**A BILL ENTITLED**  
**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS AND**  
**EXCISE DUTIES (PROVISIONAL COLLECTION)**  
**ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs and Excise Duties (Provisional Collection) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the Customs and Excise Duties (Provisional Collection) Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Repeal and replacement of section 2 of the principal Ordinance

2. There shall be substituted for section 2 of the principal Ordinance the following—

Power of Governor in Council

2 If the Governor in Council at any time approves of the introduction into the Legislative Council of a Bill whereby, if such Bill were passed into law, a Customs or Excise duty would be imposed on any article, or whereby the Customs or Excise duty previously payable on any article would be varied or whereby no such duty would any longer be payable, the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and notwithstanding the provisions of the Customs Tariff Ordinance or the Excise Duties Ordinance or the Beer Ordinance, issue an order to the Commissioner of Customs to charge, levy and collect on such article the duty that would become payable if such Bill were passed into law in lieu of the duty (if any) payable thereon under the existing law, or to cease to charge, levy and collect any duty on such article which would cease to be payable if such Bill were passed into law

**MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS**

Under section 2 of the Customs and Excise Duties (Provisional Collection) Ordinance (Cap 272), if the Governor in Council approves the introduction into Legislative Council of a Bill amending customs or excise duties he may issue an Order to the Commissioner of Customs to charge, levy and collect on such article the duty set forth in such Bill in lieu of the duty, if any, payable thereon under the existing law

It has been pointed out that the wording of this section is not satisfactory. In many instances a Provisional Collection order is required where the amending Customs Tariff Bill does not provide for any new duty or variation of the duty on any article but provides for duties on articles upon which hitherto no duty was payable. Furthermore the section does not contain express provision for the making of an order where a Bill is introduced into Legislative Council removing a duty on any article. This Bill will accordingly amend section 2 of the Ordinance so as to remedy this defect.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

Paragraph (a) of the proviso to section 54 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for the words "and replaced by by-laws made under the provisions of this Ordinance" the words "by by-laws made under this Ordinance or by an order made by the Member under section 43A of 10 this Ordinance"

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will amend the African District Councils Ordinance, 1950 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance), in certain respects which are considered desirable for the more efficient working of the Ordinance

Clause 2 of the Bill will amend sub-section (2) of section 14 of the principal Ordinance so as to provide that copies of the minutes of Councils shall be furnished to the Member through the Provincial Commissioner. This clause will also amend sub-section (3) of the section to clarify its meaning

As it is considered that a Council should not have power to contribute to the salaries of chiefs, clause 3 of the Bill accordingly deletes paragraph (37) of section 21 of the principal Ordinance

It is considered that Councils ought to have power to impose taxes either generally in relation to the inhabitants of the area under the jurisdiction of the Council or specially in relation to the inhabitants in a particular district. Clause 4 will add a new sub-section to section 30 of the principal Ordinance to provide for this

The proviso to section 54 of the principal Ordinance provides for the continuance in force of resolutions of Local Native Councils made under the Native Authority Ordinance. Some of these resolutions may contain provisions which the Member may consider to be not in the best interests of the inhabitants of the area or district to which they apply. Under the principal Ordinance as it stands the Member can only request the appropriate Council to revoke such a resolution and if the Council refuses to do so there would be no means of securing its revocation. Clause 5 of the Bill will accordingly insert a new section which will enable the Member, if a Council refuses, to revoke any such resolution by order

Clause 6 will make a small consequential amendment to paragraph (a) of the proviso to section 54

It is not expected that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

APPLICATIONS are invited for the post of Assistant Warden of Mines in the Mines and Geological Department, Kenya and should be sent to the Commissioner (Mines and Geology), P.O. Box 339, Nairobi, so as to reach him before 21st December, 1950

The salary is in the scale £550 by £20 to £650 (E B) by £20 to £690 by £25 to £715. The initial salary will be determined with due regard to age, experience and qualifications.

The duties of the post are in general the administration of the law relating to mining routine office work and from time to time visits to mines for claims inspection and similar work.

The post is permanent and pensionable, but a probationary period of two years must be served before admission to the permanent and pensionable establishment.
