Farm Manager Kingolwira Prison Farm Prisons Department

A VACANCY exists in the Prisons Department, Tanganyika, for the post of Farm Manager at the Kingolwira Prison Farm. The post, which is non-pensionable, carries a salary scale of £550, £550, £600 by £25 to £725, £775 by £25 to £875 by £30 to £1,025 with a promotion bar at the £875 point, advancement beyond which constitutes promotion and falls to be considered by a Promotions Board. (7) In the consideration of the applications, regard will be had to the relative merits of the proposed plans for construction and the financial sufficiency of the applicant to undertake such construction

(B) General

(1) The term of the grant will be for 33 years from the 1st day of the month following notification to the successful applicant that his application has been accepted and the grant will be issued under the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Chapter 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Chapter 160 of the Revised Edition)

(2) The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned

(3) No building shall be erected on the plot unless and until plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the local authority and by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint. (6) The grantee shall not at any time subdivide the plot or assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of the plot or any part thereof, without the prior written consent of the Governor. In any event no sale, transfer or assignment shall be permitted

(8) The grantee shall be required to pay all rates, taxes, duties, assessments, and charges of whatsoever description which now or at any future date may be charged, assessed, levied, or imposed upon the land by any Government or local authority including any contribution paid by Government in lieu thereof. A condition will be embodied in each grant providing for the necessary adjustment between the grantee and the Government

(9) All outbuildings, offices, etc. shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the local authority or such person as may be appointed for the purpose and shall be kept so screened during the term of the grant

(C) Special

(1) The grantee shall be required to erect upon the plot complete for use within 18 months from the commencement of the term of the grant a modern and up-to-date cinema of approved design constructed of approved permanent and fire-proof materials, on proper foundations in accordance with the development conditions imposed on the acceptance of the application and shall maintain the same including the external paintwork in a good and substantial tenable repair and condition during the continuance of the term of the grant and shall be required to comply with all other structural development conditions within the same period of 18 months

(6) In the event of the grantee being convicted of any offence under any by-law or Ordinance respecting the conduct or management of the cinema, or in respect of any of the matters referred to in Condition No (5) above or in the event of any licence granted in respect of the said cinema being forfeited, suspended or refused renewal, the grant shall be forfeited without prejudice to any antecedent rights of the Crown

(7) The grantee shall arrange for the exhibition of cinema performances to the general public during at least four days out of every week during the continuance of the term of the grant

LINE CONDITIONS

The Southern Province Railway from Mkwaya to Nachingwea will be opened for the carriage of goods and passengers in accordance with the provisions of section 20 (2) of the East African Railways and Harbours Administration Act, 1950 with effect from 1st March 1951. Passenger coaches are not yet available and the carriage of passengers can only be arranged in goods wagons or brake vans as and when circumstances permit at the discretion of the Administration's employees responsible for the booking of passengers. The conditions on which goods and passengers will be carried and the regulations, rates and charges applicable will be as set out herein.

2 LIABILITY

The carriage of goods and passengers will only be undertaken at the convenience of the Construction Department. The Administration shall not be liable for the death of or injury to any passenger or for the loss of or damage to any goods occasioned in the course of such carriage.

3 RATES FOR THE CARRIAGE OF GOODS

The following rates for the transport of goods (excluding livestock, currency notes, coins and goods of exceptional value) will apply—

(a) *All Overseas Food Corporation goods*—1 34 cents per 100 lb per mile

(b) *Other public imported goods*—1 34 cents per 100 lb per mile

(c) *Other public locally produced goods moving internally or for export over the Railway*—1 12 cents per 100 lb per mile

Fractions of a cent in the rate per 100 lb chargeable for the distance the traffic is carried between any two stations will be charged as one cent.

4 MINIMUM CHARGES

(a) *Distance*—The minimum charging distance will be 10 miles.

(b) *Weight*—Charges will be raised on a minimum weight of 20 lb per consignment. If the weight of the consignment exceeds 20 lb fractions of 10 lb up to 4 lb will be ignored and 5 lb to 9 lb treated as 10 lb.

(c) *Full wagon loads*—Consignments which require the full use of a wagon will be charged on actual weight, subject to a minimum charging weight of 22,400 lb per short wagon and 44,800 lb per bogie wagon. The chargeable weight for each wagon load will be assessed separately.

(d) *Charge*—The minimum charge per consignment will be Sh 5.

5 CHARGING DISTANCE

(a) Charges will be raised for the carriage of goods and passengers in accordance with the following distance table—

(b) Ruo, Mahiwa and Chilungula will not be opened for the acceptance and delivery of goods. Passengers may entrain and detrain at these stations and the distances to and from these stations are quoted for the calculation of passenger fares.

(c) Charges for the carriage of passengers or goods from or to mileages between stations (at the discretion of the officer in charge, Construction Line) will be calculated on the distance from the station in the rear of the mileage at which the passengers entrain or the goods are accepted to the station in advance of the mileage at which the passengers detrain or the goods are delivered as the case may be.

6 LOADING AND UNLOADING OF GOODS

The public will be required to load and unload all wagon load consignments of goods except at Mkwaya Port where the work will be undertaken by the Administration's contractors and charged for in accordance with section 7 of this notice. If loaded wagons are not unloaded on arrival at the destination station and released promptly within the free unloading period allowed the Administration may unload the goods and place them in the open. 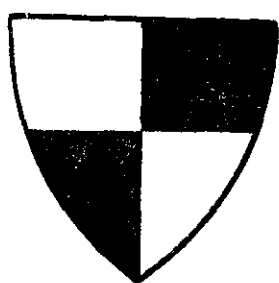

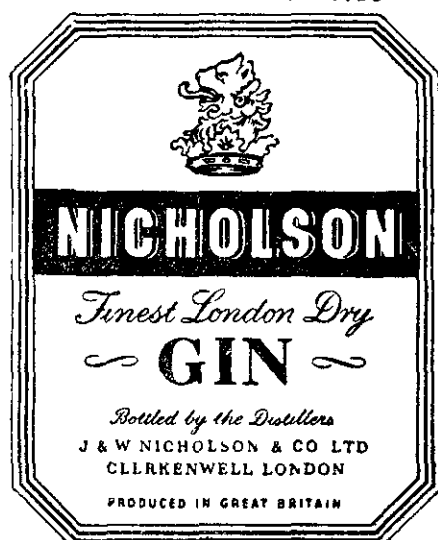

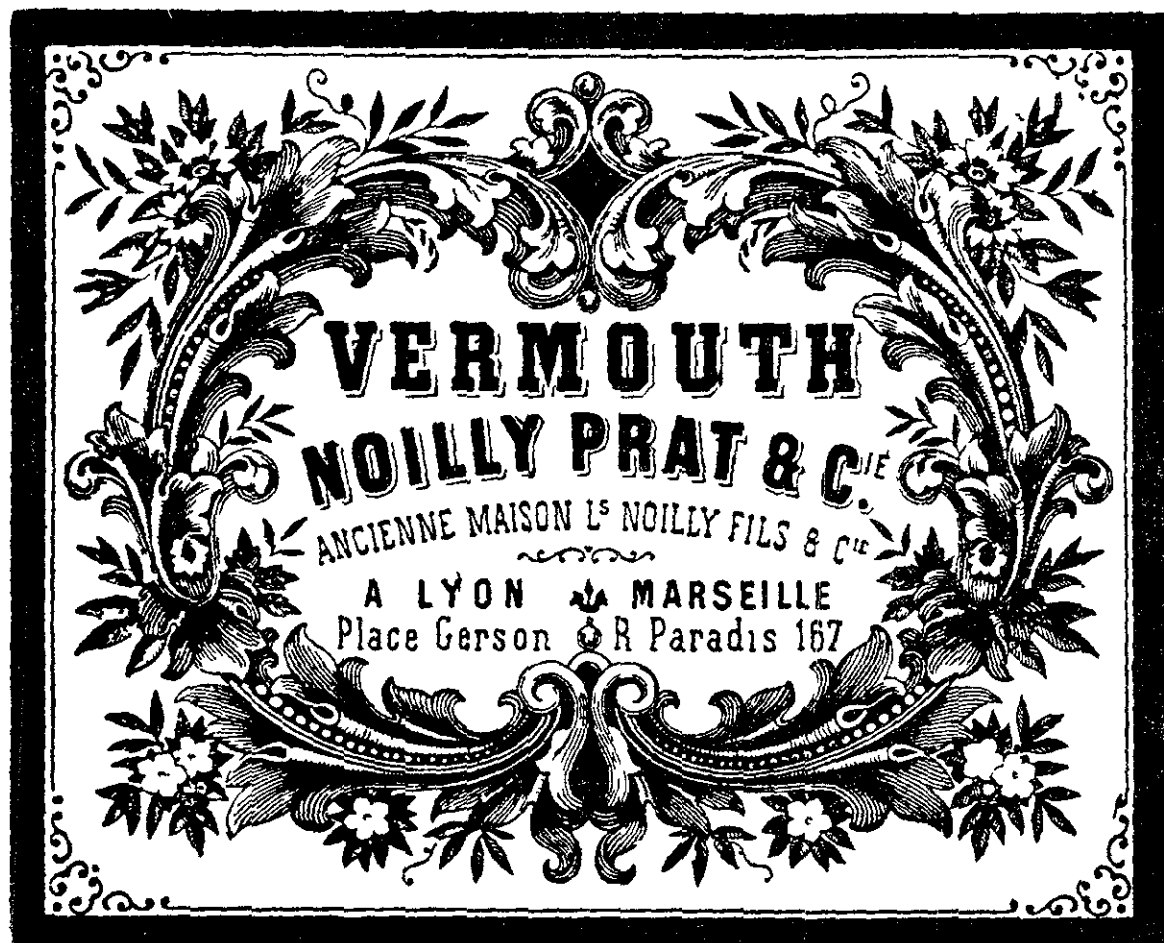
