**A BILL ENTITLED  
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE REVISED EDITION  
OF THE LAWS ORDINANCE, 1948**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Revised Edition of the Laws (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the Revised Edition of the Laws Ordinance 1948 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance)

2. Section 9 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting a colon for the full stop at the end of the section and by adding thereto the following proviso—

Provided that the Governor may if he shall think fit, approve and bring into force with effect from such date 10 as he may select those volumes of the Revised Edition containing the Ordinances of the Colony in force on the 21st September, 1948, and approve and bring into force from a subsequent date those volumes containing a reprint of such of the Acts, Orders in Council, Letters 15 Patent, Royal Instructions and Rules, Regulations, Proclamations By-laws, Notices and other forms of subsidiary legislation as the Commissioner may consider necessary to include therein

## MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 9 of the Revised Edition of the Laws Ordinance, 1948 (herein referred to as the principal Ordinance), read in conjunction with the definition of "the Revised Edition" in section 2 of the principal Ordinance and with the provisions of section 7 of the Ordinance does not enable the Governor to approve and bring into force a part only of the Revised Edition

In view of the fact that the volumes of the Revised Edition containing the Ordinances will be ready and could be published several months before the volumes containing the subsidiary legislation, and in view of the fact that the early publication of the Ordinances would be a great convenience to practitioners and other members of the public, it is considered that section 9 of the principal Ordinance should be amended so as to enable this course to be adopted

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 511

**A BILL ENTITLED  
AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE GRANT  
AND REGULATING OF PENSIONS, GRATUITIES  
AND OTHER ALLOWANCES IN RESPECT OF THE  
PUBLIC SERVICE OF OFFICERS UNDER THE  
GOVERNMENT OF KENYA**

The above Bill was inadvertently published without the necessary statement of Objects and Reasons

The following are the Objects and Reasons —

**MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS**

This Bill will make provision for the grant of pensions, gratuities and other allowances to certain officers in the service of the Government in accordance with the new terms of service introduced consequent upon the recommendations of the East African Salaries Commission

2 The Bill will replace the existing European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1927, and Non-European Officers' Pensions Ordinance, 1932 subject to the retention of existing rights by officers who have elected not to be subject to the new terms of service

3 The Bill follows closely the Colonial Service Model Pensions Ordinance (which has been adopted in most Colonies) with the addition of a Second Schedule in which provision is made for the carrying forward of certain rights enjoyed by officers who were in the service before the new terms came into effect and who have elected to be subject to the new terms. The Bill is made retrospective to 1st January, 1946, the date on which the new terms of service took effect

4 Among the main provisions of the Bill, most of which reproduce existing legislation, are the following—

- (a) Pensions are to be granted in accordance with regulations, which are to be laid before Legislative Council (*clause 3*) and any pensions granted are to be paid out of the Colony's funds (*clause 4*)
- (b) Pensions are only payable on retirement in specified circumstances (*clauses 6, 7 and 8*) and the normal retiring age is 55, though during a period ending on 31st December, 1951 (which may be extended by resolution of Legislative Council) an officer may retire or be retired at 45 (*clause 21*)
- (c) The maximum pension payable is two-thirds of the officer's highest pensionable emoluments (*clause 9*) and a pensioner may be required to accept re-employment until he attains the age of 50 or suffer suspension of his pension (*clause 10*)
- (d) Gratuities, and pensions to dependants, may be granted in the circumstances set out in *clauses 16 and 17* of the Bill

5 The First Schedule contains the Pensions Regulations which in the main reproduce existing regulations. The only substantial changes are the following—

- (a) *Regulations 6 and 13* whereby a female officer with not less than five years service who retires on account of marriage is eligible for a gratuity of one-twelfth of a month's pensionable emoluments for each complete month of pensionable service
- (b) *Regulation 23* whereby an officer whose office is abolished is eligible for an additional pension on account of the termination of his services
- (c) *Regulation 26* whereby a non-pensionable officer may in addition to a gratuity be granted an annuity if he has served for more than 30 years

6 The main provisions of the Second Schedule (which provides for the preservation of certain rights of officers who elected for the new terms of service) are as follows—

- (a) An officer transferred to the service of the Government otherwise than from East African Service who has elected for the new terms of service, or so transferred on or after the 3rd September, 1948, will become subject to the provisions of the Ordinance and the Regulations with the addition of special provisions to protect certain rights which he may carry forward in accordance with the new terms of service (*Part II*)
- (b) An officer appointed to the public service before the 3rd September, 1948, whose whole service has been under the Government, or who has been transferred to the service of

the Government from other East African Service, and who has elected for the new terms of service or who is so transferred on or after 3rd September, 1948, will become subject to the provisions of the Ordinance and the Regulations with the addition of special provisions to protect certain rights which he may carry forward in accordance with the new terms of service (*Part III*)

- (c) An officer who was not eligible for free pension prior to the 3rd September, 1948, and who has elected for the new terms of service will become subject to the provisions of the Ordinance and the Regulations with the addition of special provisions for the counting of the whole or part of his earlier service for pension purposes (*Part IV*)
- (d) An officer who was transferred from the service of the Government to other East African Service prior to the 1st January, 1946, and who elects for similar new terms of service in that other East African Service will become subject to the provisions of the Ordinance and Regulations with the addition of the provisions of the Schedule which would have been applicable to him had he remained in the service of the Government (*Part V*)
- (e) An officer transferred from the service of the Government prior to the 1st January, 1946, to public service outside East Africa and who has not subsequently been transferred back to East Africa remains subject to the provisions of the existing law which applied to him before transfer (*Part VI*)
- (f) An officer in the service of the Government prior to the 3rd September, 1948, who has elected not to be on the new terms of service remains subject to the provisions of the existing law now applicable to him unless he is subsequently transferred to another office in the service of the Government or other public service when he is deemed to be an officer who elected for the new terms of service and he will be subject to the provisions of the Ordinance and the Regulations with the addition of those special provisions in the Second Schedule applicable to his case

7 The Third Schedule sets out the East African Pension enactments under which officers may have obtained certain rights before the 1st January, 1946, or before transfer to the service of the Government, as the case may be, and which rights are retained in accordance with the provisions of the Second Schedule

8 It is not possible to estimate what additional expenditure of public moneys will result if the provisions of this Bill become law

## REPORT ON THE ACCOUNTS OF THE NATIVE TRUST FUND FOR THE YEAR, 1948

As certified thereon the Annual Statement of Receipts and Payments for the year 1948 has been examined under my direction

2 A total amount of Sh 1 653 27 has been charged to the 'Maintenance of Ambulance' votes, Rift Valley Province which is not a proper charge against these votes. There appears to have been no other vote to which this expenditure could reasonably have been charged and in the absence of any special authority it must therefore be regarded as unauthorized expenditure. The matter has been referred to the Accountant General.

3 Expenditure totalling Sh 242 in respect of certain accessories fitted to the new Eldoret ambulance at the time of delivery was charged to the "Maintenance of Ambulance" vote. This appears to have been done to avoid over-expenditure on the 'Purchase of Ambulance' vote on which there remained at that time an unspent balance of Sh 1 70 only.

4 An amount of Sh 12 312 was incorrectly credited to the Fund in respect of Poll Tax collected in the Narok District. This was refunded in 1949 and credited to the revenue of the Colony.

5 During the year work on two small contracts was completed but not paid for. Authority has now been given for these amounts, totalling Sh 520 to be paid in 1950.

6 In view of the facts stated in the previous two paragraphs, the Receipts and Payments Account Balance at 31-12-48 must be regarded as overstated by Sh 12 832.

7 By decision of Executive Council, the credit balance of the Forest Squatters Betterment Fund previously controlled by the Forestry Department, was transferred to the Native Trust Fund at the beginning of 1948 under the sub-account heading, Forest Squatters Maize Cess Fund.

8 In connexion with paragraph 1 of the 1947 Report, as far as I am aware the correct procedure is now being adopted.

9 With reference to paragraph 2 of the 1947 Report it was ascertained that the total net loss of revenue was Sh 294. Of this amount Sh 205 was due to be paid out of court under a court decree and will therefore appear as an item of expenditure in due course. The remaining Sh 89 has been treated as an under collection of revenue written-off and no adjustment in the accounts was considered necessary.
