## A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS TARIFF ORDINANCE

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Tariff Short title (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the Customs Tariff Ordinance, hereinafter Cap 262 referred to as the principal Ordinance

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS
