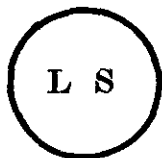

Township Foreman Township Authority Lindi

A VACANCY exists for a Township Foreman, Township Authority, Lindi. The post carries a salary scale of £550 by £20 to £630 per annum.
