Excavator Operators Public Works Department

APPLICATIONS are invited from suitably qualified persons for appointment to the post of Excavator Operator, Special Temporary Staff, Public Works Department, Uganda

General conditions of service are as follows —

Candidates should have a knowledge of accounts (preferably the Government system of accounting) and a good working knowledge of Swahili.

The officer may be stationed in any of the major stations of the Colony.
