### AIR ADVISORY COUNCIL

(East Africa (High Commission) Order in Council 1st January 1948, Sections 9 and 10 and First and Third Schedules)

THE East Africa High Commission has approved the creation of an Air Advisory Council consisting of —

To consider and advise on all questions of major policy affecting Civil Aviation within the jurisdiction of the East Africa High Commission and on any civil aviation matters referred to it by the East Africa High Commission acting through the Commissioner for Transport

To consider and advise on the Annual Estimates of the Directorate of Civil Aviation before they are submitted to the Central Legislative Assembly and the Estimates Committee of the Central Legislative Assembly

To consider and advise on all Civil Aviation legislation coming within the scope of the Central Legislative Assembly

To advise on the steps necessary to achieve a policy of co-ordination between Civil Aviation and all other forms of transport

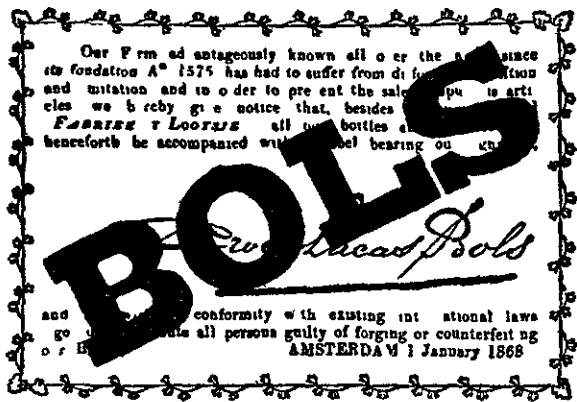

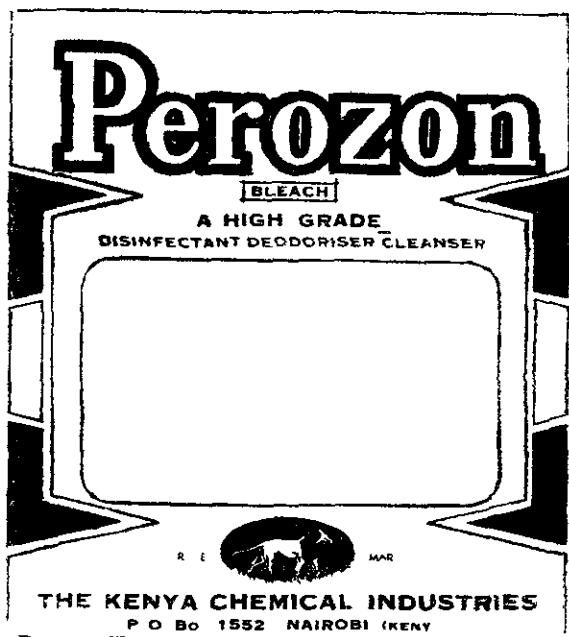

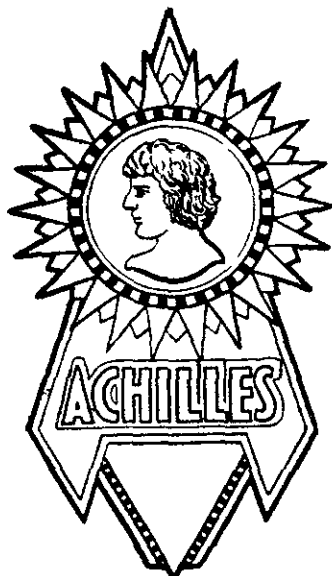
