 - (a) The Kimugu River, down-stream from the South-western Mau Foiest Reserve's western boundary till it becomes part of the Jamji Rivei
 - (b) The Dimbili River, down-stream from the South-western Mau Forest Reserve's western boundary till it becomes part of the Jamji River
 - (c) The Saosa River, down-stream from the South-western Mau Forest Reserve's western boundary till it becomes part of the Jamu River




