A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE PROVISION FOR REGULATING AND CONTROLLING THE GROWING OF TEA AND FOR MATTERS INCIDENTAL THERETO AND CONNECTED THEREWITH

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Tea Ordinance,

Interpretation

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

the "Association" means the Kenya Tea Association,

the "Board" means the Tea Board established by section 3 of this Ordinance,

"licensee" means the holder of a planting licence issued under section 7 of this Ordinance,

"tea" means the plant known botanically as Camellia 10 Thea (Link) and includes its seed,

the "territories of East Africa" means the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, the Protectorate of Uganda and the Trust Territory of Tanganyika

Establishment of Board

- 3. (1) There is hereby established a Board to be known 15 as the Tea Board, which shall consist of—
 - (a) the Director of Agriculture or his representative,
 - (b) one member to be appointed by the Governor in Council,

- (c) five members to be appointed by the Association
- (2) The Board shall elect a Chairman annually from among its members
- (3) The members of the Board appointed pursuant to sub-section (1) (b) or sub-section (1) (c) of this section shall hold office for one year but shall be eligible for re-appointment 25
- (4) If any member appointed pursuant to sub-section (1) (b) or sub-section (1) (c) of this section dies, resigns, is absent from the Colony or is incapacitated by illness the

Governor in Council or the Association (as the case may be) may appoint some other person in the place of such member and a person so appointed shall hold office -

- (a) if he is appointed in the place of a member who dies or resigns, for the unexpired term of office of such member.
 - (b) if he is appointed in the place of a member who is absent from the Colony or incapacitated by illness, for the period of such absence o incapacity or for the unexpired term of office of such member, whichever period first terminates
- 4. (1) The Board shall be a body corporate having perpetual succession and a common seal and shall have power to purchase, hold, and dispose of, land and other property of 15 whatever kind for the purposes of this Ordinance

Incorporation

- (2) The seal of the Board shall be authenticated by the signature of the Chairman or one member of the Board authorized to act in that behalf, and the Secretary of the Board, and such seal shall be officially and judicially noticed
- 20 (3) All documents, other than those required by law to be under seal, made by, and all decisions of, the Board may be signified under the hand of the Chairman, any member of the Board authorized in that behalf or the Secretary of the Board
- 5. (1) The Board shall meet at such times and places as Procedure and may be necessary or expedient for the trai saction of business, Board and such meetings shall be held at such place and time and on such days as the Board may decide

- (2) The Chairman may at any time call a special meeting 30 of the Board and shall call a special meeting within seven days of a requisition for that purpose addressed to him by any two members of the Board
- (3) The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board at which he is present, and in case of his temporary 35 absence the members present and constituting a quorum shall elect a Chairman from among their number
 - (4) A quorum of the Board shall be three
- (5) The decisions of the Board shal be by the majority of votes and, in addition to an original vote, if the voting is 40 equal the Chairman shall have a casting vote
 - (6) Minutes in proper form of each meeting shall be kept by the Secretary and shall be confirmed by the Chairman at the next succeeding meeting
- (7) The Board may co-opt any person to attend any 45 particular meeting of the Board for the purpose of assisting or advising the Board, but no such co-opted person shall have any right to vote
- (8) The powers of the Board shall not be affected by any vacancy in the membership thereof, nor by the fact that it is 50 afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment or qualifications of a person purporting to be a member of the Board
- (9) Subject to the provisions of this section the Board shall have power to regulate its own proceedings, and may 65 delegate to any member or committee of members the power and authority to carry out on behalf of he Board such duties as may be determined
 - 6. The Board shall have power to nominate four Nomination of persons, who need not be members of the Board, to represent Board the Board the Board on any inter-territorial body which may, with the

concurrence of the Governments of the territories of East Africa, be set up for the co-ordination of matters relating to the tea industry

Licence to plant tea

- 7. (1) No person shall plant tea upon any land whereon tea is not, immediately prior to the commencement of this Ordinance, planted except under and in accordance with the terms and conditions of a licence (hereinafter referred to as a "planting licence") issued to him for the purpose by the Board
- (2) Every planting licence shall specify the acreage of ¹⁰ land on which tea may be planted pursuant to the licence The acreage so specified shall not include any land used as a tea nursery
- (3) Any licensee who plants tea on more land than the the acreage specified in the planting licence issued to him shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance

Applications for licences

8. Every application for a licence shall be made to the Board in writing in the prescribed form and containing the prescribed particulars

Provided, however, that the Board may in any particular ²⁰ case require the applicant to supply any further particulars which it may think fit

Planting licence may be cancelled

- 9. (1) If a licensee commits a breach of or fails to comply with any of the terms and conditions of a planting licence the Board may, in its discretion, cancel such licence or vary the ²⁵ terms and conditions thereof
- (2) Any licensee aggrieved by the cancellation of his licence by the Board under this section may appeal in writing within thirty days to the Governor in Council whose decision shall be final

Refusal to grant planting licence Appeal

- 10. (1) The Board may, in its discretion, refuse to grant a planting licence on any ground which may appear to the Board to be sufficient
- (2) Any person aggrieved by a refusal of the Board to grant a planting licence may appeal in writing within ninety 35 days from the date of such refusal to the Governor in Council whose decision shall be final
- 11. No licensee shall lend, transfer or assign his planting licence to any other person except with the prior permission of the Board which shall be duly endorsed on the licence 40

- 12. (1) Any person duly authorized in writing in that behalf by the Board may at all reasonable times enter upon any land and buildings occupied by a licensee and may make such inspection and inquiries as he thinks fit for ascertaining whether the provisions of this Ordinance and the terms and 45 conditions of the licence are being complied with
- (2) Any person who prevents, hinders or obstructs any person duly authorized as aforesaid in the exercise of the powers conferred by this section or who fails to give any information reasonably required by any such authorized 50 person shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance
- 13. (1) If any person is convicted of any offence against section 7 of this Ordinance the Board may by notice in writing require such person to uproot and remove any tea so planted within such reasonable time as the Board may specify in such 65 notice
- (2) If any person fails to comply with any requirement of the Board under this section, any person duly authorized in

Board may require licensee to remove tea planted without licence or in breach of licence 16

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that behalf by the Board may enter upon the lands occupied by such person and uproot any tea which the Board required to be uprooted and removed and the Bould may recover the cost of so doing from such person

- 14. (1) Subject to the provisions of sub-section (3) of Export permit this section no person shall export manufactured tea to any destination outside East Africa except under and in accordance with the terms and conditions of a permit in the prescribed form issued by the Board (hereinafter referred to 10 as an "export permit")
 - (2) Every application for an export permit shall contain such particulars and be in such form as may be prescribed
 - (3) Nothing in this section shall apply to—
 - (a) the export by parcel post in packages not exceeding two pounds in weight of manufictured tea,
 - (b) the export of packages containing samples of manufactured tea not exceeding eight ounces in weight, or
 - (c) the re-export of manufactured tea
- 15. The Board may in its discretion refuse to issue an Appeal against 20 export permit Any person aggrieved by a refusal of the Board Board's refusal to issue to issue an export permit may within thirty days from the date export permit of such refusal appeal in writing to the Governor in Council, whose decision shall be final

16. Every person who exports or attempts to export Penalty for 26 manufactured tea in breach of the provisions of sub-section (1) exporting or of section 14 of this Ordinance or of the erms and conditions export manuof an export permit shall be guilty of an offence against this factured tea Ordinance and, upon conviction, shall be liable to a fine not Ordinance exceeding ten thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a 30 term which may extend to twelve months or to both such fine and imprisonment and in addition the Court may, in its discretion, cancel any export permit issued to such person

- 17. (1) There shall be raised, levied, collected and paid Cess in respect of all tea manufactured in the Colony a cess 36 (hereinakter referred to as the "cess") at such a rate, which shall not exceed four shillings per huncred pounds or part thereof (net weight) of manufactured tea as the Governor in Council may, from time to time, fix by notice published in the Gazette
- 40 (2) There may, either in addition to or in lieu of the cess provided for by sub-section (1) of this section, be raised, levied, collected and paid an annual cess in respect of each acre of land on which tea has been plarted pursuant to any planting licence, at such rate, which shall not exceed four 45 shillings per acre, as the Governor in Council may, from time to time, fix by notice published in the Gizette
- (3) A cess imposed under sub-section (1) or (2) of this *section shall become effective at the expiration of two months from the date of the publication of the notice fixing it and 50 shall be paid by every person liable therefor in the manner and at the times prescribed
- 18. The Board may make such recommendations to the Board to Governor in Council as it may think fit as to the amount of recommend the cess and generally as to the measures necessary to protect cess 55 and promote the interests of the tea industry

19. The proceeds of the cess and any other moneys Proceeds of accruing to the Board shall be used for--

- (a) the remuneration of such staff as he Board may deem necessary,
- (b) the payment of travelling expenses and out of pocket expenses of members of the Foard, other than ex officio members, at rates to be approved by the Governoi in Council,

- by the Board or for which the Board may become liable in the course of its business,
- (d) making contributions to the finances of the Tea Research Institute of East Africa,
- (e) the benefit of the tea industry of the Colony in such manner as the Board may, with the approval of the Governor in Council think fit

Audit of accounts of the Board

20 The accounts of the Board shall be audited annually at the end of each year by ar auditor to be appointed by the 10 Governor and such accounts duly audited shall, as soon as may be after the end of each year, be published in the Gazette

Returns

21. Every licensee and every holder of an export permit under this Ordinance shall submit returns at such times, in such manner and containing such particulars as the Board 15 may from time to time require for the purposes of this Ordinance and any person who tails to make any such return when required by the Board so to do shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance

Export of tea seed

22. No person shall except with the permission in 20 writing of the Board, export any tea seed, or any living parts of tea used or capable of use for the propagation of tea, to any destination outside the territories of East Africa

Penalties

23. Every person guilty of any offence against this Ordinance, in respect of which no special penalty is otherwise 25 provided, shall be liable upon conviction to a fine of two thousand shillings or to imprisonment for three months or to both such fine and such imprisonment

Offences by a body corporate

24. Where any offence against this Ordinance is committed by a body corporate and such offence is committed 30 with the knowledge or approval of any director, manager, secretary or other officer of such body corporate both the body corporate and every such director, manager, secretary or other officer shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and may be proceeded against and punished accordingly

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Rules

- 25. (1) The Board may, with the approval of the Governor in Council, make rules generally for better carrying out the provisions of this Ordinance
- (2) Rules made under this section may, without prejudice to the generality of the power conferred by sub-section (1) of 40 this section provide for—
 - (a) regulating the collection, payment and utilization of the cess,
 - (b) the auditing of the accounts of the Board
 - (c) prohibiting, restricting or regulating the export of tea, 45
 - (d) prescribing anything required by this Ordinance to be prescribed,
 - (e) prescribing penalties for the breach of any rules made under this section

Procedure in appeals to Governor in Council

26. In every case in which under this Ordinance provision is made for an appeal to the Governor in Council the appellant and the Board may make any representations to the Governor in Council by way of a memorandum in writing but neither party shall be entitled to appear in person before the Governor in Council unless in any particular case the 65 Governor in Council otherwise directs

Saving

27. (1) Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to apply to the growing of tea by an African in the native areas

(2) For the purposes of this section "native areas" means the native lands, the native reserves the temporary native reserves, the native leasehold areas and the native settlement areas

28 The Tea Ordinance 1948, is repealed

Repeal No 52 of 1948

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The existing Tea Ordinance which was first enacted in 1934 and which, having as a result of an oversight, been allowed to expire in March, 1948, had to be re-enacted in that year, was designed to enable the restriction of the production of tea in accordance with an International Tea Restriction Scheme In 1946 k enva withdrew from participation in the Restriction Scheme and in 1947 the Ordinance was amended to delete the limitation on the acreage which it was permissible to plant in tea

The legislation relating to tea in Kenya, Ug. nda and Tanganyika has up to now been different in each territory. While it has, for some time been considered desirable that the three territories should have identical or nearly identical legislation on this subject it was not until last year that agreement as to the legislation to be introduced was arrived at

This Bill will give effect to the joint recommendations of the three territories. It is understood that an Ordinance on similar lines has already been enacted in Uganda and that a Bill will shortly be introduced in the Legislature of Tanganyika.

Clauses 3 and 4 of the Bill provide for the establishment of a Tea Board and for its incorporation

Clause 5 provides for the procedure and meetings of the Tea Board

Clause 6 enables the Board to nominate persons to represent the Board on any inter-territorial body which may be established

Clause, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 deal with planting licences Clause 7 prohibits the planting of tea except under licence Clause 8 provides for the form and con ents of an application for a planting licence Clauses 9 and 10 provide for the circumstances in which a planting licence may be cancelled or refused Clause 11 provides that a planting licence shall not be transferable except with the permission of the Board

Clause 12 provides for the powers of the Board to enter and inspect any land and buildings occupied by a licensee

Clause 13 gives the Board power by notice in writing to require any person convicted of the offence of planting tea without a licence or planting tea on more land than his licence allows to uproot the tea so planted

Clauses 14, 15 and 16 provide for controlling the export of manufactured tea Clause 14 prohibits the export of manufactured tea outside East Africa except under permit issued by the Board The export of not more than two pounds by parcel post, of samples of not more than eight ounces, and the re-export of any quantity, is expressly excluded from the application of the section C'ause 15 provides for an appeal to the Governor in Council against a refusal by the Board to issue an export permit Clause 16 provides a penalty for exporting or attempting to export manufactured tea without a permit or in breach of the terms of a permit

Clauses 17, 18 and 19 provide for the imposition, amount and utilization of the proceeds of a cess Clause 17 enables the Governor in Council to impose one or both of two forms of cess, namely a cess on manufactured tea and a cess on the plant d acreage. The cess may not exceed four shillings per hundred poinds of manufactured tea or four shillings per acre in the case of a cess on the planted acreage. Clause 18 enables the Board to make recommendations to the Governor in Council in relation to the amount of the cess and generally as to the steps which it regards as necessary to protect and promote the interests of the industry. Clause 19 prescribes the purposes for which the proceeds of any cess may be used

Clause 20 provides for the audit of the accounts of the Board

Clause 21 enables the Board to require returns from a licensee

Clause 22 prohibits the export of tea seed to any destination outside East Africa

Clause 23 provides for the penalties for an offence against the Ordinance and Clause 24 provides that any director, manager, secretary or other officer of a body corporate by which an offence was committed shall be equally guilty of the offence if it was committed with his knowledge or approval

Clause 25 provides for the making of rules for carrying out the provisions of the Ordinance

Clause 26 provides for the procedure in appeals to the Governor in Council

Clause 27 provides that the Ordinance shall not apply to the growing of tea by Africans in the native areas

Clause 28 repeals the Tea Ordinance, 1948

It is not anticipated that the provisions of this Bill will if enac ed, result in any additional expenditure of public money




