A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE MUNICIPALITIES ORDINANCE, 1928

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows—

Short title

No 19 of 1928

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Municipalities (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the Municipalities Ordinance, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance)

Insertion of a new section in the principal Ordinance

Power to make rules

- 2. There shall be inserted after section 42A of the principal Ordinance a new section numbered 42B as follows—
 - 42B (1) A Council may make rules relating generally to the establishment control, management, maintenance and contribution to any pension, provident or benevolent fund established under section 52 of this Ord-10 inance (in this section referred to as "the fund") and, without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power, such rules may—
 - (a) permit or require all or any of the officers or servants of a Council to become members of any 15 such fund,
 - (b) fix the amount of the contributions, if any, to be made by members of any such fund and the amount of the contributions to be made by the Council,
 - (c) provide for periodical valuation of any such fund and for enforcing any increase in the contributions thereto or any diminutions in the benefits arising therefrom as the valuation may show to be necessary to maintain the solvency of such 25 fund,
 - (d) prescribe the age at which any officer or servant of the Council may or shall become a member of any such fund and the age and conditions upon which any such officer or servant may or 30 shall retire from the service of the Council or cease to be a member of the fund,
 - (e) determine the amount of pension or other benefit to be paid to a member of any such fund or to his dependants or to his personal representative, 35
 - (f) provide for the management and investment of the moneys of any such fund and the election of a committee of management for that purpose,
 - (g) (1) provide for vesting the property, money and assets of any such fund in trustees for the pur-40 pose of the administration thereof in such manner as the committee of management may direct.
 - (11) permit a trustee, if a bank, to transact any business in connexion with any such fund on the 45 same terms as would be made with a customer in the ordinary course of business, without such trustee being liable to account for any profit or share of brokerage,

- (h) provide for the retirement, removal or resignation of a member of any committee of management or trustee and for filling any vacancy caused thereby,
- be capable of being assigned or transferred or otherwise ceded or of being pledged or hypothecated or of being attached or subjected to any form of execution under a udgment or order of a court of law, and in pursuance of any such rule a Council may withhold, suspend or entirely discontinue the payment of a pension in the event of the beneficiary attempting to assign transfer or otherwise cede or to pledge or hypothecate any pension or right as aforesaic,
 - (j) provide that any pension or other retiring benefit may be withheld by the Council for the purpose of discharging any debt due to the fund or to the Council,
 - (k) provide that if any person in receipt of any pension or other retiring beneft—
 - (1) is convicted by any court in His Majesty's Dominions and is seitenced to imprisonment without the option of a fine for a period exceeding one nonth,
 - (11) is adjudicated a bankr ipt or is declared insolvent by judgment of the court,
 - (111) becomes incapable of managing his own affairs by reason of physical or mental infirmity,

any such pension of retifing benefit may during any such incapacity, cease to be payable to the member and instead be paid to such of his dependants as the Council riay determine

• (2) A Council may agree with any other Council to establish a united pension, provider t or benevolent fund for the benefit of persons in the ser nce of such Council

Provided that--

- (i) every such united fund shall be established by separate resolutions passed by each of the Councils and approved by the Member and shall be subject to such rules as may be made under this section and adopted by each of the Councils concerned,
- (11) such rules shall provide for the management and investment of such united fund being vested in a joint board consisting of representatives both of the Councils which are members of the said fund and of the employees, and for the election of the members of such board,
- (111) the expenses of the administration of a united fund so established shall be defrayed by the Councils concerned in such proportions as may be agreed upon from time to time,
- (iv) any Council other than a Council concerned in the establishment of such united fund, may by resolution approved by the Member and subject to such terms as may be mutually agreed upon between the joint board and the Council, join in any united fund
- (3) A Council may agree with any other Council to admit 60 employees of such other Council to men bership of the fund or of a united fund
 - (4) All rules made under this section shall be subject to the approval of the Meniber

Amendment of section 52 of the principal Ordinance

3. Paragraph (19) of section 52 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for the words "Subject to the provisions of any by-laws made under sub-section (86) of section 69" the words "Subject to the provisions of rules made under section 42B"

Repeal of paragraph (86) of section 69 of the principal Ordinance 4. Paragraph (86) of section 69 of the principal Ordinance is repealed

Provided that such repeal shall not affect the validity of any by-laws in force at the commencement of this Ordinance which provide for the establishment, control, management, 10 maintenance of or contribution to any pension, provident or benevolent fund

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Municipalities Ordinance, 1928 (referred to as the principal Ordinance), at present provides for the management of any pension, provident or benevolent fund established under section 52 to be by bylaws made under section 69 It is considered undesirable that matters of a purely domestic nature affecting only the rights and interests of employees of a Council should be governed by by-laws

This Bill will accordingly amend the principal Ordinance by inserting a new section 42B whereby the Council, with the approval of the Member, will be enabled to make rules for the establishment and management of any pension, provident or benevolent fund (Clause 2)

Clause 3 makes a consequential amendment to paragraph (19) of section 52 whereby there is deleted a reference to by-laws under section 69 (86) and there is substituted a reference to rules made under the new section 42B

Clause 4 repeals paragraph (86) of section 69 but saves any by-laws now in force which provide for the establishment and management of any pension, provident or benevolent fund

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

67 (1) Subject to the provisions of sub-section (2) Liability of of this section, nothing in this Ordinance or in any licence for nuisance shall be construed as exonerating any licensee, operator or owner, as the case may be, from any liability for any nuisance caused or permitted by him

licensee, etc,

- (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section, the Governor may by order exonerate from liability for nuisance either wholly or to the extent specified in the order, any licensee operator or owner in respect of works carried on by or with the consent of such licensee, operator or owner pursuant to a licence granted under this Ordinance
- (3) An order under this section shall be in the Form in the Third Schedule to this Ordinance and shall not have effect until it has been published in the Gazette
- (4) An order under this section may be made to have retrospective effect
- (5) The provisions of section 125 of this Ordinance shall not apply to any application to the Governor for the making of an order under this section

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 67 of the Electric Power Ordinance (referred to as the principal Ordinance) expressly provides that nothing in the Ordinance shall exonerate a licensee from any complaint, action or other proceeding for a nuisance caused or permitted by him

This provision deprives a licensee under the Ordinance of the ordinary protection which the courts have held the legislature intends to confer when it authorizes the doing of something which will inevitably result in a nuisance and places upon such a licensee an unduly onerous burden

This Bill will, accordingly, amend section 67 of the principal Ordinance so as to enable the Governor by an order to be published in the Gazette, to exonerate a licensee, operator or owner from liability for nuisance, either wholly or to the extent specified in the order, in respect of any works carried on by him or with his consent Such orders may be made with retrospective effect

No expenditure of public moneys is expected to be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law
