### A BILL ENTITLED

# AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE DEPORTATION (ALIENS) ORDINANCE, 1949

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows—

Short title

No 36 of 1949

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Deportation (Aliens) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and constitued as one with the Deportation (Aliens) Ordinance, 1949, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Amendment of section 13 of the principal Ordinance

- Cap 61 of the 1926 Edition of the Laws of Kenya
- 2. Section 13 of the principal Ordinance is amended by 5 adding thereto the following new sub-section—
  - (5) The Governor in Council may exercise the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (1) of this section in respect of a deportation order made under the Deportation Ordinance (now repealed) as if such deportation 10 order were a deportation order or a restriction order made under this Ordinance

### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Deportation Ordinance (Chapter 61 of the 1926 Edition of the Laws of Kenya) was repealed in 1949 but certain deportation orders made under it are still extant. It is accordingly necessary to have power to revoke or vary such orders and this Bill will provide for this

It is not expected that there will be any additional expenditure of public moneys if the provisions of this Bill become law

# A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE PENAL CODE

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Penal Code short title (Amendment, No 2) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the Penal Code, hereinafter referred to Cip 24 as the principal Ordinance
- 5 The principal Ordinance is amended by inserting next Insertion of after section 62 the following new section—

new section 62<sub>A</sub> in the principal Ordinance

- 62A (1) Any person who by the use of physical Compelling force or by threat or intimidation of any kind compels another person to take an oath another person to take an oath or engagement in the nature of an oath purporting to bind the person who takes it to act or not to act in any way is guilty of a felony and liable to imprisonment for seven years
- (2) Any person who is present at and consents to the administering, by physical force or under threat or intimidation of any kind, of any oath or engagement in the nature of an oath, to any person purporting to bind the person who takes it to act or not to act in any way is guilty of a felony and liable to imprisonment for three years
- There shall be substituted for section 63 of the prin- Repeal and 20 cipal Ordinance the following sections—

re placement of section 63 of the principal Ordinance

- 63 It shall not be a defence for a person who takes Compulsion, how any oath or engagement in the nature of an oath fir a defence mentioned in section 61, section 62 or section 62A of this Code to prove that he was compelled to do so unless within five days after the taking of such oath or engagement in the nature of an oath or, if he is prevented by physical force or sickness, within five days after the termination of such physical force or sickness, he reported to the police, or if he is in the actual service of the military forces in the Colony or in the police force either he so reported as aforesaid or he reported to his commanding officer everything he knows concerning the matter, including the person or persons by whom and in whose presence and the place where, and the time when the oath or engagement was administered or taken
- 63A Any person who is present at the administering Persons present of an oath or engagement in the nature of an oath mentioned in section 61 section 62 or section 62A of this administering of Code shall be deemed to have consented to the administering of such oath or engagement unless within five days authorities thereafter, or if he is prevented by physical force or sickness, within five days after the termination of such physical force or sickness, he reports to the police or

Insertion of new section 175A in the principal Ordinance Chain letters 4. There shall be inserted next after section 175 of the principal Ordinance the following new section—

- 175A (1) Any person who sends or causes to be 10 sent any chain letter or who sends or receives any money or money's worth in connexion with any chain letter is guilty of a misdemeanour and is liable to a fine of four thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprison-15 ment
- (2) For the purposes of this section 'chain letter' means any one of a series of similar documents addressed by one person to another person requesting the person to whom it is addressed—
  - (a) to send a similar letter to a specified number of other persons, and
  - (b) to remit to a person or to an address specified in the letter money or money's worth

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

There have recently been a number of cases of the administration of unlawful oaths within the categories of unlawful oath specified in section 62 of the Penal Code There have also been cases where oaths have been administered by force or under threats or intimidation, in which, as the oath administered did not fall within the categories specified in section 61 or 62 of the Penal Code, the accused have either escaped punishment or have had to be dealt with for common assault, the maximum punishment for which is imprisonment for one year

Sub-clause (1) of clause 62A will make it a felony punishable with up to seven years' imprisonment to compel another person by force, threat or intimidation to take an oath, or engagement in the nature of an oath, binding the person who takes it to act, or not to act, in any way Sub-clause (2) of clause 62A will further make it a felony punishable with up to three years' imprisonment to be present at, and to consent to the administration, by force, or under threat or intimidation, of any such oath or engagement

Clause 3 will make consequential amendment to section 63 and will amend the section by reducing from fourteen to five days the period within which a person compelled to take an oath against his will must report to the police. The clause will also insert a new section 63A to provide that a person who is present at the administering of an oath mentioned in sections 61, 62 and 62A shall be deemed to have consented to its administering and so guilty of an offence against one of the sections unless within five days he reports all he knows about the matter to the police or, if he is a soldier on active service to his commanding officer

The opportunity has been taken to insert a new section 175A in the Penal Code to make 'chain letters' illegal. It is reported that sums of money are at present being subscribed to chain letters by large numbers of ignorant persons apparently in the erroneous belief that fantastic profits are certain

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law
