**A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE PASSION FRUIT
ORDINANCE, 1937**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows —

Short title	1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Passion Fruit (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and construed
No 11 of 1937	as one with the Passion Fruit Ordinance, 1937 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance)
Amendment of section 7 of the principal Ordinance	2 Sub-section (2) of section 7 of the principal Ordinance ⁵ is amended by substituting for the words "in the second half of each calendar year" the words "in the first half of each year"

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

In the opinion of the Passion Fruit Board their operations can be more conveniently carried on if their financial year ends on the 31st December instead of on the 31st July. This has been effected by an amendment of the Passion Fruit Rules, 1947, and does not entail an amendment of the Ordinance.

In consequence however, of this change sub-section (2) of section 7 of the Ordinance which at present requires the Board to call a conference for the election of members of the Board in the second half of each calendar year will require to be amended so as to permit the election of members in the first half of each year, that is to say, within six months of the end of the Board's financial year.

This Bill will effect the necessary change.

It is not expected that there will be any additional expenditure of public moneys if the provisions of this Bill become law.

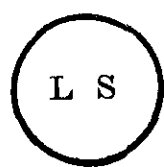

HOSPITAL RATE—TRANS NZOIA DISTRICT

THE District Council, under powers conferred upon it by section 101 of the District Councils Ordinance, intends at a meeting to be held in Council's office at Kitale on 22nd February, 1950, to impose a rate of Sh 30 per head on all adult males of wholly European origin or descent residing within the district

The proceeds of the rate will be used to service a loan which will be floated in order to provide funds for extending the existing hospital and providing such services as the needs of the district demand Any balance left over after servicing the loan will be devoted to such needs of the hospital as may arise from time to time
