A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDINANCE, 1948

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows

Short title

No 12 of 1948

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the Emergency Powers Ordinance, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance)

Insertion of new section 1A in the principal Ordinance

Interpretation

of 1950

No

2. There shall be inserted in the principal Ordinance ⁵ after section 1 thereof a new section 1A as follows—

1A In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

"essential service" means an essential service within the meaning of the Essential Services (Arbitration) 10 Ordinance, 1950,

"industrial conscription" means compulsory enrolment by name for work in industry,

"strike" means the cessation of work of a body of persons employed, acting in combination, or a concerted 15 refusal or a refusal under a common undertaking of any number of persons employed to continue to work for their employer in consequence of a trade dispute with their employer done as a means of compelling their employer to accept or not to accept or enforce terms or 20 conditions of or affecting employment, but does not include a strike in an essential service within the meaning of the Essential Services (Arbitration) Ordinance, 1950,

"trade dispute" means any dispute between employers and workmen or between workmen and 25 workmen, which is connected with the employment, or with the conditions of labour of any person

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Ordinance

- 3. Sub-section (1) of section 2 of the principal Ordinance is amended—
 - (a) by inserting after the words "Governor in Council" 30 the words "that an occasion of emergency or public danger has arisen or", and
 - (b) by adding after the words "state of emergency exists" the words "either throughout the Colony or in any part or parts thereof specified in a Schedule to the 35 Proclamation of Emergency, and may from time to time by notification in the Gazette add to or vary such Schedule"

Amendment of section 3 of the principal Ordinance

4. Section 3 of the principal Ordinance is amended—

(a) by substituting for the words "securing the essentials 40 of life to the community, and such Regulations may" in sub-section (1) thereof, the words "securing the public safety or interest and the essentials of life to the community, and such regulations may be applied to the whole or any part or parts of the Colony in 45 which a state of emergency has been declared to exist and may", and

- (b) by re-numbering sub-sections (2) (3), (4) and (5) thereof as sub-sections (3), (4), (5) and (6) respectively and by inserting a new sub-section (2) as follows—
 - (2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing power such regulations may be 5 made with regard to any of he matters coming within the classes of subjec s hereinafter mentioned, that is to say—
 - (a) control of harbour, ports, territorial waters, lights and movements of vessels, 10
 - (b) transportation by lan i, water or air, control of transport of persons and things, control of traffic by road or rail, allotment of priorities and control of telecommunications,
 - (c) production, supply and distribution of food, water, milk, fuel power, light petrol, oil and other necessities,
 - (d) trading, manufacture production, importation and exportation,
 - (e) appropriation, requisitioning, control, forfeiture and disposition of property movable or immovable and the use there of and assessment and payment of compensation therefor,
 - (f) conferring powers or public officers and others and delegation of powers,
 - (g) requiring persons to do work or render services and remunerating such persons,
 - (h) recovery of sums expended on emergency 30 services from any person for whose benefit the sums were expended,
 - (1) censorship and control and suppression or suspension of publications, writings, maps, plans, photographs, communica- 35 tions and means of communication,
 - (j) arrest, search, deten ion, restriction, deportation and security for good behaviour,
 - (k) control of firearms, arms and ammuni- 40 tion,
 - (1) protected areas and places,
 - (m) public meetings and processions, curfew, and
 - (n) maintenance of essential supplies and 45 services

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Emergency Powers Ordinance, 1948, 1, defective in that it—
(a) does not expressly provide for the powers conferred by it to
be used on occasions of emergency or public danger,

- (b) does not permit the making of a proc amation of emergency applying to a part only of the Colon, or permit emergency regulations to be applied only to a part of the Colony,
- (c) does not define "strike" or "indus rial conscription" or differentiate strikes in essential services,
- (d) does not sufficiently indicate the subjects in relation to which emergency regulation, may be made

The present Bill will remedy these deficiencies and bring the Ordinance more into line with similar legisla ion elsewhere

It is not possible to state whether any additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law


