# THE EAST AFRICAN POWER AND LIGHTING COMPANY LIMITED (VALIDATION AND LICENSING) BILL

UNTO the Honourable The Legislative Council of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya in Council assembled

The Humble Petition of The East African Power and Lighting Company Limited a Limited Liability Company incorporated in the Colony of Kenya and having its registered office situate at Electricity House in Hardinge Street in the City of Nairobi in the said Colony, showeth as follows —

- 1 That your Petitioner is the holder of divers Distributing and Local Generating Licences granted to it under the provisions of the Electric Power Ordinance (Cap 174) and authorizing your Petitioner to generate and distribute electrical energy within the areas specified in such Licences as aforesaid
- 2 That your Petitioner in the year 1947, in order to increase its Generating Capacity in the area of Mombasa (in respect of which said area your Petitioner is the Licensee under Local Generating Licence No 4 dated the 1st day of December, 1923 which Licence serves Distributing Licence No 4 dated the 17th day of October 1923) purchased from His Majesty's Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty the Generating Station situate adjacent to Mbaraki Creek at Mombasa which said Generating Station had for some time prior to its purchase already been operated by your Petitioner under agreement with His Majesty's Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and has been since the date of such purchase and is now being operated by your Petitioner without any Licence in respect thereof having first been obtained by your Petitioner pursuant to the provisions of the Electric Power Ordinance
- 3 That your Petitionei in the year 1949 in order to increase its Generating Capacity in the area of Nairobi (in respect of which said area your Petitioner is the Licensee under Local Generating Licence No 2 dated the 24th day of March 1922 which Licence serves Distributing Licence No 2 dated the 24th day of March 1922 and Distributing Licence No 16 dated the 3rd day of December 1948) extended the already existing Thermal Generating Station East of Ruiru Township by the installation of further Thermal Generating Plant of a type and character different from the then existing plant which said additional plant has been since the date of such installation and is now being operated by your Petitioner without any Licence in respect thereof having first been obtained by your Petitioner pursuant to the provisions of the Electric Power Ordinance
- 4 That your Petitioner in its capacity as Licensee as aforesaid in an endeavour to meet recent rapid development necessitating ever increasing demands for supplies of electrical energy at short notice has from time to time installed certain

plant and works without having first obtained the requisite authority so to do pursuant to the provisions of the Electric Power Ordinance

5 That your Petitioner having become aware of such acts and omissions as aforesaid and being desirous of having the same rectified validated and confirmed at the earliest possible date has caused the Bill of which a copy is hereunto annexed to be prepared for giving effect to the purposes set forth in the preamble to such Bill as follows, namely —

A Bill to validate and confirm certain acts and omissions of The East African Power and Lighting Company Limited, to license certain Generating Stations and to approve the installation of certain plant and works, to indemnify The East African Power and Lighting Company Limited from any consequences which they may have thereby incurred and for purposes connected with the matters aforesaid

6 That the objects of the said Bill cannot be effected without the authority of the Legislative Council

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays that leave be given to bring in a Bill to your Honourable Council for effecting the objects and purposes aforesaid in the terms of the copy of such Bill hereunto annexed or in such other terms and with such other provisions and subject to such conditions and regulations as to your Honourable Council may seem meet

And your Petitioner will ever pray etc

By Resolution, in accordance with Standing Rule and Order No 97, Legislative Council has approved the introduction into Council of the following Bill —

# A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO VALIDATE AND CONFIRM CERTAIN ACTS AND OMISSIONS OF THE EAST AFRICAN POWER AND LIGHTING COMPANY, LIMITED, TO LICENSE CERTAIN GENERATING STATIONS AND TO APPROVE THE INSTALLATION OF CERTAIN PLANT AND WORKS; TO INDEMNIFY THE EAST AFRICAN POWER AND LIGHTING COMPANY, LIMITED, FROM ANY CONSEQUENCES WHICH THEY MAY HAVE THEREBY INCURRED; AND FOR PURPOSES CONNECTED WITH THE MATTERS AFORESAID

WHEREAS the East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited, has for some time past operated the generating stations particulars whereof are set out in the First Schedule to this Ordinance, from the dates respectively mentioned in such Schedule without having first obtained licences in respect of the said stations as required by the provisions of section 48 of the Electric Power Ordinance

AND WHEREAS the East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited has, from time to time installed the plant and works particulars whereof are set out in the Third Schedule to this Ordinance and operated the same from the dates respectively mentioned in such Schedule without having first obtained the prior approval of the Governor to the installation thereof as required by the provisions of section 132 (1) of the Electric Power Ordinance

Cap 174

AND WHEREAS it is necessary that the acts and omissions of the East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited in erecting such generating stations and installing such plant and works should be validated and confirmed, and that the said generating stations should be duly licensed and the installation of the said plant and works duly approved, and that the East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited, should be discharged, freed and indemnified from and against all consequences whatsoever, whether penal or otherwise, incurred by the said Company by reason of such acts and omissions as aforesaid

AND WHEREAS these purposes cannot be effected without the authority of the Legislative Council of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows—

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited (Validation and Licensing) Ordinance, 1950

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Grant of Electric Power Ordinance the East African Power and Light- Station Licences ing Company, Limited shall be deemed to have been granted Cap 174 a Generating Station Licence in respect of each of the generat-5 ing stations described in the first column of the First Schedule to this Ordinance in the form and on the terms and conditions set out in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance and each such licence shall be deemed to have had effect from the date specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this 10 Ordinance and each such licence shall be co-terminous with the Local Generating Licence mentioned in the third column of the said First Schedule opposite the particulars of each such generating station and shall be renewable in accordance with the provisions of the Electric Power Ordinance

15 3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Authorization Electric Power Ordinance the plant and works described in of plant Cap 174 the first column of the Third Schedule to this Ordinance shall be deemed to have been approved in accordance with the provisions of the Electric Power Ordinance with effect Cap 174 20 from the dates respectively specified in the second column of such Schedule being the dates upon which such plant and works were installed

- 4. The East African Power and Lighting Company, Indemnity Limited shall be and is hereby discharged freed and indemni-25 fied from and against all consequences whatsoever, whether penal or otherwise, incurred by it by reason of its said failure to comply with the provisions of the Electric Power Ordinance Cap 174 in respect of the generating stations and plant and works aforesaid

5. Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall in any Saving of 30 way prejudice or affect any rights of His Majesty the King, His Heirs and Successors, in any respect, or of any body politic corporate and or corporate or of any other person excepting only such as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by, from or under them



# SECOND SCHEDULE

FORM OF GENERATING STATION LICENCE

- 1 The provisions contained in the Electric Power Ordinance are incorporated in and form part of this Licence
- 2 The Licensee for the pulpose of this Licence is the East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited, having its registered office at Nairobi
- 3 The electrical energy to be generated under this Licence shall be of such respective amounts as may from time to time be required for the purposes of the relevant Local Generating Licences referred to in the third column of the First Schedule to this Ordinance
- 4 The generating station authorized by this Licence is the relevant generating station described in the First Schedule to this Ordinance and is more particularly delineated and described on the plans thereof lodged with the Postmaster General which said plans in the case of the generating station particulars of which are first shown in the first column of the First Schedule to this Ordinance are marked DRG 728 and DRG 734 and in the case of the generating station particulars of which are secondly shown in the first column of the First Schedule to this Ordinance are marked MSA /113 and DRG No 795 but subject to such alterations or modifications as the Governor may approve
- 5 The machinery installed in the said generating station shall be of the type described in the First Schedule to this Ordinance and of not less than the capacity or aggregate capacity specified in the First Schedule to this Ordinance and shall be ope ated continuously or as may be required
- 6 The works authorized by this Licence for operation of the said generating station (subject to the Licensee obtaining all necessary easements wayleaves or other incidental rights) include those details of which are shown on the said plans
- 7 Any land compused in the said works shall be brought into and shall appear in the accounts under this Licence at a value not exceeding the cost incurred by the Licensee in obtaining such land
- 8 The Licensee's officers, servants and employees or works engaged employed or used for the purposes of this Licence may be engaged employed or used for the purpose of any other licence granted to the Licensee under the provisions of the Electric Power Ordinance provided that where so engaged employed or used for the purposes of any such other licence an allocation correct and true to the satisfaction of the Governor of the expense or value of such engagement employment or use shall be made and appear in detail in the accounts under this Licence and any such other licence
- 9 The Licensee's officers, servants, employees or works may also be engaged employed or used for purposes other than the purposes of this Licence or any other licence as aforesaid provided that such engagement employment or use shall, to the satisfaction of the Governor, not prejudice in any way the performance by the Licensee of its cluties or obligations under this Licence and provided also that such engagement employment or use shall not be permitted by the Licensee unless the person or persons requiring the same or for whom it is proposed that the same shall be performed or permitted shall guarantee that there shall be paid to the Licensee a price or sum commensurate with the value of and such as shall be usual for such or similar engagement employment or use and that such price or sum shall be credited by the Licensee in the accounts under this Licence or alternatively that the cost of any such other engagement employ ment or use of any of the Licensee's office's, servants, employees or works shall not be charged to the works or performance or conduct of this Licence
- 10 If in the opinion of the Governor in Council the Licenses makes default in the observance of the provisions of the two preceding clauses the powers granted therein shall cease and be null and void and shall not be again exercisable by the Licensee (if at all) until application shall have been made and powers granted in accordance with the provisions incorporated with this Licence
- 11 This Licence shall for the purposes of the Electric Power Ordinance be deemed to have come into force upon the day of , 19 \*
- 12' The Licensee may transfer this Licence to any transferee of the relevant Local Generating Licence specified in the third column of the First Schedule to this Ordinance first approved by the Governor in Council Upon such approval being obtained and upon the transfer being completed and this Licence surrendered the Governor in Council will issue a Licence in the like terms to the approved transferee
