# A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE KING'S AFRICAN RIFLES ORDINANCE, 1932

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows—

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the King's African Rifles (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read and construed as one with the King's African Rifles Ordinance, 1932, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Amendment of section 91 of the principal Ordinance

- 2. There shall be substituted for sub-section (2) of 5 section 91 of the principal Ordinance the following subsection
  - (2) If any person to whom this Ordinance applies is convicted by a competent civil court of any offence he shall not be hable to be punished for the same under this 10 Ordinance otherwise than by—
    - (a) loss of pay pursuant to the provisions of section 54 of this Ordinance, or
    - (b) with the approval of an officer not below the rank of brigadier—

- (1) by dismissal from the regiment,
- (11) by reduction in lank,
- (iii) by loss of the whole or of any period of previous service reckoning towards discharge,

(iv) by the loss of all or any good conduct badges which he may possess together with the whole or any part of any good conduct pay of which he is in receipt

## MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Sub-section (2) of section 91 of the King's African Rifles Ordinance 1932, is now worded so as to be capable of the construction that the punishments of reduction in rank, dismissal from the regiment, loss of previous service and loss of good conduct badges and pay are applicable only in the case of non-commissioned officers and that the only punishment which a private soldier can suffer is loss of pay under section 54. This was clearly not the intention and this Bill will amend the section to make its meaning unambiguous

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJEC'S AND REASONS

It was discovered after the Factories Ordinance, 1950 had been assented to that there existed in it certain discrepancies occasioned by faulty proof reading the most import of which occurred in subsection (4) of section 56 and resulted 11 the recommendation of the Select Committee that the penalty should be increased from one thousand shillings to ten thousand shillings not being given effect to Clause 2 of the Bill will accordingly remedy this

Clauses 3, 4 and 5 merely correct trifling verbal or punctuation eriors

# THE LAND ACQUISITION ACT, 1894, OF INDIA DECLARATION UNDER SECTION 4
