2 Applications should be accompanied by a statement indicating (a) the present land-holding (if any) of the applicant in the Colony and the amount of and the nature of development thereon, (b) the proposals of the applicant for the development of the area illustrated by site sketch plans to scale, (c) the amount of capital available for development purposes

3 The successful applicant will be required to pay within seven days of notification that his application has been accepted, 25 per cent of the purchase price, together with the rent due to 31st December, 1950

4 The balance of the purchase price will be payable on demand prior to the issue of the title

5 The survey fees and fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the title together with stamp duty (which is approximately 2 per cent of the purchase price and the rent) in respect of the grant must be paid within seven days of the demand therefor. Title will be issued as soon as conveniently may be

(B) General

1 The grants will be subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap 155) and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Cap 142). The term of the grant will be 99 years from the first day of the month following acceptance of the tender

2 The annual rent will be revisable after the 33rd and 66th year of the grant and such revision will be made on the basis of 4 per cent of the full capital value of the land in the 33rd and 66th year. Any increase as a result of this revision will be not more than 100 per cent of the rent for the preceding period. The annual rent for the first 33 years will be as specified in the Schedule hereunder

3 The purchaser shall erect within two years of the commencement of his grant a building of approved design constructed of stone, burnt brick, or concrete on proper foundations

4 No building shall be erected on any plot unless and until plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the local authority and by the Commissioner of Lands, or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate through the District Commissioner within three months of the date of grant

5 The grantee will be required to pay the cost of construction of roads and drains to serve the plots on demand therefor being made

6 The grantee will be required to pay the rates upon the whole of the rateable interest and Government's contribution in lieu of rates assessed on the plots if and when payable

7 The plot and the buildings erected thereon shall be restricted to business or business-cum-personal residential purpose only. If it is used for both, the ground floor shall be used for business only and the upper for personal residence only

8 All outbuildings and offices, etc., shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the local authority or such other person as may be appointed and shall be kept so screened during the term of the grant
