A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE SPECIAL DISTRICTS (ADMINISTRATION) ORDINANCE, 1934

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

No 13 of 1934

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Special Districts (Administration) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the Special Districts (Administration) Ordinance 1934 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance)

Repeal and replacement of section 18 of the principal Ordinance
Passports to be carried while leaving areas

2. There shall be substituted for section 18 of the princ pal Ordinance the following section—

18 No tribesman shall leave any district or area to which this Ordinance has been applied or any area in 10 relation to which an order has been made under the provisions of paragraph (a) of section 16 of this Ordinance unless such tribesman is in possession of a valid passport or other document satisfactorily establishing his identity issued to him in such form and under such conditions as 15 the Provincial Commissioner may from time to time prescribe

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 18 of the Special Districts (Administration) Ordinance, 1934, prohibits a tribesman leaving any district or area to which the Ordinance has been applied unless he is in possession of a valid passport or other document satisfactorily establishing his identity. It has been brought to notice that when the Ordinance has been applied to an area comprising several districts in which tribes hostile to each other live the section does not prohibit movement within the area In the areas to which the principal Ordinance is applied inter-tribal feuds and grazing disputes are common and a member of a tribe traveling alone through another tribal area runs considerable risk of being assaulted and, not infrequently of being muidered The consequence of a murder in such an area is a serious blood feud, often with far reaching results. In the circumstances, it is considered desirable that section 18 should be amended so as to prohibit also any person leaving any area in respect of which an order under section 16 (a) has been made reserving for any particular tribesmen or community grazing or other areas of land or watering facilities Clause 2 of the Bill provides for this

It is not expected that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law
