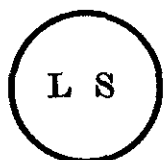

BY HIS EXCELLENCY Sir Philip Euen Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya

TO William James Lockhart-Smith, of Gray's Inn, Barrister-at-Law, and one of His Majesty's Counsel, and to all persons to whom these presents shall come, Greeting!

KNOW YE that by virtue of the power and authority in me vested by sub-section (1) of section 7 of the Eastern African Court of Appeal Order in Council, 1950, and in accordance with instructions by me received from His Majesty, through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and in exercise of every other power hereunto me lawfully enabling, I, Philip Euen Mitchell, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Military Cross, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, do hereby constitute and appoint you the said William James Lockhart-Smith, to be, as from the 1st day of January, 1951, and during His Majesty's pleasure, a Justice of Appeal of the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa, and to have, perform, and exercise all and singular the duties of such office, together with all the rights, powers, immunities, and privileges thereto incident and thereunto appertaining

IMPORTATION OF JUTE GOODS

IT IS hereby notified for general information that as from the 1st January 1951, any importer wishing to import Jute Bags, Hessian Cloth or Jute Twine into the Colony, should submit firm offer for such goods to the East African Jute Controller, P O Box 1091 Nairobi, telegraphic address Jute Controller Nairobi. These offers must state clearly the quantity and description of the goods offered, the price free on rail Mombasa, the month of shipment from Calcutta or other port, and the name and address of the Calcutta shippers.

The attention of importers is drawn to Government Notice No 110 of 30th January 1945, the Defence (Control of Prices) Regulations, 1945, as well as to the maximum margins of profit permitted in respect of such goods by the Price Controller, and importers are warned that they may be required to submit documents in support of the prices quoted by them to the Price Controller upon arrival of the goods in Mombasa.

All offers submitted to the Jute Controller will receive consideration but the Jute Controller may permit or refuse an Import Licence in respect of any goods offered without giving

any specific reason for such acceptance or refusal to the importer. In the cases of accepted offers Import Licences will be granted against submission of the relevant indents to the Jute Controller.

Upon arrival the goods will be disposed of in accordance with Disposal Instructions issued on the importer by the Jute Controller and invoiced out by the importer at rates notified on the Disposal Instructions.

The attention of importers is also directed to the Defence (Sale of Goods) Order, 1945 with special reference to Government Notices No 624 of the 13th July, 1945 and No 703 of the 2nd July 1947.

VACANCY IN GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT

Superintendent Infectious Diseases Hospital, Nairobi

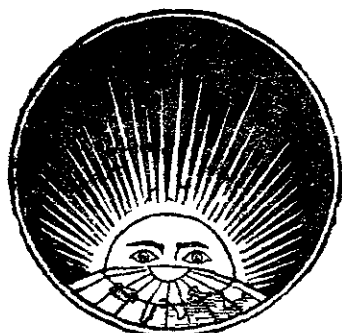
