A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO LIMIT THE LIABILITY OF HOTEL-KEEPERS IN RESPECT OF THE GOODS OF THEIR GUESTS AND TO GIVE IN ADDITION TO THE PRESENT RIGHT OF LIEN A POWER OF SALE UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES UPON AND IN RESPECT OF GOODS AND CHATTELS DEPOSITED WITH THEM OR UPON THE TENEMENTS AND PREMISES OCCUPIED BY THEM

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- Short title 1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Hotel-keepers Ordinance, 1950
- Interpretation 2 In this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires—
“hotel” means any hotel inn or boarding house the keeper of which is responsible in law for the goods and property of his guests
- Hotel-keeper not to be liable for loss, etc, beyond Sh 2,000 except in certain cases 3 No hotel-keeper shall, after the commencement of this Ordinance be liable to make good to any guest of such hotel-keeper any loss of or injury to goods or property brought to his hotel, other than a horse or other live animal, or any gear appertaining thereto or any carriage or motor vehicle, to a greater amount than the sum of two thousand shillings, except—
(a) where such goods or property have been stolen, lost or injured through the wilful act default or neglect of such hotel-keeper or any servant in his employ, 15
(b) where such goods or property shall have been deposited for safe custody with such hotel-keeper
Provided always, that in the case of such deposit it shall be lawful for such hotel-keeper, if he think fit, to require as a condition of his liability, that such goods or property shall be deposited in a box or other receptacle, fastened and sealed by the person depositing the same 25
- Obligation to receive property of guests for safe custody 4 If any hotel-keeper refuses to receive for safe custody, as before mentioned, any goods or property of his guest, or if any such guest is, through any default of such hotel-keeper unable to deposit such goods or property as aforesaid, such hotel-keeper shall not be entitled to the benefit of this Ordinance in respect of such goods or property 30
- Hotel-keeper may dispose of goods left with him after six weeks 5 The hotel-keeper of any hotel shall, in addition to his ordinary lien, have the right absolutely to sell and dispose by public auction of any goods, chattels, motor vehicles, carriages, horses, wares, or merchandise which may have been deposited with him or left in the hotel he keeps, or in the garage, coach-house, stable, stable-yard, or other premises appurtenant or belonging thereto, where the person depositing 35

or leaving such goods, chattels, motor vehicles, carriages, horses, wares or merchandise shall be or become indebted to the said hotel-keeper either for any board or lodging or for the keep and expenses of any horse or other animal left with
 5 or standing at livery in the stables or fields occupied by such hotel-keeper or for the garaging of any motor vehicle left at such hotel

Provided that—

- 10 (a) no such sale shall be made until after the said goods, chattels, motor vehicles, carriages, horses, wares or merchandise shall have been for the space of six weeks in such charge or custody or in or upon such premises without such debt having been paid or satisfied, and
- 15 (b) the debt for the payment of which a sale is made shall not be any other or greater debt than the debt for which the goods or other articles could have been retained by the hotel-keeper under his lien, and
- 20 (c) that at least one month before any such sale is effected the hotel-keeper shall cause to be inserted in one newspaper printed in the English language and circulating in Nairobi and in one newspaper printed in the English language and circulating in the district where such goods, chattels, motor vehicles,
 25 carriages, horses, wares or merchandise or some of them, shall have been deposited or left, an advertisement containing notice of such intended sale, and giving shortly a description of the goods and chattels intended to be sold, together with the name, if
 30 known, of the owner or person who deposited or left the same

(2) Where any goods, chattels, motor vehicles, carriage, horses, wares or merchandise have been sold pursuant to subsection (1) of this section the hotel-keeper shall, out of the
 35 proceeds of sale, after paying himself the amount of his debt and the costs and expenses of the sale on demand pay to the person depositing or leaving such goods, chattels, motor vehicles, carriages, horses, wares or merchandise any surplus money remaining thereafter

40 **6** Every hotel-keeper shall cause at least one copy of section 3 of this Ordinance, printed in plain type, to be exhibited in a conspicuous part of the hall or entrance to his hotel and he shall be entitled to the benefit of this Ordinance in respect only of such goods or property as are brought to his hotel while such copy is exhibited

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

It is a matter of considerable doubt whether the Innkeepers Liability Act, 1863, and the Innkeepers Act, 1878, which contain provisions relating to the rights and liabilities of innkeepers in relation to the goods of guests at their inns, apply to hotels in the Colony or not.

It is considered undesirable that hotel-keepers and their guests in the Colony should be left in doubt as to their rights and liabilities. This Bill will, accordingly, make statutory provisions similar to those provided in the United Kingdom by the above mentioned Acts of Parliament

Briefly, the effect will be to limit the liability of an hotel-keeper for loss or injury to the goods of his guests brought to his hotel (other than loss or injury caused wilfully or by negligence of the hotel-keeper or his staff) to two thousand shillings. There is the usual clause permitting the hotel-keeper to require, as a condition of his liability, deposit of goods for safe custody with him (*Clause 3*)

Clause 5 will permit an hotel-keeper to sell, after a certain period, the goods of guests seized for unpaid dues

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

**A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE PUBLIC ROADS
ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Roads (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be read and construed as one with the Public Roads Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Cap 229

Repeal and replacement of section 1 of the principal Ordinance

2. There shall be substituted for section 1 of the principal Ordinance the following section— 5

Short title

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Roads and Roads of Access Ordinance

Repeal and replacement of section 2 of the principal Ordinance

3. There shall be substituted for section 2 of the principal Ordinance the following section— 10

Interpretation

2 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—

“board” means a district road board appointed under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 3 of this Ordinance, 15

“Member” means the Member of the Executive Council of the Colony for the time being responsible for Health and Local Government, “owner” or “occupier”, in respect of Crown lands as defined in section 2 of the Crown Lands Ordinance, includes the Commissioner of 20 Lands,

“public road” means—

(a) any road which the public had a right to use immediately preceding the commencement of this Ordinance, 25

(b) all proclaimed or reserved roads and thoroughfares being or existing on any land sold or leased or otherwise held under the East Africa Land Regulations, 1897, the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1902, or the Crown Lands Ordinance at any time prior to the commencement of this Ordinance, 30

(c) all roads and thoroughfares hereafter reserved for public use in any Crown title of whatever description, 35

(d) all roads declared to be public roads under the provisions of this Ordinance,

(e) all bridges, ferries, fords, drifts, culverts, drains and other accessories on any public road as herein defined, or used or enjoyed therewith 40

Cap 155

Amendment of section 3 of the principal Ordinance

4. Section 3 of the principal Ordinance is amended—

(a) by substituting the word “Member” for the word “Governor” wherever it appears therein, and

(b) by substituting the word “order” for the word “proclamation” wherever it appears in sub-section (1)

5. Section 4 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting the word "Member" for the word "Governor" in sub-section (1) thereof Amendment of section 4 of the principal Ordinance
6. Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting the word "Member" for the words "Director of Public Works for transmission to the Chief Secretary" Amendment of section 6 of the principal Ordinance
7. Section 8 of the principal Ordinance is amended— Amendment of section 8 of the principal Ordinance
- (a) by substituting the word "Member" for the word "Governor" wherever it appears therein,
- (b) by re-numbering the existing section as sub-section (1), and
- (c) by adding the following new sub-section—
- (2) An appeal from any order made under the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section shall lie, within thirty days of the making of such order, to the Governor in Council
8. Section 10 of the principal Ordinance is amended— Amendment of section 10 of the principal Ordinance
- (a) by re-numbering the existing section as sub-section (1), and
- (b) by adding the following new sub-section—
- (2) Where a board has received more than one application for leave to construct a road of access, and such board is of opinion that any common question of law or fact will arise upon the consideration or hearing of such applications, it may order that such applications shall be joined, and where there is such order a decision or order may be made against or in favour of such one or more of such applicants as such board may think fit
9. There shall be substituted for section 15 of the principal Ordinance the following section— Repeal and replacement of section 15 of the principal Ordinance
- 15 (1) An appeal shall lie to a subordinate court of the first class by— Appeals
- (a) any person aggrieved by a decision of a board made pursuant to the provisions of the proviso to sub-section (1) of section 10 of this Ordinance,
- (b) any person aggrieved by the making of, or the refusal to make, an order by a board under any of the provisions of this Ordinance
- (2) (a) Such Court shall summon to its assistance two competent assessors but it shall not be bound to conform to the opinions of such assessors
- Provided that where the court does not conform to the opinions of the assessors it shall record its reasons for not conforming thereto
- (b) Every assessor shall be summoned in such manner and shall receive such fees for his attendance as the court may direct
- (3) Every such appeal shall be filed within thirty days of the date of the decision or the making of, or the refusal to make, an order as aforesaid
- (4) In every such appeal—
- (a) against the making of an order, the respondent shall be the party upon whose application such order was made,
- (b) against the refusal to make an order, the respondent shall be any party who has opposed the making of such order

Provided that where no party has opposed the making of such order the respondent shall be the board,

(c) against the decision of a board made pursuant to the provisions of the proviso to sub-section (1) of section 10 of this Ordinance, the respondent shall be the board

(5) Upon the hearing of an appeal the court shall have power—

(a) to make any decision or order which the board had power to make,

(b) to order the board to re-hear the matter,

(c) to take additional evidence or to require such evidence to be taken

(6) (a) The costs of every such appeal shall follow the event unless the court shall, for good reason, otherwise order

(b) The court may, for good reason order that the costs of any appeal shall be borne by the board whether or not the board is the respondent in such appeal

(c) The amount of such costs shall be fixed by the court

(7) Upon any such appeal being filed the minutes and any resolution of the board relating to the decision, order or refusal to make an order appealed against shall be supplied to the appellant free of charge and shall form part of the record of the appeal

Amendment of section 16 of the principal Ordinance

10. Section 16 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting the word "Member" for the words "Governor in Council"

Repeal and replacement of section 18 of the principal Ordinance

11. There shall be substituted for section 18 of the principal Ordinance the following section—

Cognizance of offences

18 No court shall take cognizance of an offence of refusing or wilfully failing to comply with the lawful order of a board except upon the complaint of any person who is damnified by such refusal or failure, or of the chairman of such board or of any person authorized by him for such purpose

Substitution of the words "board" or "boards" in the principal Ordinance

12. Save in sub-section (2) of section 3 of the principal Ordinance there shall be substituted—

(a) for the word "board" and for the words "district road board" and "district board" respectively wherever they appear in the principal Ordinance the word "board", and

(b) for the words "district boards" wherever they appear in the principal Ordinance the word "boards"

Repeal and replacement of Schedules I and II to the principal Ordinance
Section 9

13. There shall be substituted for Schedules I and II to principal Ordinance the following Schedules—

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill is the result of the Report of the Select Committee appointed by the Legislative Council to consider and make recommendations upon the Public Roads (Amendment) Bill which had been considered by the Council during its previous Session. The Report was laid on the table on the 11th of October, 1950, but before its adoption could be moved and before, therefore, the then Bill could become law the Council was prorogued

It is felt that the present short title of the principal Ordinance, the Public Roads Ordinance, does not provide a true guide to its purposes since most of its sections are concerned with private roads of access *Clause 2* of the Bill, therefore, provides for a more suitable title

It is considered that the duties and powers, in the principal Ordinance, of the Governor and the Governor in Council may now be more properly performed and exercised by the Member for Health and Local Government *Clause 3* of the Bill will, therefore, amend section 2 of the principal Ordinance so as to include the necessary definition of Member It also provides for the inclusion of a definition of the word "board" so that that word may be used in the principal Ordinance where any reference is made to a district road board

Clauses 4 and 5 of the Bill will amend the principal Ordinance so that the Member instead of the Governor will have power to appoint district road boards and also, if necessary, to direct them to meet when and where appropriate

Clause 7 will amend section 8 of the principal Ordinance by giving the Member instead of the Governor power to dedicate lines of public travel It will also provide for an appeal to the Governor in Council from any order of the Member made under the powers contained in the section

Clause 8 of the Bill will add to section 10 of the principal Ordinance a sub-section giving a board, where it has received more than one application for leave to construct a road of access, power to join any applications in which any common question of law or fact will, in the board's opinion, arise

Clause 9 will substitute for section 15 of the principal Ordinance a new section which gives a right of appeal not only from the order of a board but from the refusal of a board to make an order and also from any decision of a board made under the proviso to section 10 of the principal Ordinance

It has been represented that it is desirable where appeals concerning roads of access are to be heard, for magistrates to be assisted by persons with some knowledge of road matters and farming requirements The clause, therefore, provides that the magistrates shall be assisted by competent assessors and that while they shall not be bound by the opinions of those assessors, where they do not conform to those opinions, they must record their reasons for not conforming

It is felt that district road boards should not in every case, where there is an appeal from their decision, be the respondents While, in the case of an appeal from a decision made under the provisions of the proviso to section 10 of the Ordinance or where an application was unopposed the board must of necessity be the respondent, the clause provides that where the owner or occupier of the land over which it is proposed the road of access should pass has opposed the application he shall be the respondent and that in the case of an appeal against the making of an order, the respondent shall be the party upon whose application the order was made

The clause also provides that even where a board is not the respondent the court may for good reason order the board to pay the costs of the appeal

The effect of *sub-clause (5)* is to give the magistrate power, *inter alia*, to order the grant of a road of access and to make any other supplementary order which may be necessary as the result of the grant

Clause 10 of the Bill will give the Member power to make rules instead of the Governor in Council

Clause 11 will replace section 18 of the principal Ordinance with a section which enables a court to take cognizance of a failure to comply with the order of a district board not only upon the complaint of the chairman of the board concerned or of some person authorized by him but on the complaint of any person who is damaged by the failure to obey the order This provision will do away with the necessity for a board to become involved in any dispute between a road of access owner and the occupiers of the neighbouring lands

Clause 13 will provide for the substitution of new Schedules for the present Schedules to the principal Ordinance It is considered that these new Schedules are more happily expressed and clearer than the present ones

The employment of assessors to assist magistrates in appeals will involve some slight additional expenditure of public funds Otherwise no additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO APPLY CERTAIN SUMS OF
MONEY FOR THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR END-
ING THE 31st DAY OF DECEMBER, 1951

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the 1951 Appropriation Ordinance, 1950 Short title
2. The public revenues for the year 1951 and other funds of the Colony are hereby charged towards the service of the year ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifty one, with the sum of twelve million, eight hundred and twenty-four thousand five hundred and nineteen pounds in respect of the Colony, and with a further sum of four million, seven hundred and forty-one thousand, Public revenue and other funds charged
16 three hundred and ninety-six pounds in respect of the Development and Reconstruction Fund
3. The moneys granted by this Ordinance shall be applied for the purposes and services specified in the First and Second Schedules hereto Application of moneys granted
- 15 4. The Accountant General of the Colony is hereby authorized and required from time to time upon the warrant or order of the Governor to pay out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony for the several services specified in the First and Second Schedules hereto the said sum of twelve Accountant General's authority for payment

(d) When in occupation of Government quarters 10 per cent of salary is charged as rent if the quarters are furnished, and 7½ per cent of salary if they are unfurnished, when an officer occupies private quarters he may claim an allowance up to the amount by which the rent exceeds 10 per cent of his salary if the quarters are furnished, and up to the amount by which the rent exceeds 7½ per cent of his salary if they are unfurnished.

(e) Free medical treatment by the Government medical service for the officer, his wife and unmarried children under 21.

Qualifications required for the post are a knowledge of accountancy and general office and stores management and routine, experience in dealing with African staff and supervision of motor transport will be an advantage.
