AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE NATIONAL PARKS ORDINANCE

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows —

Short title

Cap 215

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the National Parks (Amendment) Ordinance 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the National Parks Ordinance hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Amendment of the long title to the principal Ordinance

2. The long title to the principal Ordinance is amended by inserting the word "Royal" before the words "National Parks" where they occur therein

Amendment of section 1 of the principal Ordinance

3. Section 1 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for the words "National Parks Ordinance", the words "Royal National Parks of Kenya Ordinance"

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Ordinance

4. Section 2 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for the definition of "National Park" the following definition—

"Royal National Park" means any area of land declared to be a Royal National Park under section 3 of this Ordinance

Amendment of section 5 (1) (a) of the principal Ordinance

5. Paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of section 5 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for the words "The Kenya National Parks Trustees" the words "The Trustees of the Royal National Parks of Kenya" 20

Amendment of the principal Ordinance

6. The principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for the words "National Park" and "National Parks" wherever such words occur in the Ordinance the words "Royal National Park" and "Royal National Parks" respectively

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE PROVISION AS TO THE APPLICATION AND MODIFICATION OF ORDINANCES IN RELATION TO MANDATES OF THE LEAGUE OF NATIONS AND THE TRUSTEESHIP SYSTEM OF THE UNITED NATIONS

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Mandated and Short title Trust Territories Ordinance, 1950
- 2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise re- Interpretation quires, the expression "trust territory" neans a territory for 5 the time being administered under the trusteeship system of the United Nations
 - **3.** (1) Subject to the provisions of sub-section (2) of this Application and section, the operation of any Ordinance in relation to any modification territory—
- (a) shall, while the territory is a trust territory under the sole administration of any Government, be the same as if a mandate of the League of Nations were being exercised by that Government,
- (b) shall not, except by virtue of the foregoing paragraph be affected by reason—
 - (1) of the territory becoming a trust territory, or
 - (11) of any change in the authority responsible for administering the territory which takes place on its becoming a trust territory or while it is a trust territory

This sub-section shall be deemed to have had effect from the 13th day of December, 1946 (being the date on which the first trust territories were established)

- (2) Where, whether before or after the enactment of this ²⁵ Ordinance, a change in the authority responsible for administering a territory takes place upon its becoming a trust territory, or while it is a trust territory, the Governor may by Order, make in any Ordinance such modifications as may be proper having regard to the change, and any such Order—
- 30 (a) may contain such transitional and other consequential provisions as appear to the Governor to be expedient for the purposes of the Order, and
 - (b) if made after the date of the change, may be made so as to have effect from that da e, and
- 35 (c) may be varied or revised by a subsequent Order
- (3) Where any Ordinance (whether enacted before or after the termination of the League of Nations) refers in whatever terms to mandated territories or any description of mandated territories, mandates of the League shall not for the purposes of that Ordinance be deemed to have come to an end with the termination of the League

This sub-section shall be deemed to have had effect from the date of the termination of the League

(4) The foregoing provisions of this section, except subsection (3) hereof, shall apply only to Ordinances enacted at earlier sessions of the Legislative Council than this Ordinance and to subsidiary legislation contained in instruments having effect under such Ordinances, and the application of the foregoing provisions of this section to subsidiary legislation contained in instruments having effect under any Ordinance may be excluded either in whole or in part by any instrument having effect under that Ordinance

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The conversion, since the creation of the United Nations, of mandated territories into trust territories has resulted in considerable doubt as to whether certain enactments which applied to or referred to mandated territories can be construed as applying to the same territories which are now known as trust territories. This led to the enactment in the United Kingdom of the Mandated and Trust Territories Act, 1947, which is designed to remove this doubt

The main purpose of this Bill which follows closely the 1947 Act of Parliament is, therefore to provide that existing enactments referring to mandated territories shall—

- (a) apply to mandated territories which have now become trust territories, and
- (b) continue to apply to mandated territories which have not become trust territories

Sub-clause (1) of clause 3 provides that the operation of any enactment in relation to any trust territory, shall be the same as if a mandate of the League of Nations were still being exercised and shall not be affected by reason of the change over from mandated to trust territory or by reason of any change in the authority responsible for administering the territory This sub-clause will be given retrospective effect to the 13th December, 1946, the date on which the first trust territories were established

Sub-clause (2) of clause 3 will enable the Governor in Council by order to make in any Ordinance any modifications which may, consequent upon any change in the authority responsible for the administration of any territory, be proper

Sub-clause (3) of clause 3 will provide that where an Ordinance refers to mandated territories, mandates of the League shall not for the purposes of that Ordinance be deemed to have come to an end This sub-clause is to have retrospective effect to the date of the termination of the League

Sub-clause (4) will limit the application of the provisions of the Ordinance to Ordinances passed at earlier sessions of the Legislative Council than that at which this Ordinance is passed

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

At the time of the inauguration of the Kenya European Civil Service and the Kenya Asian Local Civil Service Government intended that officers in these two services should be enabled to qualify for a pension on a contributory basis. This intention was, however, only partially carried into effect. In 1946 there was enacted the Kenya European Civil Service Contributory Pensions Ordinance (now Cap 70), which had effect from 1st January, 1947. No similar legislation was enacted in relation to the Asian Local Civil Service. The result is that in respect of officers who retired prior to the 1st January, 1946 (from which date officers became eligible for free pensions under the new Pensions Ordinance, 1950), no legislative provision existed for the award of pensions to the officers referred to above on a contributory basis.

This Bill will accordingly provide for the grant of pensions to those officers whose names are set out in the Schedule The grant of the pensions will be governed by the Pensions Ordinance, 1950, except to the extent to which the Bill otherwise provides

Clause 3 sets out the circumstances which must exist to render an officer eligible for a pension under this Ordinance

Clauses 4, 5 and 6 contain provisions which will expressly override certain provisions of the Pensions Ordinance, 1950

Clause 7 expressly provides that a pension under this Ordinance will be in lieu of any other retiring allowance whether granted on an interim basis or not

It is expected that if this Bill becomes law additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved. There will be payable immediately a sum of about £8,400 to cover arrears of pensions and an annual sum of approximately £1,300 at the start will be payable, but this sum will diminish as some of the pensions cease to be payable
