1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Order (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the Public Order Ordinance, 1950 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance)

2. There shall be inserted next after section 7 of the principal Ordinance the following new section—

Penalty

8. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this Ordinance in respect of which no special penalty is provided shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both such fine and imprisonment

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Public Order Ordinance, 1950 (herein referred to as the principal Ordinance) provides special penalties for contravention of section 3 of the Ordinance which deals with the prohibition of organizations equipped to usurp the functions of the police, but owing to an oversight no penalty was provided for contravention of section 4 which makes it an offence to carry offensive weapons at public meetings or section 5 which prohibits offensive conduct at public meetings conducive to breaches of the peace or section 6 which deals with the prohibition of uniforms in connexion with political objects. This Bill will amend the principal Ordinance by the insertion of a new section 8 which will provide a penalty for contravention of these sections.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows —

- 1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Roads (Amendment) Ordinance 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the Public Roads Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance Short title

- 2 There shall be substituted for section 15 of the principal Ordinance the following section— Repeal and replacement of section 17 of the principal Ordinance
- 15 (1) An appeal shall lie to a subordinate court of the first class by— Appeals
- 10 (a) any person aggrieved by a decision of a district board made pursuant to the provisions of the proviso to section 10 of this Ordinance,
- (b) any person aggrieved by the making of, or the refusal to make, an order under section 11 of this Ordinance
- 15 (2) Every such appeal shall be filed within 30 days of the date of the decision or the making of, or the refusal to make, an order as aforesaid
- 20 (3) Upon any such appeal as aforesaid the court may, in its discretion, order that the costs of the appeal shall be borne either by the appellant or the respondent district board
- 25 (4) Upon any such appeal being filed the minutes and any resolution of the district board relating to the decision, order or refusal to make an order appealed against shall be supplied to the appellant free of charge and shall form part of the record of the appeal

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Public Travel and Access Roads Ordinance (herein referred to as the principal Ordinance) provides the procedure to be followed regarding the application for and grant of roads of access, and also the procedure for making an appeal against the order of a district council granting a road of access

It has been brought to notice that although a right of appeal is given against an order of a district council granting a road of access no appeal is given against the refusal of a council to grant an application for a road of access. It is considered that such a right of appeal should exist

This Bill accordingly will amend the principal Ordinance in the following respects—

- (a) by providing for a right of appeal to a subordinate court of the first class by the applicant against a refusal by the council to grant an application,
- (b) by enabling the applicant to demand a certified copy of the minutes recording the refusal and providing that such certified copy shall form part of the record of the appeal, and
- (c) by giving the court a discretion to order either party to an appeal to pay the costs thereof

It is not expected that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The definition of “coffee planter” in section 2 of the Coffee (Marketing) Ordinance (herein referred to as the principal Ordinance), is so drafted as to exclude African coffee growers, the growing of coffee by Africans in the African areas is separately regulated by the African Grown Coffee Rules, 1949. These Rules contain no provision for the marketing of the coffee and since the African coffee grower obtains the benefits resultant from the activities of the Coffee Marketing Board established under the principal Ordinance it is considered proper that they should be subject as regards marketing to the provisions of the principal Ordinance. This Bill will accordingly amend the definition of “coffee planter” in section 2 of the principal Ordinance so as to include an African coffee grower who is licensed under the African Grown Coffee Rules, 1949.

It is not anticipated that there will be any additional expenditure of public moneys if the provisions of this Bill become law.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will effect certain amendments to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Ordinance, 1948, which the Secretary of State has advised are desirable in order to avoid any apparent conflict between the Ordinance and the Labour Conventions which it was enacted to carry out. The Bill does not effect any changes in principle.

Clause 2 will amend the definition of "industrial undertaking" so as to exclude from paragraph (d) any reference to "any agricultural undertaking" since, although generally speaking agricultural undertakings are not intended to be included in the term industrial undertaking, there are certain agricultural undertakings which ought properly to be regarded as industrial undertakings. Consequent upon this amendment it is necessary to delete the existing proviso to paragraph (d) and to replace it with a new proviso whereby if the Governor considers that any occupation forming part of an industrial undertaking should be excluded from the provisions of the Ordinance he may after seeking the advice of the Executive Council, by order, declare that employment in such occupation shall be deemed not to be employment in an industrial undertaking.

Clause 3 will delete the proviso to section 4 whereby the Member was enabled, by notice in the Gazette, to permit the employment of children in any specified industrial undertaking as it was not the intention of the Conventions referred to above that there should be such a power.

Clause 4 will amend section 6 so as to make it clear that it is intended to confer power on the Governor in Council to specify any trade or undertaking or in any occupation therein in which a child shall not be employed rather than to enable the Governor in Council to prohibit the employment of a child in any specified trade or undertaking or in any occupation therein.

Clause 5 will amend section 12 so as to make it clear that a young person may only be employed as a trimmer or stoker, even with the approval of the Member, on a school ship or training ship and then only if the work is supervised by an authority approved by the Member.

It is not expected that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Increase of Mortgage Interest (Restriction) Ordinance, 1949 re-enacted the provisions relating to increase of mortgage interest which were previously contained in the Increase of Rent and of Mortgage Interest (Restrictions) Ordinance, 1940. The re-enactment of the provisions regarding restrictions on increase of mortgage interest differed from the corresponding provisions in the 1940 Ordinance in matters of detail only. Representations have been received that the provisions of the Ordinance have been a deterrent to mortgage investments and there is evidence that the maximum rate allowed on new mortgage loans by the 1949 Ordinance has no relation to reality and that higher rates are constantly offered. It is considered, therefore, that the Increase of Mortgage Interest (Restriction) Ordinance, 1949, represents a useless shackling of business and should be repealed. This Bill will accordingly repeal it.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

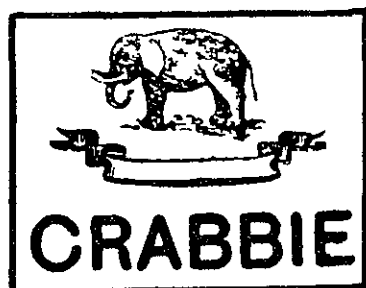

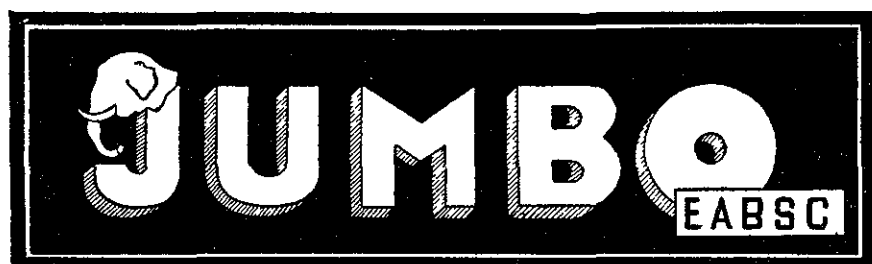
