ATTENTION is drawn to Government Notice No 262 of 13th March, 1946, which appointed the Forest Boundary Commission. The terms of reference of the Forest Boundary Commission are re-published for information as follows—

- “(1) To study in detail on the ground, where required, the boundaries of such existing forest areas as the Member for Agriculture may direct
- (2) To make recommendations, accompanied by full supporting reasons, for the inclusion within any forest area of any land contiguous to it which they deem should properly be included within such forest area, and to indicate the degree of urgency and importance which they attach to the acquisition of such areas outside the existing forest areas
- (3) To take local evidence and to make recommendations as to any excision from such forest areas as they may deem fit with full reasons for such recommendation
