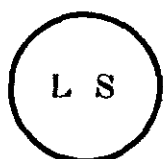

5 The survey fees and fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the title together with stamp duty (which is approximately 2 per cent of the purchase price and the rent) in respect of the grant must be paid within seven days of the demand therefor. Title will be issued as soon as conveniently may be.

(B) General
