Senior Foreman (Asian) Public Works Department

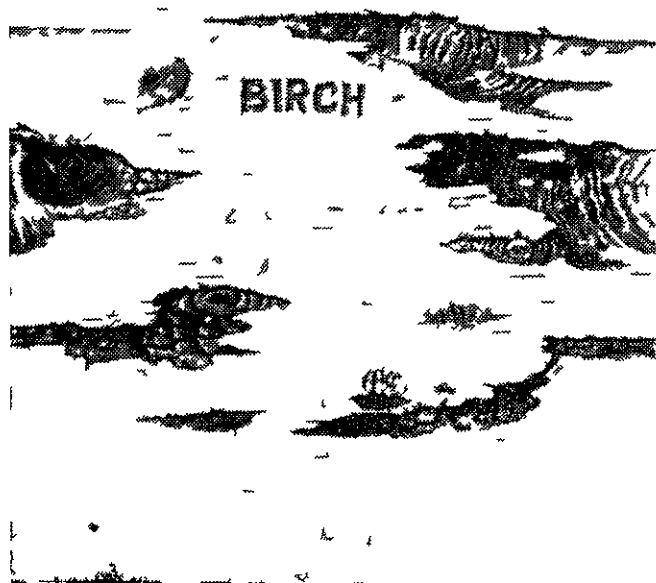

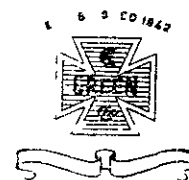
