MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will amend the Rabies Ordinance in two respects namely, to render it applicable to cats as well as dogs, and to increase from two hundred shillings to two thousand shillings the pecuniary penalty for failing to destroy a diseased dog or cat or failing to destroy or keep securely confined any dog or cat suspected of being diseased

It is not expected that there will be any additional expenditure of public moneys if the provisions of this Bill become law

(3) The tax chargeable upon the income of any person in respect of which credit is to be allowed under the arrangements shall be taken to be the amount by which the tax chargeable (before allowance of credit under any arrangements having effect under section 33A of this 35 Ordinance) in respect of his total income is increased by the inclusion of such income in his total income

Provided that where foreign tax is payable at different rates on different parts of such person's income the tax chargeable on that income shall be apportioned to 40 each such part in such amounts as the Commissioner may determine

(4) The credit shall not exceed the amount of the tax chargeable upon the income or each part of the income, as the case may be, computed in accordance with 45 the provisions of this Ordinance

(5) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 7 of this Ordinance, the amount of the income received in Kenya shall, for the purpose of computing the tax chargeable under the provisions of this Ordinance in 50 respect of the total income of any person, be increased by the amount of the foreign tax payable on that income

(6) A dividend or part of a dividend paid by a company resident in the Colony or another East African territory out of income derived from sources within any 55 territory in respect of which arrangements have effect under the provisions of section 33A of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be income from sources in that territory

(7) Where— 60

(a) the arrangements provide, in relation to dividends of some classes, but not in relation to dividends of other classes, that foreign tax not

chargeable directly or by deduction in respect of dividends is to be taken into account in considering whether any, and if so, what, credit is to be given against tax in respect of the dividends, and

(b) a dividend is paid which is not of a class to which the arrangements so apply,

then, if the dividend is paid to a company which controls, directly or indirectly, not less than one-half of the voting power in the company paying the dividend, credit shall be allowed as if the dividend were a dividend of a class in relation to which the arrangements so provide

(8) Credit shall not be allowed under the arrangements against tax chargeable upon the income of any person for any year of assessment if he elects that credit shall not be allowed in the case of his income for that year

(9) Subject to the provisions of sub-section (10) of this section any claim for an allowance by way of credit shall be deemed to be a claim for a deduction under the provisions of Part VI of this Ordinance and shall be made to the Commissioner within six years from the end of the year of assessment to which it relates

(10) When the amount of any credit or exemption is given under the arrangements is rendered excessive or insufficient by reason of any adjustment of the amount of any tax payable either in the Colony or elsewhere, nothing in this Ordinance limiting the time for the making of assessments or claims for relief shall apply to any assessment or claim to which the adjustment gives rise, being an assessment or claim made within six years from the time when all such assessments adjustments and other determinations have been made, whether in the Colony or elsewhere, as are material in determining whether any, and if so what, credit falls to be given

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Discussions have been taking place with His Majesty's Government with a view to entering into arrangements for double income tax relief. As the law stands there is no provision for giving effect to any such arrangement.

This Bill will amend the Income Tax Ordinance to empower the Governor in Council by order to declare that such arrangements have been made and that it is expedient that they shall be given effect. Upon the making of such an order the arrangements will have effect. *Clause 5* of the Bill will insert new sections 33A and 33B to provide for this. The new provisions will enable arrangements for relief from double taxation to be made not only with the United Kingdom but with the Government of any Territory. Sub-section (2) of the proposed section 33A provides that, except in so far as any arrangements made with the Government of the United Kingdom may otherwise provide, the existing provisions of the law (section 32) as to relief in respect of United Kingdom income tax will cease to have effect and sub-section (3) makes similar provision in respect of the provisions relating to Empire income tax (section 33). *Clauses 2, 3, and 5* contain certain consequential amendments.

The first arrangements to be entered into under the provisions of the proposed section 33A will be those with the United Kingdom already referred to and which it is proposed to lay on the table of the Legislative Council at the same time as this Bill is introduced.

It is not expected that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provision of this Bill become law.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Select Committee appointed to consider and report upon a Bill to amend the Miraa Control Ordinance (Cap 204) recommended that the Bill should be withdrawn and the Miraa Control Ordinance should be repealed. The Committee considered that there was no necessity for any statutory control of the use of miraa by members of the Meru and Embu tribes but that it was necessary to prohibit entirely the use of miraa by tribesmen of the Northern Province.

This Bill will accordingly provide for this

In order to ensure that proper control will be exercisable in the Northern Province it has been considered necessary to make the Ordinance applicable not only to the Northern Province but also to certain adjacent areas which are specified in the Schedule through which run the main approaches to the Northern Province.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read and construed as one with the Pensions Ordinance, 1950 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance)

2. Sub-section (1) of section 2 of the principal Ordinance is amended by inserting the following definition after the definition of “‘service of the Government’ or ‘service under the Government’”—

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Ordinance

“African District Council service” means service under any African District Council established under the African District Councils Ordinance, 1950, or under any Local Native Council established under the Native Authority Ordinance,”

3. Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is amended in the following respects —

Amendment of section 6 of the principal Ordinance

(a) by substituting a colon for the semi-colon at the end of paragraph (b) and by adding thereto the following proviso—

Provided that if his service in such other public service is superannuated under the Federated Superannuation System for Universities or a similar insurance scheme, he has retired on one of the grounds mentioned in paragraphs (a), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of this section,

(b) by substituting for the proviso to the section the following—

Provided that—

(a) a gratuity may be granted to a female officer, in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance who resigns on or with a view to marriage or is required to retire on account of her marriage notwithstanding that she is not otherwise eligible under this section for the grant of any pension gratuity or other allowance,

(b) a pension, gratuity or other allowance may be granted in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance to an officer on his retirement on or after the 1st day of January, 1946, from African District Council service to which he has been transferred, notwithstanding that there is no provision in such service for the retirement of such officer on pension or gratuity, if the circumstances in which such officer so retires are circumstances in which, had he remained in the service of the Government he would have been eligible for a pension, gratuity or other allowance, under the provisions of this Ordinance

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will amend the Pensions Ordinance, 1950, in two respects. By *clause 3 (a)* a proviso will be added to paragraph (b) of section 6 of the principal Ordinance to provide that if an officer is transferred to and retires from public service which is superannuated under the Federated Superannuation System for Universities or any similar insurance scheme he will qualify for pension or gratuity in respect of his Kenya service if he retires in circumstances in which he would have been qualified if he retired from the service of the Government of Kenya. As the law is at present, it is possible for an officer retiring from public service which is superannuated to qualify for a pension in respect of his Kenya service even though he retires before the age at which he would become qualified on retirement from this Government. This is so because there is no age limit under the Superannuation System. *Clause 3 (b)* will extend the proviso to the section so as to enable an officer who has transferred from the Government to the service of an African District Council or vice versa to count as qualifying service for a pension from the Government his African District Council service. He will, however, only qualify for pension if his retirement from African District Council is in circumstances in which, had it been retirement from the Government, he would have been qualified.

Consequently on this amendment *clause 2* will insert in section 2 of the Ordinance a definition of "African District Council service"

It is not possible to estimate what additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

STEAM BOILERS—STEAM TUBE OVENS AND STEAM TUBE HOTPLATES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by section 40 of the Factories Ordinance, 1950, I hereby except from the requirements of sub-sections (2) and (8) of section 37 of the said Ordinance, subject to the following conditions, steam tube ovens and steam tube hotplates used for the baking or heating of food—

1 In the case of an oven—

- (i) a thermometer for the purpose of indicating the temperature of the oven shall be fitted in a suitable position where it is easily visible, and shall be properly maintained. An oven having more than one furnace or more than one baking chamber shall be fitted with at least one thermometer as aforesaid in respect of each furnace or of each baking chamber,
- (ii) the ordinary maximum working temperature of the oven shall be marked in a distinctive colour on each thermometer,
- (iii) the oven shall not be worked at a higher temperature than the ordinary maximum working temperature unless a certificate has been obtained from the makers, and is kept available for inspection, certifying that the oven can safely be used at a higher temperature than the ordinary maximum working temperature and specifying the conditions, including the maximum permissible working temperature, subject to which it may be so used, and unless all such conditions are observed

2 In the case of a hotplate—

- (i) a correct steam pressure gauge, easily visible and properly maintained, shall be fitted to at least one of the tubes and shall be provided with an arrangement for recording the highest pressure generated in that tube at any time. The maximum permissible working pressure shall be marked in a distinctive colour on each pressure gauge
- (ii) the hotplate shall not be worked at a higher pressure than the maximum permissible working pressure

3 The brickwork surrounding the tubes in the furnace whether of an oven or hotplate, shall be properly maintained so as to prevent excessive exposure of tubes to the fire or flame

4 Accumulations of dust, soot or other deposit shall be removed by brushing or other effective means from the flues and tubes of each oven or hotplate. In the case of an oven or hotplate fired with solid fuel, such removal shall be carried out at intervals of not longer than three months

5 Every tube fitted to an oven or hotplate after 1st March, 1952, shall, before sealing up, have been properly tested by hydraulic pressure. A certificate of such test, specifying the test pressure applied and signed by the person making or supervising such test, shall be kept attached to the general register. Such a certificate may relate to tests of more than one tube

6 Instructions for working the oven or hotplate supplied by the maker of the oven or hotplate, shall be affixed on a placard prominently displayed near the working place at the oven or hotplate

Provided that where it is not reasonably practicable to obtain such instructions from the actual maker of the oven or hotplate it shall be sufficient to obtain them from a competent person engaged in the business of making steam tube ovens or steam tube hotplates as the case may be

DOUBLE TAXATION RELIEF ARRANGEMENT WITH THE UNITED KINGDOM

THE following draft of an agreement which His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom is prepared to enter into with the Government of Kenya is published for general information —

ARRANGEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT AND THE GOVERNMENT OF KENYA FOR THE AVOIDANCE OF DOUBLE TAXATION AND THE PREVENTION OF FISCAL EVASION WITH RESPECT TO TAXES ON INCOME

1 (1) The taxes which are the subject of this Arrangement are —

(a) In the United Kingdom The income tax (including sur-tax) and the profits tax (hereinafter referred to as "United Kingdom tax")

(b) In Kenya The income tax (including sur-tax) and the personal tax (hereinafter referred to as 'Kenya tax')

(2) This Arrangement shall also apply to any other taxes of a substantially similar character imposed in the United Kingdom or Kenya after this Arrangement has come into force

2 (1) In this Arrangement, unless the context otherwise requires—

(a) the term 'United Kingdom' means Great Britain and Northern Ireland, excluding the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man,

(b) the term "Kenya" means the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya,

(c) the terms one of the territories and "the other territory" mean the United Kingdom or Kenya, as the context requires,

(d) the term "tax" means United Kingdom tax or Kenya tax, as the context requires,

(e) the term "person" includes any body of persons, corporate or not corporate,

(f) the term "Company" includes any body corporate,

(g) the terms "resident of the United Kingdom" and "resident of Kenya" mean respectively any person who is resident in the United Kingdom for the purposes of United Kingdom tax and not resident in Kenya for the purposes of Kenya tax and any person who is resident in Kenya for the purposes of Kenya tax and not resident in the United Kingdom for the purposes of United Kingdom tax, and a company shall be regarded as resident in the United Kingdom if its business is managed and controlled in the United Kingdom and as resident in Kenya if its business is managed and controlled in Kenya,

(h) the terms "resident of one of the territories" and "resident of the other territory" mean a person who is a resident of the United Kingdom or a person who is a resident of Kenya, as the context requires,

(i) the terms 'United Kingdom enterprise' and "Kenya enterprise" mean respectively an industrial or commercial enterprise or undertaking carried on by a resident of the United Kingdom and an industrial or commercial enterprise or undertaking carried on by a resident of Kenya, and the terms "enterprise of one of the territories" and "enterprise of the other territory" mean a United Kingdom enterprise or a Kenya enterprise, as the context requires,

(j) the term "industrial or commercial profits" does not include income in the form of dividends, interest, rents or royalties (other than rents or royalties in respect of cinematograph films), management charges, or remuneration for personal services,

(k) the term "permanent establishment", when used with respect to an enterprise of one of the territories, means a branch, management or other fixed place of business, but does not include an agency unless the agent has, and habitually exercises, a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts on behalf of such enterprise or has a stock of merchandise from which he regularly fills orders on its behalf

An enterprise of one of the territories shall not be deemed to have a permanent establishment in the other territory merely because it carries on business dealings in that other territory through a bona fide broker or general commission agent acting in the ordinary course of his business as such

The fact that an enterprise of one of the territories maintains in the other territory a fixed place of business exclusively for the mere purchase of goods or merchandise shall not of itself constitute that fixed place of business a permanent establishment of the enterprise

The fact that a company which is a resident of one of the territories has a subsidiary company which is a resident of the other territory or which is engaged in trade or business in that other territory (whether through a permanent establishment or otherwise) shall not of itself constitute that subsidiary company a permanent establishment of its parent company

(2) The terms "United Kingdom tax" and "Kenya tax", as used in this Arrangement, do not include any tax payable in the United Kingdom or Kenya which is payable in respect of any default or omission in relation to the taxes which are the subject of this Arrangement or which represents a penalty imposed under the law of the United Kingdom or Kenya relating to those taxes

(3) Where under this Arrangement any income is exempt from tax in one of the territories if (with or without other conditions) it is subject to tax in the other territory, and that income is subject to tax in that other territory by reference to the amount thereof which is remitted to or received in that other territory, the exemption to be allowed under this Arrangement in the first-mentioned territory shall be determined by reference to the amount so remitted or received

(4) In the application of the provisions of this Arrangement by the United Kingdom or Kenya, any term not otherwise defined shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the meaning which it has under the laws of the United Kingdom, or, as the case may be, Kenya, relating to the taxes which are the subject of this Arrangement

(3) (1) The industrial or commercial profits of a United Kingdom enterprise shall not be subject to Kenya tax unless the enterprise is engaged in trade or business in Kenya through a permanent establishment situated therein. If it is so engaged, tax may be imposed on those profits by Kenya, but only on so much of them as is attributable to that permanent establishment. Provided that nothing in this paragraph shall affect any provisions of the law of Kenya regarding the taxation of income from the business of insurance

(2) The industrial or commercial profits of a Kenya enterprise shall not be subject to United Kingdom tax unless the enterprise is engaged in trade or business in the United Kingdom through a permanent establishment situated therein. If it is so engaged, tax may be imposed on those profits by the United Kingdom, but only on so much of them as is attributable to that permanent establishment

(3) Where an enterprise of one of the territories is engaged in trade or business in the other territory through a permanent establishment situated therein, there shall be attributed to that permanent establishment the industrial or commercial profits which it might be expected to derive in that other territory if it were an independent enterprise engaged in the same or similar activities and its dealings with the enterprise of which it is a permanent establishment were dealings at arm's length with that enterprise, and the profits so attributed shall be deemed to be income derived from sources in that other territory

(4) No portion of any profits arising from the sale of goods or merchandise by an enterprise of one of the territories shall be attributed to a permanent establishment situated in the other territory by reason of the mere purchase of the goods or merchandise within that other territory

4 Where—

(a) an enterprise of one of the territories participates directly or indirectly in the management, control or capital of an enterprise of the other territory, or

(b) the same persons participate directly or indirectly in the management, control or capital of an enterprise of one of the territories and an enterprise of the other territory, and

(c) in either case conditions are made or imposed between the two enterprises, in their commercial or financial relations, which differ from those which would be made between independent enterprises,

then any profits which would but for those conditions have accrued to one of the enterprises but by reason of those conditions have not so accrued may be included in the profits of that enterprise and taxed accordingly

5 Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs 3 and 4, profits which a resident of one of the territories derive from operating ships or aircraft shall be exempt from tax in the other territory

6 (1) Any dividend paid by a company resident in the United Kingdom to an individual who—

(a) is a resident of Kenya, and

(b) is subject to Kenya tax in respect thereof, and

(c) is not engaged in trade or business in the United Kingdom through a permanent establishment situated therein,

shall be exempt from United Kingdom sur-tax

(2) Any dividend paid by a company resident in Kenya to an individual who—

(a) is a resident of the United Kingdom and

(b) is subject to United Kingdom tax in respect thereof, and

(c) is not engaged in trade or business in Kenya through a permanent establishment situated therein,

shall be exempt from Kenya sur-tax

(3) Where a company which is a resident of one of the territories derives profits or income from sources within the other territory, the Government of that other territory shall not impose any form of taxation on dividends paid by the company to persons not resident in that other territory, or any tax in the nature of an undistributed profits tax on undistributed profits of the company, by reason of the fact that those divi-

dends or undistributed profits represent, in whole or in part profits or income so derived

7 (1) Any royalty derived from sources within one of the territories by a resident of the other territory who is subject to tax in that other territory in respect thereof and is not engaged in trade or business in the first-mentioned territory through a permanent establishment situated therein, shall be exempt from tax in that first-mentioned territory, but no exemption shall be allowed under this paragraph in respect of so much of any royalty as exceeds an amount which represents a fair and reasonable consideration for the rights for which the royalty is paid

(2) In this paragraph the term "royalty" means any royalty or other amount paid as consideration for the use of or for the privilege of using, any copyright, patent, design, secret process or formula, trade mark, or other like property but does not include a royalty or other amount paid in respect of the operation of a mine or quarry or of other extraction of natural resources

8 (1) Remuneration, including pensions paid by the Government of one of the territories to any individual for services rendered to that Government in the discharge of governmental functions shall be exempt from tax in the other territory if the individual is not ordinarily resident in that other territory or (where the remuneration is not a pension) is ordinarily resident in that other territory solely for the purpose of rendering those services

(2) The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to payments in respect of services rendered in connexion with any trade or business carried on by either of the Governments for purposes of profit

9 (1) An individual who is a resident of the United Kingdom shall be exempt from Kenya tax on profits or remuneration in respect of personal (including professional) services performed within Kenya in any year of assessment if—

- (a) he is present within Kenya for a period or periods not exceeding in the aggregate 183 days during that year and
- (b) the services are performed for or on behalf of a person resident in the United Kingdom, and
- (c) the profits or remuneration are subject to United Kingdom tax

(2) An individual who is a resident of Kenya shall be exempt from United Kingdom tax on profits or remuneration in respect of personal (including professional) services performed within the United Kingdom in any year of assessment if—

- (a) he is present within the United Kingdom for a period or periods not exceeding in the aggregate 183 days during that year, and
- (b) the services are performed for or on behalf of a person resident in Kenya, and
- (c) the profits or remuneration are subject to Kenya tax

(3) The provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to the profits or remuneration of public entertainers such as stage, motion picture or radio artists, musicians and athletes

10 (1) Any pension (other than a pension paid by the Government of Kenya for services rendered to it in the discharge of governmental functions) and any annuity, derived from sources within Kenya by an individual who is a resident of the United Kingdom and subject to United Kingdom tax in respect thereof, shall be exempt from Kenya tax

(2) Any pension (other than a pension paid by a Government of the United Kingdom for services rendered to it in the discharge of governmental functions) and any annuity, derived from sources within the United Kingdom by an individual who is a resident of Kenya and subject to Kenya tax in respect thereof, shall be exempt from United Kingdom tax

(3) The term "annuity" means a stated sum payable periodically at stated times, during life or during a specified or ascertainable period of time, under an obligation to make the payments in consideration of money paid

11 A student or business apprentice from one of the territories who is receiving full-time education or training in the other territory shall be exempt from tax in that other territory on payments made to him by persons in the first-mentioned territory for the purposes of his maintenance, education or training

12 (1) Subject to the provisions of the law of the United Kingdom regarding the allowance as a credit against United Kingdom tax of tax payable in a territory outside the United Kingdom, Kenya tax payable, whether directly or by deduction, in respect of income from sources within Kenya shall be allowed as a credit against any United Kingdom tax payable in respect of that income. In the case of a person who is resident in both the United Kingdom and Kenya, the credit shall extend to the Kenya tax payable in respect of income from sources within the Tanganyika Territory, the Uganda Protectorate and the Zanzibar Protectorate

(2) Subject to the provisions of the law of Kenya regarding the allowance as a credit against Kenya tax of tax payable in a territory outside Kenya, United Kingdom tax payable whether directly or by deduction, in respect of income from sources within the United Kingdom shall be allowed as a credit against any Kenya tax payable in respect of that income. Where such income is an ordinary dividend paid by a company resident in the United Kingdom the credit shall take into account (in addition to any United Kingdom income tax appropriate to the dividend) the United Kingdom profits tax payable by the company

in respect of its profits, and where it is a dividend paid on participating preference shares and representing both a dividend at the fixed rate to which the shares are entitled and an additional participation in profits, the profits tax so payable by the company shall likewise be taken into account in so far as the dividend exceeds that fixed rate

(3) For the purposes of this paragraph profits or remuneration for personal (including professional) services performed in one of the territories shall be deemed to be income from sources within that territory, and the services of an individual whose services are wholly or mainly performed in ships or aircraft operated by a resident of one of the territories shall be deemed to be performed in that territory

(4) Where Kenya tax is payable for a year for which this Arrangement has effect in respect of any income in respect of which United Kingdom income tax is payable for a year prior to the year beginning on the 6th April, 1950, then—

- (a) in the case of a person resident in Kenya, the Kenya tax shall, for the purposes of sub-paragraph (2) of this paragraph, be deemed to be reduced by the amount of any relief allowable in respect thereof under the provisions of section 27 of the United Kingdom Finance Act, 1920, and
- (b) in the case of a person resident in the United Kingdom the provisions of section 32 of the Kenya Income Tax Ordinance, 1940, shall apply for the purposes of the allowance of relief from the Kenya tax

13 (1) The taxation authorities of the United Kingdom and Kenya shall exchange such information (being information available under their respective taxation laws) as is necessary for carrying out the provisions of this Arrangement or for the prevention of fraud or the administration of statutory provisions against legal avoidance in relation to the taxes which are the subject of this Arrangement. Any information so exchanged shall be treated as secret and shall not be disclosed to any persons other than persons (including a court) concerned with the assessment and collection of, or the determination of appeals in relation to, the taxes which are the subject of this Arrangement. No information shall be exchanged which would disclose any trade secret or trade process

(2) As used in this paragraph, the term "taxation authorities" means the Commissioners of Inland Revenue or their authorized representative in the case of the United Kingdom and the Commissioner of Income Tax or his authorized representative in the case of Kenya

14 This Arrangement shall come into force on the date on which the last of all such things shall have been done in the United Kingdom and Kenya as are necessary to give the Arrangement the force of law in the United Kingdom and Kenya respectively, and shall thereupon have effect—

- (a) In the United Kingdom as respects income tax for any year of assessment beginning on or after the 6th April, 1950, as respects sur-tax for any year of assessment beginning on or after the 6th April, 1949, and as respects profits tax in respect of the following profits—
 - (i) profits arising in any chargeable accounting period beginning on or after the 1st April, 1950,
 - (ii) profits attributable to so much of any chargeable accounting period falling partly before and partly after that date as falls after that date,
 - (iii) profits not so arising or attributable by reference to which income tax is, or but for the present Arrangement would be, chargeable for any year of assessment beginning on or after the 6th April 1950
- (b) In Kenya, as respects income tax (including sur-tax) for the year of assessment beginning on the 1st day of January, 1950, and subsequent years, and as respects personal tax for the year beginning on the 1st day of January, 1950, and subsequent years
