposes on the Commission an obligation to report to the Member each year upon its work during the preceding year

Clauses 18 and 19 permit rules and regulations to be made and clause 20 saves the position of the pig industry and provides that nothing in the Ordinance is to be deemed to apply to the pig industry or to enable the Commission to trade or otherwise deal in pigs

If the provisions of this Bill become law, it is expected that expenditure of approximately £400,000 will be required probably by way of loan but the method of financing this expenditure has not yet been decided

- 6 Grants will be made under the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap 140 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance The term of the grants will be 99 years from the 1st day of February, 1950
- 7 At no time during the term of the giant shall more than one dwelling-house with necessary offices and outbuildings be ejected on the plot without the consent of the Government
 - 8 The plot shall be used for residential purpose, only
- 9 The grantee shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any building or buildings to cover more than 50 per cent of the area of the plot
 - 10 The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot
- 11 Any building elected thereon shall conform to a building line decided upon by the local authority
- 12 The grantee shall not sell or transfer the plot nor enter into any mortgage charge (other than with the consent of the Commissioner of Lands for the raising of a loan for building purposes) or agreement for sale in respect thereof within ten years of the date of the commencement of the term
- 13 Subject to condition No 12 the grantee shall not at any time curing the continuance of the term assign, mortgage sublet or part with possession of the plot or any part thereof or any building thereon save with the prior approval in writing of the Commissioner of Lands
- 14 All outbuildings, offices etc, shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the local authority or such person as may be appointed for the purpose, and shall be kcp¹ so screened during the continuance of the grant

- 15 The Government of such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telegraph and telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned
- 16 The grantee shall pay such taxes, charges, duties assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or buildings ejected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the Government in lieu thereof
- 17 The acceptance of any plot shall be deemed to be upon and subject to the conditions herein contained and the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap 140 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and in particular Part VII thereof
