1 The grantee shall use and permit to be used the land hereby granted for business purposes only, excepting dangerous or offensive trade, but shall be at liberty to use the said land for the combined purpose of business and residence notwithstanding, provided that in the event of the said land being used for the said combined purpose, then not more than one-half of the area thereof shall be built upon, otherwise not more than 90 per cent shall be built upon

2 In no case shall the area of the plot required to remain unbuilt upon be less than 300 square feet or 10 per cent of the area, and the said area shall be free from any erection thereon above the level of the ground except latrine accommodation constructed in accordance with all laws and by-laws in force relating thereto, and the design approved by the local authority. Such open space shall be at the rear of the building and shall extend along the entire width of the building and the distance across such open space from every part of the buildings to the rear boundary of the plot shall not be less than 10 feet

3 At no time during the term of the grant shall the plot or any portion thereof or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any trade or business which has been or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette

4 A veranda may be erected within the road reserve with the previous consent of the local authority and must conform to a building line decided upon by such authority


AS IT will be extremely difficult to obtain places in United Kingdom universities and colleges in 1951, it is essential that all applications for admission in October, 1951, should be received by the Director of Colonial Scholars in London in December, 1950. It will therefore be necessary for applications for Government African Overseas Bursaries to be received by the Director of Education by 30th November, 1950. It will not be possible for the Director of Colonial Scholars to secure places for any students who apply after that date. No applications or a bursary received after 30th November, 1950, can therefore be considered unless the applicant has already secured admission to a university or college.

Persons wishing to apply for a Government African Overseas Bursary should obtain the necessary forms from either the Director of Education, Nairobi, or the Provincial Education Officers at Kisumu, Nakuru, Nyeri and Mombasa. The completed forms must be returned through the appropriate Provincial Education Officer so as to reach the Director of Education not later than 30th November, 1950.

It should be noted that no application for a bursary will ordinarily be considered unless the candidate has satisfactorily completed a course of education at Makerere College.


