VACANCIES IN TANGANYIKA TERRITORY

Apprentice Hide Improvement Officers

VACANCIES for Apprentice Hide Improvement Officers exist in the Veterinary Department, Tanganyika. These posts will be on the basis of a two-year apprenticeship with one year for tuition and one year for practical experience. Thereafter the apprentice may, subject to satisfactory report, be eligible for appointment to the post of Hide Improvement Officer in the permanent service. The post of apprentice carries a fixed salary of £360 a year. The post of Hide Improvement Officer in the permanent service carries a salary of £550 by £20 to £690 by £25 to £840. Local leave will be granted to an apprentice as laid down in the General Orders of the Territory, but vacation leave and passages to the United Kingdom will not be granted.
