SETTLEMENT SCHEME—INDIAN AND ARAB  
SETTLEMENT BOARD

## MTWAPA CREEK

1 *Description of the Area*—An area of 3,840 acres approximately of Crown land at Mtwapa has been reserved for a settlement scheme to be established by the Indian and Arab Settlement Board. The area lies some ten miles north of Mombasa between the main Mombasa-Malindi road and the Mtwapa Creek.

For settlement purposes the area has been divided into two sections —

- (i) In the northern section, of 2,100 acres approximately, the land is flat and fairly open, with soil suitable for annual crops and vegetables paw paws, bananas, etc. Some 800 acres are also suitable for tree crops. It is proposed that the average plot here should be 150 acres approximately in extent.
- (ii) In the southern section of 1,700 acres approximately, the land is flat but heavily covered with bush and scrub. The soil is light, and though suitable for all types of tree crops is not suitable for annual crops of vegetables, etc., without heavy manuring. It is proposed that the average plot here should be 300 acres approximately in extent.

2 *Capital Value*—The land will be made available at the price of £2 per acre in the northern section and Sh 10 per acre in the southern section. The capital cost of the land in both sections can be paid either outright or in ten equal annual instalments in the event of a grant being made in accordance with the conditions which follow. The statutory rent of 20 cents per acre will be payable in respect of the land both in the northern and southern sections from the date of occupation. This Crown rent is revisable in 1960.

3 *Development Charges*—The Government has undertaken a certain amount of basic development in the area at an estimated cost of £6,000. It must be stressed that this figure is very approximate only and is liable to be increased if further development is put in hand. This expenditure will be divided proportionately between all plot-holders who will be liable for their share. They may either pay this share outright or by instalments over a period of years to be decided by the Member for Agriculture and Natural Resources in consultation with the Indian and Arab Settlement Board. In the latter case they will be charged interest at the rate of 4½ per cent per annum on the outstanding amount. On the assumption that 20 plots will be made available for the settlement area, the charge per plot would be in the order of £300 or more according to the development undertaken.

4 *Conditions of Tenure*—Successful applicants will be given a licence in respect of their plots for an initial period of three years, or such shorter period as the Member for Agriculture and Natural Resources may decide on the recommendation of the Indian and Arab Settlement Board. Subject to satisfactory development having been undertaken within this period, a grant for 99 years will be issued. This grant will include provisions requiring personal occupation for the first five years (this period to be counted from the date of taking up the land) and prohibiting transfer of the plot for the full period of the grant except with the permission of the Commissioner of Lands.

5 *Development Conditions*—Successful applicants will be required to conform to the development programme and conditions of good husbandry laid down by the Commissioner of Lands in consultation with the Indian and Arab Settlement Board.

6 *Supervision of Settlement Scheme*—An Agricultural Officer will be posted to the area for the special purpose of supervising the settlement and advising the plot-holders.

7 *Machinery Pool*—A Machinery Pool with a tractor and heavy agricultural implements will be available, during the initial period, to plot-holders for clearing the land and carrying out development, on such terms and conditions and at such times as may be decided by the Member for Agriculture and Natural Resources in consultation with the Indian and Arab Settlement Board.

8 *Development Loans*—For the purpose of assisting development, loans on a pound for pound basis may be made at the discretion of the Member for Agriculture and Natural Resources at the interest rate of 4½ per cent provided adequate security is given. These loans will only be made during the first five years of the Settlement Scheme, but will be repayable over such longer period as may be determined by the Member in consultation with the Indian and Arab Settlement Board.

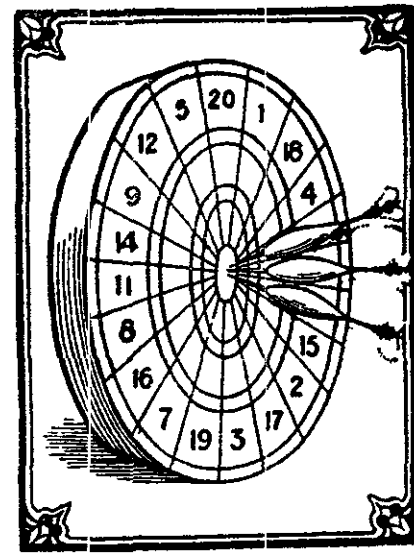

- (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of seven days as required by Condition (a) 1 below, the Commissioner of Lands shall declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto
