**A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE MARRIAGE
ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya,
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof,
as follows —

Short title
Cap 144

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Marriage (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read and construed as one with the Marriage Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Repeal and replacement of section 19 of the principal Ordinance
Consent to marriage of minors

2. There shall be substituted for section 19 of the principal Ordinance the following section— 5

19 If either party to an intended marriage, not being a widower or widow, is under twenty-one years of age, no licence shall be granted or certificate issued unless there shall be produced, annexed to the affidavit referred to in section 11 of this Ordinance, a written consent to the intended marriage signed by the person having the lawful custody of any such party 10

Repeal and replacement of section 21 of the principal Ordinance
Consent where no parent or guardian capable of consenting

3. There shall be substituted for section 21 of the principal Ordinance the following section— 15

21 If there is no person having the lawful custody of such party residing in the Colony and capable of consenting to the marriage, then upon being satisfied after due inquiry that the marriage is a proper one, any of the following persons may consent in writing to such marriage, that is to say, the Governor, a judge of the Supreme Court, or a Provincial Commissioner, and such consent shall be as effectual as if the person having the lawful custody had consented 20

Amendment of section 26 of the principal Ordinance

4. There shall be substituted for the words "The Governor or" where they occur in section 26 of the principal Ordinance the words "The Registrar General" 25

Repeal and replacement of section 33 of the principal Ordinance
Correction of clerical errors

5. There shall be substituted for section 33 of the principal Ordinance the following section—

33 The Registrar General, or any registrar authorized by the Registrar General, may correct any clerical error in any certificate of marriage filed in his office or in any certified copy thereof upon production to him of the certificate delivered to the parties, and every such correction shall be authenticated by the signature of the Registrar General or registrar, as the case may be, and the date of such correction shall be endorsed thereon 30 35

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill amends the Marriage Ordinance (herein referred to as the principal Ordinance) in a number of respects in which experience has shown that it is defective

Section 19 of the principal Ordinance requires the consent to the marriage of a minor to be given by the father unless he is dead, of unsound mind, or absent from the Colony, when the mother is empowered to consent. If both the father and mother are dead, of unsound mind, or absent from the Colony, consent may be given by the guardian. These provisions therefore, require the consent of the father even when, as often is the case, custody of the child has, by agreement or by order of the court, been given to the mother. Furthermore, although in the circumstances mentioned above the guardian may consent, there is no definition of guardian and doubt exists as to whether a guardian who is the lawful, as distinct from the legal, guardian may consent. *Clause 2* of the Bill accordingly amends section 19 so as to require consent to be given by the person having the lawful custody of the child, whether father, mother or guardian.

Clause 3 amends section 21 of the principal Ordinance to effect an amendment consequential upon the amendment to section 19. The reference to parent or guardian at the beginning of the section and to father or mother at the end thereof being replaced by a reference to the person having the lawful custody of the child. The opportunity has also been taken to replace the reference to a "senior commissioner" with a reference to a "provincial commissioner".

Section 26 of the principal Ordinance requires the Governor to cause to be printed and delivered to registrars books of marriage certificates. It is considered that this duty should be upon the Registrar General rather than the Governor. *Clause 4* accordingly substitutes for the word "Governor" the words "Registrar General".

Section 33 of the principal Ordinance empowers a registrar to correct errors in any marriage certificate filed in his office. It is considered that this power should be conferred also upon the Registrar General and that the power should be extended so as to enable an error in a certified copy of a marriage certificate to be corrected. *Clause 5* provides for this.

Section 40 of the principal Ordinance provides for the fees specified in the Second Schedule to be paid to *registrars* but omits to provide that such fees shall also be paid to the *Registrar General* when the matter in respect of which the fee is payable was performed in his office *Clause 6* accordingly amends the section to provide for this. The opportunity was also taken to provide that such fees should be paid to the Accountant General rather than into the Treasury and to declare that the fees should form part of the general revenues of the Colony.

It was brought to notice that the forms of Notice of Marriage, Registrar's Certificate and Special Licence (being Forms A, C and D of the First Schedule to the principal Ordinance) contained no requirement for the parties to the proposed marriage to indicate on the form their condition, that is to say whether bachelor, spinster or divorced. *Clause 7* accordingly amends Forms A, C and D to provide for this. The opportunity has also been taken to insert in Form A a requirement that the place at which the intended marriage is to be held shall be stated.

Clause 8 amends the Second Schedule so as to provide that for a certified copy of a marriage certificate a fee of five shillings instead of two shillings shall be paid and by requiring the payment of a fee of four shillings for every inspection of the register. These amendments are made in order to bring the fees payable under the principal Ordinance into line with the fees payable under other similar Ordinances.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

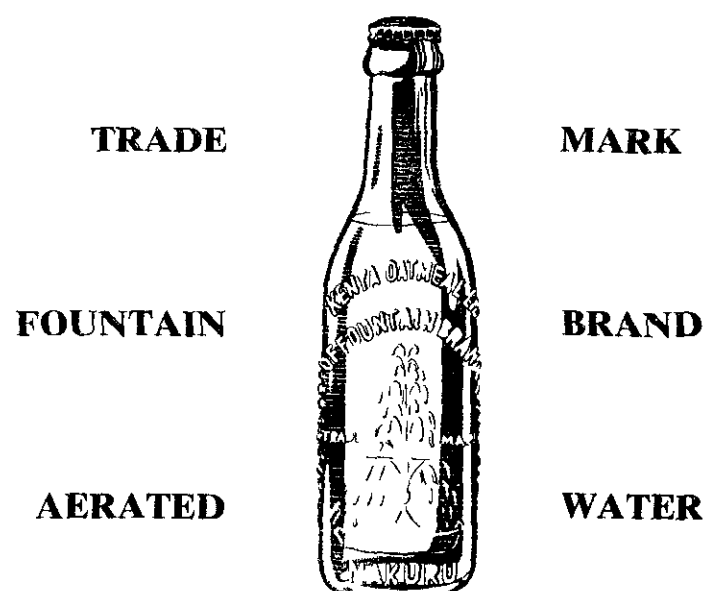

APPLICATIONS are invited for the direct grant of the plots described in the Schedule. This General Notice supersedes General Notice No 2771 date 24th November, 1950. Persons who have previously applied for plots under the previous General Notice need not apply again.

A plan of the plots may be seen at the office of the District Commissioner, Kisumu, and at the Public Map Office of the Survey Department, Nairobi, or may be obtained from the Director of Surveys, Nairobi, on payment of Sh 4 for a plan

of Section LXVII and Sh 3 for each of the plans of Section LXIII, post free.

Applications should be submitted to the Special Commissioner and Acting Commissioner of Lands Nairobi, through the District Commissioner Kisumu stating the plot required in order of preference.

Applications must be sent so as to reach the District Commissioner, Kisumu, not later than noon on Monday, 30th April 1951.

Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.

Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh 1,000 as a deposit which will be dealt with as follows —

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within the period of seven days required by Condition (a) (1) below, the deposit will be credited to him
- (b) If the application is unsuccessful the deposit will be returned to him
- (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of seven days as required by Condition (a) (1) below the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto

(a) GENERAL CONDITIONS

(1) Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within seven days of notification that his application has been approved the assessed stand premium and the roads and drains contribution in respect of the plot, together with the survey fees, the fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh 120) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent on the stand premium and annual rent) In default of payment within the specified time the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot

(2) The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application

(b) SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF GRANT

(1) The grantee shall erect complete for occupation within 15 months of the date of the commencement of the term a building of approved design of proper foundations constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete with roofing of tiles or other permanent materials to be approved by me, and shall maintain the same in good and substantial tenable repair and condition during the continuance of the term

(2) No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been approved by the Local Authority and by the Commissioner of Lands, or such other person as he may appoint Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the Town Clerk, Kisumu, within three months of the date of the commencement of the term

(3) In the event of the grantee failing to comply with any conditions herein contained, any proceedings that may be necessary will forthwith be instituted for the recovery of the land Moneys that may have been paid in respect of the plot will be forfeited to the Crown

(4) No buildings erected on the said land may be occupied until the grantee shall have submitted a block plan with the position of such buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage for disposing of surface and sullage water on the said land and also for disposing of sewage by water-borne carriage to septic tank and soakage pit in each case to the satisfaction of the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands and the grantee shall also satisfy the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands that such systems of drainage have been properly constructed, such satisfaction in both cases to be expressed in writing

(5) The grantee shall duly and suitably connect such drainage system with any town drainage system when in the opinion of the Local Authority the latter system is so far completed as to enable the grantee reasonably so to do

(6) Grants will be made under the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance The term of the grants will be 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of approval of the grant

(7) At no time during the term of the grant shall more than one private dwelling-house with necessary offices and outbuildings be erected on the plot The erection or use of more than one kitchen shall be deemed to be a breach of this condition

(8) The plot shall be used for private residential purposes only and no other purposes whatsoever

(9) The grantee shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any buildings to cover more than one-third of the area of the plot

(10) Any building erected thereon shall conform to a building line decided upon by the Local Authority

(11) The grantee shall not sell or transfer the plot nor enter into any mortgage charge (other than with the consent of the Commissioner of Lands for the raising of a loan for building purposes) or agreement for sale in respect thereof until Special Condition No 1 hereof shall have been fulfilled

(12) Subject to Condition No 11 the grantee shall not at any time during the continuance of the term of the grant subdivide the land, nor assign, sublet or otherwise dispose of any portion

(13) All outbuildings, offices, etc shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the Local Authority or such person as may be appointed for the purpose and shall be kept so screened during the continuance of the grant

(14) The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes

and drains, telegraph and telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments or main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned

(15) The grantee shall pay such rates taxes, charges duties assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the Government in lieu thereof

(16) The acceptance of any plot shall be deemed to be upon and subject to the conditions herein contained and the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and in particular Part VII thereof
