A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE DEPORTATION (ALIENS) ORDINANCE, 1949

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Deportation (Aliens) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read and construed as one with the Deportation (Aliens) Ordinance, 1949, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

No. 36 of 1949.

Amendment of section 13 of the principal Ordinance.

2. Sub-section (5) of section 13 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for the words "The Governor in Council" the words "The Member".

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will correct a drafting error by substituting for the words "The Governor in Council" in sub-section (5) of section 13 of the Deportation (Aliens) Ordinance, 1949, the words "The Member". This is necessary to make sub-section (5) conform with the rest of the section.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

GOVERNMENT INDIAN HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS, **NAIROBI**

APPLICATIONS are invited from the parents or guardians of pupils of the Government Indian High School, Nairobi, for the Government Indian High School Scholarships to enable such pupils to proceed to university colleges or training institutions outside the Colony or to a Kenya institution approved by the Scholarship Committee. These applications should be made on the prescribed form which may be obtained from the Principal, Government Indian High School, P.O. Box 584, Nairobi, and forwarded to him at the above address not later than 30th April, 1951. No application received after this date will be considered.

For the guidance of intending applicants the important rules are summarized below:-

- (1) Candidates must be of pure Indian descent and be either of British nationality or British protected persons.
- (2) Candidates must have attained the age of 16 years on 30th April, 1951.
- (3) Candidates must have attended the Government Indian High School, Nairobi, for at least two years continuously. Exstudents of this school who, during war, have been engaged in essential services may also apply provided the application is made within 12 months of the date of their demobilization.

Scholarships are tenable for three years only and are granted from year to year, subject to receipt of satisfactory progress reports. It is incumbent on the parents or guardians of scholarship holders to renew their applications every year.

Scholarships would normally be awarded to those candidates who have already secured admission to colleges overseas. Proof of this must be submitted with the applications.

Donations to the Scholarship Fund

If any person or persons pay into the fund a sum of money adequate to endow a scholarship such scholarship may, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, be named after the donor or donors and the interest on capital on such endowment shall be used exclusively in connexion with the scholarship so named and for the purpose desired by the donor or donors.

Smaller sums donated or the interest derived from such smaller sums will be paid into the funds for disbursement in connexion with unendowed scholarships.


